THACS Autumn Show on Saturday 15th September

Congratulations to all the exhibitors at the Autumn Show this year. This was the 11th annual Autumn Show and it attracted 72 exhibitors who entered 279 exhibits. Although the number of exhibitors and exhibits was lower than at last year's autumn show, the high standards were upheld and there were enough good exhibits to make a real competition in most categories.

Adult entries in the main hall included an array of lovely flowers and arrangements, an impressive range of fruit and vegetables, knitting, pottery, jewellery and a mouth-watering display of culinary delights. The Parish Room housed a full display of photographs and art work so I hope that you got to see that too.

Entries from children also covered a wide range of skills. Their horticultural class included arrangements of flowers and foliage from their garden and autumn-themed pictures made with seed heads, grasses, berries and leaves whilst their arts and crafts involved painting and model-making. Culinary exhibits included decorated fairy cakes and ginger-bread families but the largest display was of the photographs taken by 9-12 year olds.

Children had also supported the show by making three lovely friezes to decorate the hall so our thanks go to Tewin Cowper School (Caterpillar Class), Tewin Under 5's Pre-School and Tewin Toddler Group for these.

Art & Crafts fair and sale on Saturday 27th October

Back by popular demand! The *THACS* Arts and Crafts Fair & Sale will be held between 10:00 am and 4:00 pm on Saturday 27th October in Tewin Memorial Hall.

There will be over 20 stalls selling locally produced arts and crafts, from painting, photography, ceramics, cakes and traditionally made Teddy Bears and Teddy Hospital to knitted gifts, silver jewellery, quilting, felting and wood turning. There will be demonstrations of jewellery making from Home Beads of Knebworth and spinning by Sarah Brace of Reflections in Felt.

Entry is free and refreshments will be served all day.

Visit to Queen's House, Greenwich on Tuesday 27th November

As previously announced in our July Newsletter, *THACS* has organised a visit to the Queen's House in Greenwich which is home to some of the country's finest artworks, including paintings by Gainsborough, Lely, Hogarth, Reynolds, Hodges and van de Veldes. The house also boasts some magnificent architecture which is also well worth viewing.

In 1616, King James I commissioned the architect Inigo Jones to build a home for his consort Anne of Denmark. Work stopped in 1619 when Anne died and did not restart until 1629 when King Charles 1 gave it to his Queen, Henrietta. Inigo Jones was recalled and work was completed six years later.

The interior was completely restored in the 1980s and the House reopened in 1990. It is fitted out in the style of the 1660s as much as possible, and contains a mixture of original and replica furnishings. There are many carvings, painting, sculptures, and over 200 works of art on display.

Greenwich hosts many other attractions such as the Cutty Sark, the Royal Observatory, the National Maritime Museum and Greenwich Market to name a few. In particular, the near-by National Maritime Museum has two restaurants (Paul's Café and the Sammy Ofer Wing Café) which will be suitable for lunch and entrance to the museum is free.

The coach will leave the bus stop opposite the Rose & Crown at 9:00am sharp, leaving Greenwich for the return journey at 3:30pm.

The prices for this trip are £11 for *THACS* members and £12 for non-members. Entry to the Queen's House is free, so these prices are just for the coach fare covering return travel to the Queen's House.

Although entry to the Queen's House is free, other attractions may have an entry charge. If you wish to visit them, you are welcome to apply for a seat on the coach but you will need to make your own arrangements once you reach the Queen's House.
