A Message from the Rectory

The snow at the beginning of February was a joy to behold from the warmth of my office. For those who had to work outside, negotiate the icy paths to the Post Office and village store or were trapped in their homes, it was another matter. Yet for some it was truly a gift as children and parents bundled up in coats, scarves and gloves headed off to the nearest slope with a sledge, metal tray or large poly bag to make the most of an unexpected day off work or school.

At the same time I was reading, 'A Good Childhood. Searching for values in a competitive age.' The report commissioned by The Children's Society, carried out over three years, is a review of current research and contains contributions from 30,000 children, adults and professionals.

Sadly, the report's author said: "Our evidence showed clearly how stressful life has become for many children in all social classes. We identified a common thread in these problems, which is the excessive individualism of our culture. This needs to be reversed and children to learn that being of use to others is ultimately more satisfying than an endless struggle for status."

The aggressive pursuit of personal success by adults is now the greatest threat to our children. The Archbishop of Canterbury, Dr Rowan Williams, commenting on the Good Childhood Inquiry said, "Our children deserve the best we can give them, and I hope this Report will stir us to action in the wide variety of areas it touches upon. The Report shows something of the energy, the good sense and the vision of so many young people. There is plenty of evidence to suggest that the well-being of children and young people in this country is far from being the priority it should be, and this Report spells out in carefully researched detail some of the ways in which we are failing them. It is a clarion call for us as a society to do better."

2009, the 30th anniversary of the Year of the Child, is a wonderful opportunity for us as individuals, families, organisations, school and church to take up the challenges of the report.

Another job involving clearance came on 7th February when we had an 'ice field' around the War Memorial. Our thanks to Roger for his help in making a pathway through this to the West Door.

The new lighting in the nave and chancel has met with general approval and we have now had the up-lighters in the nave 'serviced'. The electrical circuit has been tested, the breaker changed, and the light fittings adapted with brackets to keep them up at an angle such that the ceiling is floodlit.

We wish a long and happy life together to Massimo Federici and Emily Hope Kearns, married on 10th January at St Stephen's church, St Albans followed by a celebratory Eucharist here at St Peter's.

A warm welcome goes to Grace Rose Kirby, who was baptised at our 9.30am Holy Communion service on 8th February.



MODEL PUBLICATION SCHEME (as required by Freedom of Information Act)

Every public authority that is subject to the obligations in the Freedom of Information Act 2000 (the 2000 Act) is required to adopt and maintain a publication scheme.

A publication scheme is a commitment to routinely and proactively provide information to the public and produce and publish a method by which the specific information will be available so that it can easily be identified and accessed by the public. The scheme is operational from 1st January 2009.

The Parish Council has unanimously agreed to adopt the model publication scheme and agreed to publish the Model Publication Scheme and the Guide to Information on the website

DOG FOULING

The Parish Council has received several complaints about dog-fouling in the Parish and would like to remind dog owners of their obligation to clean up after their pets.

The whole of the East Herts Council's Area is designated for the purpose of the Dogs (Fouling of Land) Act 1996. This means all land that the public have access to is "poop scoop" area. If a dog fouls on designated land it is an offence if the person in charge of the dog fails to pick up the mess.

Land includes pedestrian areas, footways, verges, play areas and highways within a speed limit less than 40 mph. Dogs are banned from childrens fenced play areas. The Parish Council would also emphasize that designated land being "land that the public has access to" also includes village greens, common land and Public Rights of Way (e.g. footpaths and bridleways).

The Parish Council endorses the following advice published on the East Herts Council website. Be a responsible dog owner and carry disposable bags to ensure you can clean up after your dog, keep your dog under control at all times, keep your dog out of dog restricted areas, and do not allow the dog out alone. Use a poop scoop or a suitable bag and dispose of deposits at home in the dustbin or in any Council litter or "doggie" bins. In the interests of hygiene, always please tie the neck of used bags.

Dog fouling is a nuisance and can also be a danger, particularly to young children, as it can lead to serious illnesses such as toxocariasis. Failure to clean up after a dog in your charge will lead to a Fixed Penalty Notice for £50, or prosecution, which may lead to a fine of £1,000 plus costs. It is not an acceptable defence to claim ignorance of the dog's actions or that you did not carry means to dispose of the fouling at the time.



This is my annual report about the Tewin website for the year 2008/9.

The Website group has met five times during the year in January, April, June, August and October to review the website. Throughout the year however we have been at pains to respond to our readers' needs, whether it be in the form of a critique from the Parish Plan volunteers, or from a new business starting in the village requesting inclusion on the Business page, or for additions to the Calendar page, from local organisations.

The website continues to be financed by village organisations – Friends of Tewin, Tewin Society, THACS, the Church and the Memorial Hall. Any business in the village may have an entry free of charge on the Business page.

The Parish Plan critique mainly concerned the Directory pages, which we update from time to time. This is now more easily accessed from the list on the Home page and parts can be printed if required using the "Print" button on each page. The website version is of necessity always going to be more up to date than any printed version of the village Directory, which has in the past been produced by the Tewin Society.

Overall there have been over 7000 hits on the site since January 2008. We continue to be read by people from outside the village, as well as the locals. Only recently I had a request for a book order form for the Tewin History book from a former resident, who now lives in Bedfordshire, and who was amazed to see that updates to some of the pages had taken place only seven days earlier. As you know there are websites of all types that have not been updated since they were designed years ago.

As far as the group is concerned, sadly, of course, we have lost Les Borg this year. Our dear friend Peter Walters has also been able to do less and less than either he or we would have wanted, due to ill health. But when he has been feeling alright he has continued to update the Calendar and Events History pages. He has also added the Parish Plan and related information this year. Many thanks to him for all his efforts.

I must also thank others in the group who work so hard to keep the pages current:

Derek Adams, regularly changes the Home page, adding his own beautiful views of the village at different times of the year. Derek has also reworked the Conservation pages this year and helped others on the group when necessary. A special thank you also for taking over the minutes from me. Alf Fulford, who is producing very artistic pages for THACS with many lovely photos of events. Doreen Lloyd who works with Derek on the Friends of Tewin pages and represents the Parish Council as well. Lynn Farr, updates the Hall pages which are now more user friendly, thanks to Peter and Felix, and are helping to bring in more new business for the Memorial Hall.

Felix Green, our technical expert, has worked so hard this year to make the site more user friendly for those both updating the site and those who access it. She has also looked closely at the statistics for who looks at the site. Very amusingly, the greatest number of hits to the site concern the opening times for our local pubs.

We have been pleased to welcome to the group Helen Pinkney, now the Editor of the Parish News, and Caroline McFarlane, who has always been linked to the website for the Parish Council information, but who now plans to do a page for young people in the village. And finally we hope soon to have another new page for the Under Fives.

An optional guided tour of the gardens is available for our group at an additional cost of £1. The coach will leave Tewin (opposite the Rose and Crown) at 9.00am promptly and leave Wisley at 3.30pm.
