

## Vicar's letter

When I was 17 our Rector in Welwyn, Terence Wenham, was dying from a brain tumour. He was the loveliest of men. As a youth group we spent a weekend away thinking about death and resurrection and read the book 'Hope for the Flowers', a story about caterpillars searching for the meaning of life and ending with their mystical transformation into butterflies.
On our return Terence invited us to his house. We arrived to find someone had given him a caterpillar house where they had cocooned. The day we visited, these caterpillars had broken out of their chrysalises so, with Terence, we went into the garden to set these brand new butterflies free.
I will never forget the shock as Terence, a man who had once been large and strong, stumbled clumsily with his now weakened frame and collapsed into the stinging nettles. He, being him, laughed and we pulled him up, but I was dreadfully upset to see him like this. We opened the box - the butterflies took flight.
More recently my darling next-door-neighbour, Sue, told me she was dying. Sue had been a practising Catholic all her life and had a very down-to-earth, no-nonsense spirituality.
Shortly after she was diagnosed, I found her sitting in her front garden with a cup of tea. Joining her on her seat, she reflected how peaceful she felt knowing that her life was drawing to a close. "It's quite exciting" she said "to think I'm finally going to know what it's all about".
One winter afternoon she organised us as neighbours into planting crocus bulbs along our road and although rather frail at this point, she was with us, insisting she did the same.

I wrote to Sue in the hospice to let her know the crocuses were poking their heads through. They are, I wrote, such a wonderful sign of hope and new life. I promised to send her a photograph when they blossomed. The day they finally opened in a blaze of yellow, bursting through the darkness of endless winter months, was the day she died. I'm sure it's significant. The frailty of human life. The strength of spirit. The hope of resurrection. Butterflies and crocuses.
There is something in nature which speaks of the mystery of Easter in a way words often can't express. There are services at both Datchworth and Tewin at 9:30am on Easter Sunday. However, for a really special experience, do join us at 6am Easter morning on the hillside in Bury Lane, Datchworth, as we watch the dawn drive away darkness and the first Easter fire is lit. Maybe, in watching the sun rise, nature will point us again to the Son who has risen.
I wish you all a most holy and blessed Easter.

Queen Victoria Memorial Hospital's new reception area is stunning. The original foreboding complex of corridors and cramped offices has gone. Visitors now have an open plan, brightly decorated area, with a dedicated space for patients and their families to use when waiting, or when needing a little privacy. All 'front of house' work has been funded by the Friends.

In the hospital, alterations have been extensive. The refurbishment has opened up new space for two single en-suite rooms, assisted showers and toilet facilities, drugs treatment room, sluice room and dedicated visitors' toilets. Also, existing patient bays have been redecorated, all giving a much improved environment for patients and staff.

QVM has played an important community role since the original hospital was built in 1902. The present building dates back to 1934 and was opened by HRH Queen Elizabeth the Queen Mother [then Duchess of York], whose family lived in St Paul's Walden. The new reception retains the signed portrait of the Queen Mother presented in 1982.

QVM Hospital is a valuable resource providing vital rehabilitation care to patients. The Friends are delighted to be able to support their work.

The Parish Council has received many comments from parishioners who are concerned about the state of Lower Green and the increased parking around the Green. Parking around Lower Green is always going to be a problem, but even more so at the current time, when there are an :unusually large number of heavy vehicles passing through the village.

## Please

- leave adequate clearance around private driveways
- do not park on the grass
- do not park at the bus stops
try to leave as much clearance as possible at points where it is obvious that lorries are damaging the Green
One specific recent incident has left the verge very soft, making it very difficult to restore it and !protect it from further damage as lorries, dustcarts etc squeeze past parked cars.
The Parish Council would appreciate your co-operation and support.


## Sevenacres Development

Taylor Wimpey required an urgent decision on the name for the road on the new development in order to get utilities connected to the plots and register the site with NHBC. "Seven Acres Lane" was suggested but the Parish Council has responded with "Sevenacres", all one word, and with no "Lane" as this tallies with the historic name of the site and also other roads in the village being called after the fields they were sited on, such as Grass Warren and Cannons Meadow.
