Vicar's letter

Remembering

If walls could talk what extraordinary memories the walls of our church might speak of. day in day out for centuries. Ordinary people of our parish have entered its doors bringing with them their hopes and anxieties, thanksgivings and longings. In times of celebration and sorrow - at key moments of life - our church building has provided space, solidity and solace.

Communities change, new generations appear but our church stands as a witness to the presence of people before us: the memorials to their lives and aspirations, and the building to their generosity, commitment and faith.

Sometimes in church, when we pray the Lord's Prayer, I muse at how the walls must be soaked in this verse - having absorbed the same words, the same hopes, the same longings - words which connect us not just to God but also to one another. In a world where little stands still, walk into our church and the stillness, dependency and peace is almost palpable.

November is a month for remembering. All Souls, All Saints and Remembrance Sunday encourage us to remember the lives of those who have gone before us.

For many, St Peter's Church - which has known each generation and which is strong enough to hold both grief and hope together - is, for many, the place to come and remember them.

It may be you wish to use one of the specific days of remembrance to spend time this month to come and reflect upon those who have since died.

It may be, however, that you just need reminding that the church is open in daylight hours, allowing space for when you need it, to come and sit and feel its peace.

Churchwardens' Notes

Thanks go to those who took part in the annual sponsored bike ride in aid of the Beds & Herts Historic Churches Trust – Andrew, Mark, Nicky, Hector and David. The sum of £640 was raised, half of which will go towards maintaining the fabric of St Peter's, Tewin. Thanks also go to the check-in people and the cake makers who helped to make the day run smoothly.

As last month ended, a memorial service was held at St Peter's in thanks for the life of Marian Meads, a long-time member of our congregation. An opportunity for further commemoration of departed loved-ones will be our All Souls service at 6.30 pm on 4th November. There is a list at the back of the church if you would like to add a name to be read out at that service of choral evensong.

After nearly 50 years, we are planning a fresh look for the monthly news about our parish. The present intention is that from January next year the Parish News will be replaced by the 'Tewin Magazine' in A5 format. In cooperation with the Parish Council, this will include fuller coverage of the Council proceedings and information on matters of interest in the village, such as planning and services issues. It will also carry the Council Annual Report.

There will be space to cover local activities, clubs, and businesses established in the village. Hopefully the price will remain the same as the current Parish News, which is £6 per year for 12 copies when paid as an annual subscription. It would be good if every household in the village subscribed to this new 'Tewin Magazine'. However, for those who do not wish to subscribe, an abridged edition containing only formal reports from the Parish Council will be delivered to them on an intermittent basis as published during the year. We hope that you will continue to subscribe to the magazine and will encourage others to do likewise.

As mentioned in our 'Notes' for September, our search continues for a solution to our need for space at the church for the use of children during service times and for other social purposes. To this end, we had a further meeting with the Diocesan Advisory Committee on 17th October. Both internal and external solutions were discussed against their experience with over 400 churches in the St Albans diocese. We look forward to receiving their report. Meanwhile we have canvassed opinion from some of the regular members of the church and will be considering the best way forward.

As you will see from details elsewhere in this 'News', our Christmas Market will be on 24th November between 12 noon and 3pm. We look forward to seeing you there. A little further ahead, the St Peter's Carol Service is scheduled for 6.30pm on 16 December; and a Children's Activity Morning in the church on 22nd December.

Dave wrote a short note to everyone at St Peter's. He and Rine's work seems to be going well and the housing projects with which he is involved in a very poor part of New Delhi, are progressing. Rine continues her work with the Burmese refugees but struggles with the limited resources.

The family were in England in late May and early June. Dave's parents helped to fund their flight to the UK as they were missing their grandchildren. They all enjoyed time spent with family and friends and our wet, cool summer was a welcome relief from the heat of New Delhi. The children enjoyed wearing their raincoats [a great novelty] and being free to play outside - not possible where they live in New Delhi. They all returned to India well, happy and refreshed.



Members receive a regular newsletter and also benefit from substantial discounts on THACS outings and events, and discounted entry fees for the Spring and Autumn shows.

In addition, THACS is affiliated to the Royal Horticultural Society (RHS) and consequently we can now bring our members their exclusive RHS membership offer for affiliated societies. FRIENDS OF DANESBURY & QUEEN VICTORIA MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

Over the last year or so transport has presented a growing problem for the Danesbury team. Patients, including Out Patients, often need taking off-site for treatment or home assessment and it has become increasingly difficult to organise appropriate transport. The ambulance service is severely strained and has great difficulty in organising non-urgent journeys, meaning long waits and missed appointments.

Other transport services are pressured with high demands and insufficient resources. The solution is the purchase of a specialist vehicle which the Friends have agreed to fund at a cost of around £20,000. Garaged at Danesbury, the vehicle will make a tremendous difference to both patients and staff.

Earlier this autumn a local *Zumba* group led by Ellena Brooks, held a raffle at their class which meets weekly at Welwyn Civic Centre. The members decided to donate the proceeds to the Friends. Our Treasurer was persuaded to join the class to accept the cheque! Now that's real dedication to our cause!
