

## POTHOLES

If you are aware of any potholes in the roads or defects in the pavements please report them to Herts Highways:-

**1. Ring the Highways fault line 0300 123 40 47** and provide details of where the defect is and its size. The road name and a house number are helpful in order to find the exact location. **OR** 

**2.** Go online to www.hertsdirect.org and click on "Highways Fault Reporting" on the right hand side of the screen and follow the instructions. You can search for the location by address and will be asked to mark the exact location of the pothole on a map.

In both cases you will receive a reference number which can be used to track the pothole repairs.

Works are due to start mid to end of January 2014 and all nearby residents will be notified. There will be a Site Manager on site from 7.30am until approx. 5.30pm Monday to Friday and they will make every effort to keep disruption to a minimum. # Team Vicar's Letter

A Victor Meldrew-esque yell from the living room made my daughter come running. "I don't belieeeeeve it!" I shouted, "they're at it already." Daughter looked at the television and raised her eyebrows. "Oh that" she said.

My family are well used to my pet hates when it comes to advertisements; online bingo, payday loans, and this - adverts for Easter eggs in January (or Christmas puddings in September). We still have mince pies in the cupboard, goodness I still have Christmas cards I haven't yet delivered (do I save them now for next year?), I don't really want to be forced into thinking about stocking up on Easter chocolate.

Truth be told I do have to think about Easter after Christmas has finished because, unsurprisingly, in the church there is much to plan. In life it is impossible not to look ahead, at least a bit, but I just wonder if we are permanently encouraged to look forward, to look for the next event, the next big thing that we might just miss the moment that is.

There is a practice in Christian tradition that encourages mindful awareness of God and of the present moment. It is a tradition that stems from desert fathers noticing God in the wilds of their habitation. It encourages a slowing down, a way of stopping and seeing the present as a holy place; full of God and full of his grace.

There is one exercise (the type that doesn't ask for lycra) given to us by St. Ignatius, which asks us to review the day. To sit quietly at the end of it and look back on what has been. To notice God in the good, in the moments of joy and love. To notice the difficult times and then to notice God's presence within that as well. To ask the Holy Spirit to show us what we have failed to notice. And when I do it, it surprises me how much beauty is revealed in a day I have often rushed through keen to get onto the next. Try it.

Today is the gift. Now is holy. This moment is where God is.

# **St Peter's News**

Epiphany on the 6 January brought the Christmas celebrations to a close and gave us a chance to think about the seasons to come. Although Lent is some way off (it begins in early March this year), it is worth mentioning the Lent Groups. As last year, they will be held weekly throughout Lent and will deal with the subject of the Passion as portrayed in art. The five meetings will deal in turn with five art forms: literature, visual art, dance, film and poetry. Details will be announced soon.

February is sometimes referred to as "the wet month" or "February fill dyke" so it is with some trepidation that we embark on this month bearing in mind the gales and the torrents of the last two or three! Let us hope that this year it is not true to type. I did see some of our beautiful snowdrops in flower in the churchyard which may be a little ray of hope and perhaps the herald of a sunny spring to come. Perhaps we should wait and see what happens at Candlemas which is on February 2nd. The old rhyme goes:

> If Candlemas Day be fair and bright Winter will have another fight If Candlemas Day brings cloud and rain Winter will not come again

However, the wet is still very much the order of the day and your churchwarden has warned us of the very soft verges either side of the driveway. The message is to park your car with great care if you do not want to get stuck! The coned-off area where matting has been incorporated in the turf is still "out of bounds" until the grass has matured and strengthened and in a fit state to be used for parking again. It would be nice if we could treat the whole drive in the same way and so avoid cars sinking into the mud but the cost would be considerable.

This may be a good time to mention that we need nominations for the post of churchwarden. These can be presented at the annual meeting of the church on the 24th March. At the moment, Pete is our only churchwarden and we are indebted to her for her considerable work in managing the running of St Peter's. It is customary for the church to have two wardens and so we need to address this. Keep dry! NW


