THACS Spring Show on Saturday 11th April

Well done to all who took part in the *THACS* Spring Show.

The display in the main hall was lovely. There were impressive flower arrangements, a colourful display of horticulture exhibits, mouth-watering culinary exhibits and beautifully made hand-crafted items, together with thought-provoking poetry and prose. The children's art exhibits were delightful and very colourful: - there were so many that the display was divided between the main hall and the corridor. The children also provided lovely displays to decorate the hall and the overall effect was enhanced by the bunting that had been put up in preparation for an event on the following day.

The Parish Room contained the photographs, paintings and calligraphy. We had received some requests to include more opportunities to enter paintings in the spring shows, and we responded by including three painting categories in the Arts & Crafts class. This change resulted in 26 paintings being exhibited (split fairly evenly between the three painting categories) and they certainly enhanced the show. The number of adult photography exhibits was slightly lower than

last year and unfortunately there were no children's photographs so the whole display was smaller.

Overall, the show was smaller than the spring show last year. There were a total of 121 exhibitors and 293 exhibits, compared with 161 exhibitors and 364 exhibits last time. The number of adult exhibitors and exhibits was very similar to last year, so the reductions in size were mainly due to having fewer children entering. There were 90 children exhibitors and 103 children exhibits, compared with 130 exhibitors and 170 exhibits last time. Even so, that is a good number of children exhibitors and it would be incredible if we got the same number of adults entering!

The adult trophy winners were Mavis Haggar for Flower Arranging, Ray Keppler for Horticulture, Shirley Ashby for Arts & Crafts, Jules Bridgman for Photography, and Shirley Barker for Culinary. Imogen Winters won the Tewin Cowper School Award for the highest number of points in the children's classes for horticulture, arts & crafts and culinary. There were no children's photographs, so the Les Borg Cup for Children's Photography was not awarded. A full list of all the prize-winners is shown below.

countryside, a decadent Jacobean mansion house, an 1880's service wing and a working Victorian stable yard. There is something there for everyone, so come along and join us for a great day out!

The gardens were among the largest and most opulent in Jacobean England. They reflect the work of two of the most famous and influential designers of the 18th century. Lancelot 'Capability' Brown swept away the remnants of a declining formal garden to create extensive views, a serpentine lake and more natural planting. The neoclassical designer Robert Adam designed the elegant garden buildings, such as the bridge over the River Cam.

There is a beautiful restored parterre and the walled kitchen garden is run entirely on organic principles. On the way to the kitchen garden is the Elysian Garden, with its Tea House Bridge, cascade and wonderful London plane tree. The garden is a great place to sit and, if you're lucky, to see the kingfishers. In the Pond Garden the summer bedding has a typically Victorian hot-coloured

theme, with banana plants, cannas, dahlias, zinnias, rudbeckias and the lovely Spanish flag. The climbing and rambling old-fashioned English roses along the walls give a romantic feel to this quiet oasis.

The mansion was once one of the largest and most opulent houses in Jacobean England. Whilst there, you'll be able to discover the history of Audley End, wander the impressive great hall, magnificent state apartments, intimate dressing rooms, libraries and 18th century gothic-style chapel with more detail than ever before.

There is a nursery where you can get a fascinating glimpse into the lives of the eight Braybrooke children who lived there with their governess, nursemaids and tutors.

The 1880's service wing will enable you to experience a world of hierarchy, discipline, long hours and hard labour, through film projections, introductory wall displays and even traditional food from the era. Carefully restored to its former heyday, you can wander through a world 'below stairs' that was never intended to be seen. This insight into earlier times continues in the Victorian stable yard where you can see the resident horses and an interactive exhibition tell the story of the estate at work and play.

There are two cafes. Locally-sourced hot and cold meals, drinks and snacks will be available from the Servants' Hall Tea Room, whilst light refreshments will be available at the Cart Yard Café next to the children's play area.

Disabled access is reasonably good, although there is no disabled access to the first floor of the house and the tearoom is only partially accessible. Mobility scooters and wheelchairs are available free of charge, but must be booked in advance.

English Heritage members get free entry to the property but they must bring their membership cards with them on the day. Other people in our group will benefit from the 15% discount given to groups like ours. The resulting prices are:-

### Photography workshop "The Judge's Eye" on Monday 2<sup>nd</sup> March

On a chilly Monday evening at the beginning of March, eleven hardy souls made their way to the Memorial Hall for a workshop entitled "The Judge's Eye". Our speaker was Bob

Norris, who spent his working life as a professional photographer and lecturer. In retirement he expanded his portfolio and has successfully exhibited his images in competitions all over the world. He has served as judge at all levels, including the photography section of the *THACS* shows.

Bob illustrated his talk with his own prints as well as those of other photographers. He gave advice on mounting prints to present them to best effect and spoke about some of the points a judge will consider, such as composition. He emphasised that fancy equipment and technical excellence is not necessarily required to make a picture interesting and pleasing. He illustrated the latter point with a prize-winning picture of a young ballet dancer taken from overhead by her mother on a phone camera.

We had an insight into the creative processes Bob uses to produce some of his landscape images and this led to animated discussion about editing and manipulating photographs with computer software. No-one present used a darkroom!

After a break Bob reviewed some of the photographs participants had brought with them and gave us the benefit if his expert advice. Let's hope that members will be fired up to enter more of their work in the *THACS* shows!
