
Music in St Mary's Church, Welwyn

Tewin Parish Council are pleased to report the draft plan proposes that Tewin will be a Group 2 village (previously a Category1 village) which are only allowed infilling up to five houses per site. Group 2 villages will have a village boundary whereas Category 2 villages did not.



Noel Griffin, branch director, explains some of the other work the branch does: "Recently we were the first group of Samaritans in the region to deliver a programme about emotional wellbeing to hundreds of primary school children in the Stevenage area. We also have volunteers out talking to people in Hertford's Parliament Square on Friday nights. I am hugely proud of the branch and its volunteers."

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Team Vicar's Letter

Despite her peculiarities I always had some sympathy with Alice, particularly her musings before she disappeared into the rabbit hole; "…once or twice she had peeped into the book her sister was reading, but it had no pictures or conversations in it, 'and what is the use of a book,' thought Alice, 'without pictures or conversations?""

It is possible to be very clever about God, and I'm glad some people are, but intellect only gets us so far. More often than not Jesus, when he was speaking about God, gave images and stories to those who would listen and pictures which were often open ended and which left space for pondering; stories which, rather than providing neat answers, threw back at the audience different questions to challenge their assumptions.

This year, during Lent, small groups of people will meet weekly across the villages in our Team and ponder the story of Easter by looking at story, art and film. It will be a different way of engaging with the narrative of Jesus' own life and help us reflect on how it interweaves with our own. Details are in the magazine. You would be most welcome.

Datchworth also has many community groups across the village getting together this year to make their own pictures to reflect something of the Easter story, which will appear inside the church in our Story Tent during Lent. Do pop into church some time and see what has been produced – or better still produce your own picture and add it to the display.

At the moment, as I put together the material for the Lent groups' session on art, I have spent quite a bit of time with Stanley Spencer's pictures of Jesus. Spencer, you may know, paints a series of pictures where Christ is seen in ordinary scenes of life in Spencer's hometown of Cookham in Kent. Christ carrying his cross up Cookham High Street, the last supper being hosted in Cookham malt house, preaching at Cookham regatta. Most famously of all perhaps is the image of the resurrection taking place in Cookham cemetery.

So use your imagination: where would you picture Christ in our community today? Would you listen as he told his stories to gatherings of people in the Rose and Crown or Plough? Would he eat his Last Supper in church, in the Horns or Plume, or in your home? Would you look as he carries his cross across the village Green? And what would the resurrection look like in Tewin or Datchworth? Can you picture the joy?

Take some time out this Lent to search out the mystery of God in art, film, books or anything that sparks off pictures of him for you. And I pray, this Lent and Easter, that you would know that your image is bound up in his image and his story is given so that your story may be complete.

St Peter's News

We held a Church Council on 29 January and it was noted that Jackie Murphy had agreed to become editor of the Tewin Magazine. Indeed she had already produced her first edition (January)! Many thanks to Jackie for taking over, and a big thank you to Jane for her time as editor. Discussion continued regarding the provision of extra space at St Peter's. The PCC agreed to meet the legal and administrative costs arising in the extension of the churchyard further into the Glebe Field. There was a similar transfer in 1974 and more space is now required for the Memorial Garden and burials. The Diocesan Glebe Committee is 'minded to agree', but further discussion is needed with Ivor, who currently farms the land. A new Team policy for Child Protection was agreed. The length of the term of office of elected PCC members was discussed.

Even though it is winter, there has been some activity in the churchyard. Stuart replaced the storm-damaged fence next to the kissing gate by the red brick wall in the southeast corner. He also trimmed the inside of all the hedges. Some pruning was carried out in various places, not least to tidy up after the high winds. Our big problem at present is the state of the grass verges along the drive, particularly on the west side. Please be very careful when parking to avoid becoming stuck and further damaging the verge. Any long-term solution appears to be very expensive, but if you have any good ideas, please talk to our churchwarden.

