As the police officer took my details and wrote me a ticket, I stood on that street conscious of the dog collar around my neck. Looking around at the numerous windows of the flats that overlooked us I wondered whose lucky day it would be to capture the moment on camera and send it to the Comet.

Next time I will pay more attention to the signs.

Lands End to John O'Groats via Tewin!!!



Bike Ride in aid of the British Heart Foundation & Cancer Research

Between 24th May and 16th June 2012 a team of cyclists from Tewin will be labouring by biking the 1,200 miles from Lands End to John O'Groats via Tewin - a route, you would think only for masochists, as most LEJOG aspirants travel more directly up the west side of England and Scotland. The cyclists are **Malcolm Allen**, **David Room**, **Andrew Swift** and **Jeff Tipper** with **Mike Horsman** riding from Tewin to John O'Groats.

Mike did LEJOG more conventionally in 2003 and swore a mighty oath that he'd never do the exhausting Devon and Cornwall section ever again, happy to let the others suffer in the West Country! Mike's three sons, Graham, Ian and William are joining the middle section from Tewin, where their parents live, to Edinburgh, where their Uncle Graham lived and died from cancer in 2010.

Mention of the older Graham Horsman brings me to the reason why the ride is being undertaken. The lives of all the riders have been affected by the two great causes of premature death (aged under 75) in this country; cardiovascular disease (including heart disease) and cancer. Between them these two scourges kill 65% of those whose lives are cut short. Jeff Tipper's brother, Paul, died from cancer in 2009, at 58 and Graham Horsman at 59. Andrew Swift had prostate cancer in 2006, his brother a year later and Malcolm Allen, prostate cancer in 2010. Cardiovascular disease, just as deadly, causes around a third of all deaths in Britain. David Room's wife and sister, both in their 50's, had heart procedures in 2009 and his mother, cancer surgery in 2011 and Mike Horsman a heart attack and angioplasty in 2010. Advances in medical science have, however, given those stricken a better chance. All had first class treatment, guided by the results of decades of research. By far the likeliest reasons why you readers, or those dear to you, may not reach a full term of life remain cardiovascular disease and cancer. If you are unlucky enough to be stricken, as some of you will be, the quality of treatment, and the progress arising from research, will be what gives you a better chance.

The riders hope to raise £10,000 for the two charities and ask you to give generously. The riders are paying all their own costs so all money donated goes to the charities. Donations can be made in Tewin Stores, Tebbutt's and other local locations, on the website www.justqiving.com/teams/tewintoedinburgh; and you can follow their progress.

If you pay UK Tax please remember to tick the *gift aid* box which increases your donation at no further expense to yourself.

Danesbury Neurological Centre, School Lane, Welwyn, Herts AL6 9SB

At Danesbury Neurological Centre the rise in patients attending the various therapy clinics has put an increasing strain on treatment space. The Management team reviewed this and devised a scheme creating two new treatment rooms and relocating the management office. In the absence of NHS funding the Friends have agreed to provide £12,000 to pay for the work. The new layout will significantly benefit both patients and medical team.

Early in April the Friends provided a purpose built vegetable planter for the Danesbury gardening group. The raised unit enables wheelchair patients to sow and tend plants. We have high hopes for an abundant crop and hope that there will be some rain!
