Treasurer's Notes

GIFT AID

- Firstly I would like to say a big thank you to all those who give to St Peter's under the Gift Aid scheme, whether this is by standing order, the weekly envelope scheme, cheque or the yellow Gift Aid envelopes placed in the pews in church. For the most recent year we have received the magnificent sum of £8,800 in tax recovery. Although in future, with the end of transitional relief, the figure may be about £1,000 lower, it is still a valuable addition to our income when so many costs are rising. So whatever you give to St Peter's, if you pay tax, please *GIFT AID* it.
- Don't forget that if you are a higher rate taxpayer you are entitled to extra tax relief on any gifts you make to charities. Anyone requiring information in order to complete their 2010-11 tax return may contact me at graham.spring@tesco.net or on 01707 375499.

GOOD WILL

Secondly, a question: Who said "In this world, nothing can be said to be certain except death and taxes"? The answer is Benjamin Franklin, as long ago as 1789. So what's new in the world?

- Nowadays, the link between death and taxes is Inheritance Tax (IHT), which hits estates with a tax of 40% on everything over the nil rate band.
- Why am I saying this, you might ask? Well the answer is simple. *Gifts to charities in a person's will (ie bequests) reduce the value of the estate for IHT purposes.* So if 40% IHT were likely to be payable on an estate and a gift of, say, £1,000 were made to a charity like St Peter's then the IHT liability would be reduced by £400, making the net cost only £600. Food for thought, perhaps, when making or reviewing a will.

This is a way in which **goodwill** could be reflected in a **good will**, possibly for the eventual benefit of St Peter's.

Despite the fact that a leaflet about the Diamond Jubilee meeting was sent to all Tewin, householders, only 18 people came along to the meeting on 14th March to discuss possible celebrations.

This was very disappointing and followed the trend set by an earlier leaflet drop asking for suggestions, when only 12 replies were received.

This left us with a dilemma – should Tewin ignore this important anniversary completely? The people who did attend the meeting felt that we should celebrate in some way but the lack of interest shown by villagers limits possibilities, especially since only one parent of school-age children turned up. From the suggestions we did receive, a Dance in the Memorial Hall topped the list – people remembered the great time we had at the VE Celebrations Dance but a meeting held at that time was attended by well over 100 people so we knew it would be well supported.

To repeat the exercise we would need to hire a band and be assured that people would buy tickets in order to pay for it since we don't have funds available immediately. It is more likely that instead we will need to decide on an event requiring minimum outlay. However, a small committee has been formed who will discuss what is practicable under the circumstances.

It takes the form of a perpetual plague which has a large disc at the top, engraved with the award title and 24 smaller discs that can be engraved each year with the winner's name and the year of the award. The award will be presented every year at the **THACS** AGM commencing in 2012.

The TSA committee has been created to manage the award and will soon announce the evaluation criteria leading to the selection of the winner by the end of this year.

THACS - TEWIN HORTICULTURAL ARTS & CRAFTS SOCIETY

Wednesday 1st June 2011 - Visit to 'The Cult of Beauty' exhibition at the V&A museum and a guided tour of Leighton House.

THACS is fortunate to have been able to book for this fascinating exhibition which focuses on the then 'new' beauties, Lizzie Siddal, Ellen Terry, Jane Morris and others, who were the muses and inspiration for the Aesthetic Movement in the 19th century. This was groups of artists, designers and architects who believed in 'art for art's sake', such as the Pre-Raphaelite bohemians Rossetti, Burne-Jones and William Morris and later Whistler, Oscar Wilde and Aubrey Beardsley. Sumptuous decorative designs feature in the exhibition by Walter Crane, Morris, Beardsley and E.W. Goodwin, and paintings by Frederick Lord Leighton, who led the group.

To compliment the exhibition, we have booked an optional guided tour of Lord Leighton's house (Leighton House Museum) which, among other delights, has an astonishing Arabic-style tiled hallway. The museum has recently undergone restoration to something near its original glory, with a twinkling fountain in an interior pool, and dark, lustrous interiors. We will be able to see Leighton's studio and imagine those great artists gathered together. Queen Victoria visited in 1869 and purchased 'Cimabue', Leighton's first painting to be exhibited at the Royal Academy, for 600 guineas.

Costs for the trip range from £15 to £32, full details can be found on the booking form, together with the logistics. However, please note that:-

- · Leighton House Museum regrets that at present there is no wheelchair access.

Lower Green

The Parish Council is very grateful to the parishioner that arranged for the southernmost point of Lower Green to be turfed, it has made a vast improvement to the look of the Lower Green.

Highways

Memorial Hall/Scout Hut Sign:

This has now been installed on Lower Green.

Access Road repairs to Godfries Close Sub Station: Hertfordshire Highways have resurfaced their piece of land and Cllr K St Pier is due to meet Riversmead representatives to discuss their responsibilities.

Hertfordshire Highways – The Parish Council agreed to arrange a joint meeting about repairs to the roads throughout the Parish.

'Segway Adventures'

This company provides corporate events in fields west of Orchard Road. The toilet block built in the woods has been reported to Welwyn Hatfield Planning Enforcement and the necessary planning permission requested. The land can be used for 28 days of the year for this, however any more than that requires permission for change of use.

Elections

There are 8 nominations for 8 vacancies on the Parish Council so no actual ballot will be held on May 5th

Common Ragwort (Senecio Jacobaea)

This is a common weed found throughout the British Isles and is very toxic to horses and other livestock. It can have potentially fatal consequences if ingested either in its green or dried state.

Under the Weeds Act 1959 the Secretary of State may serve an enforcement notice on the occupier of land on which injurious weeds are growing, requiring the occupier to take action to prevent their spreading. The Act specifies five injurious weeds: Common Ragwort, Spear Thistle, Creeping Field Thistle, Broad Leaved Dock & Curled Dock.

By promoting good practice and neighbourliness it is hoped this weed can be controlled. If you find it in your garden please use rubber gloves to remove the plant and place it either in the black bin or burn thus prevent livestock eating it. Fragments of root will remain in the ground so any new growth and root has to be monitored and removed every year.