Our Annual Meeting of Parishioners is scheduled to take place in the Memorial Hall at 7.30 pm on 24 March. All those who are resident in the parish and whose names are entered on the local government electoral roll are entitled to attend, together with all those whose name is on the church electoral roll. The purpose of this meeting is to elect two churchwardens for the following year. As you may know, for the last year we have had only one warden, Pete. Please talk to her to find out what is involved – and then put your name forward for election! This meeting is followed directly by the Annual Parochial Church Meeting at which all those on the church electoral roll are entitled to vote. This meeting elects PCC members and Deanery Synod representatives; receives the audited financial statements for the past year; receives a report on the electoral roll, and an annual report on the proceedings of the PCC together with an annual fabric report. We look forward to seeing you there!

The Tewin Society Award

The presentation of the third annual Tewin Society Award for Heritage, Conservation and environment took place in Tewin Memorial Hall on Monday 13th January, immediately before the *THACS* AGM.

David Gregg started the presentation by announcing the winner and describing the work being recognised by the award. The winner of the 2013 Tewin Society Award is Patrick Holden.

Patrick received his award for his leadership in the 1980s and 90s of a team of more than 50 people who cleared, rehabilitated and mapped the footpaths of Tewin. The culmination of the project was a beautifully illustrated map, still available today from Tewin Stores, used by many walking groups around the county and from further afield. More maps have been sold than there are people in Tewin and the maps have gone across the world to Australia and beyond. A more detailed account of the work can be found on pages 242 & 243 of *"The History of Tewin by the People of Tewin"*.

In accepting the award, Patrick was careful to thank the many people who helped with this venture. He said, "Our village map is an exemplar for other community maps and has stood the test of time over several decades".

I was delighted to present the award to Patrick. The Tewin Society Award plaque had been engraved with his name and the year of the award (2013) and Patrick will have it for a year. He also received a presentation crystal bowl which comes with a separate small base inscribed with "The Tewin Society Award for Heritage, Environment and Conservation 2013".

Our congratulations go to Patrick and our thanks and gratitude to all those who helped him in this work.

IN MEMORY OF JACK BIRD 22ND MARCH 1916 to 1ST JANUARY 2014

Born in Accrington, dad came to Tewin in 1935. He had gained a scholarship to Kew from Blackburn College, but had to do 2 years work as

a gardener. He worked on the Tewin Water Estate of Sir Otto Beit, where he made friends with several of the villagers including his future wife Lily Chalkley. Lily was a Tewin girl and she and dad were married at Hertford Registry Office in 1941. They lived at 40 Upper Green Road until 1948 when he moved with mum and I to 25 Cannons Meadow, where he remained for the last 65 years of his life.

Dad worked for the Development Corporation in WGC as Commercial Manager responsible for landscape development and maintenance for WGC and Hatfield. He became active in the village and, in the late fifties, he joined the Church Council and became a churchwarden and treasurer and sang in the choir. He took on the responsibility for the churchyard, which had become overgrown and he arranged for the regular grass cutting by the Development Corporation and hence the improved appearance. This extended over the years to the Village Green, football and cricket pitches. He was on the Hall committee and one of his favourite tasks was to supply and run the plant stall at the Christmas Church Bazaar.

In later years he helped to set up the tree-planting scheme along with Margaret Knight. He was particularly proud of the Millennium Oak planted on the village green.

He joined the bowls club when Shire Park moved to Tewin and was responsible for the planting scheme. The bowls club became a big part of his life.

He always tried to keep abreast of village life, his neighbour Rose passing on titbits of gossip.

He was a quiet man who kept his own counsel and was always ready to help and advise on gardening issues. He had a good sense of humour and always liked a chat, especially about plants and trees and could always recall their Latin names. 

Our shop in Welwyn, for which we have an existing lease, will be the continuing major source of our funds. The Trustees are confident that the Friends will continue to be able to provide the necessary support to patients and their carers at Danesbury and QVM Hospital in the future.

The Friends are most grateful to all those who have been involved with the Knebworth shop. Especial thanks are owed to the managers, staff and volunteers who have given so much support over the past twenty years – and of course, to all our loyal customers.
