Brenda James passed away on March 3rd after a short illness. She moved from Surrey to Tewin, to live on Lower Green in April 1971 and then to Upper Green Road in April 1981 before moving away to Taunton, Somerset in July 1999. She was a member of the Tewin Memorial Hall Committee in the 1970's and was involved then in starting up the 200 Club. She was on the Parish Council in the 1980's including a period as its Chairman, during which period Tewin won the best kept village competition in 4 out of 5 years. She was an enthusiastic member of the tennis and badminton clubs and had fond memories of the village and its people, always looking for an excuse to visit it. She is survived by her husband Brian, sons Stuart and Douglas and four grandchildren.



Music in St Mary's Church, Welwyn

Sarah Butcher, a professional cellist living in Welwyn for the past 15 years, has presented memorable chamber music concerts in the church in the last two years. EAST HERTS DISTRICT PLAN

The draft of the new East Herts District Plan is open for public consultation on 27th February 2014 for 12 weeks until 22nd May 2014 when all comments should be received by 5pm.

A newsletter and a fact sheet will be delivered to every household from East Herts Council. Details can be found online using - www.eastherts.gov.uk/districtplan

A presentation by East Herts Council for the parishioners of Tewin, Bramfield, Hertingfordbury and Stapleford will be held on <u>Monday 7th April 2014 at 7pm</u> <u>at Tewin Memorial Hall.</u> Documents will be available to view from 6pm.

Tewin Parish Council are pleased to report the draft plan proposes that Tewin will be a Group 2 village (previously a Category 1 village) which are only allowed infilling up to five houses per site. Group 2 villages will have a village boundary whereas Category 2 villages did not.

PUBLIC SEWERS

In February 2014 Tewin Parish Council had to report three sewage leaks spilling out onto roads and fields. The Thames Water engineer advised that these blockages were caused by wet wipes being flushed down the toilet and balls of cooking fat.

Thames Water state that <u>only water</u>, toilet tissue and waste water should go into the sewer.

All other items such as sanitary products, nappies, and wet wipes should be disposed of in the bin. Fat and oil from cooking should be left to cool and can be disposed of in the bin or mixed with seeds and nuts to make a feeder for the birds. Chemical solvents, engine oils and paint should be taken to a local refuse site and medicines to a pharmacist for safe disposal.

Tewin Parish Council would like to thank the Head Teacher for all her efforts to ease the parking problem around Lower Green by publicising the one way system at school pick up and drop off times. Tewin Parish Council is grateful to the parents for their co-operation.

Drive Safe is a new initiative on speed monitoring in villages whereby residents are trained in using smiley face speed awareness equipment. The website group has met six times this year. There have been over 135,000 hits on the site since January 2002. The average number of visitors to the site each month is 3000. Most hits were in June, July, August, and September, probably due to interest in the Classic Cars event, but astonishing nevertheless.

This year has been a year of change and one of consolidation.

Changes have included

SPRING JUMBLE SALE SMASHES RECORDS!

The Tewin Spring Jumble Sale proved to be a record breaker in all areas! Blessed by a beautiful sunny day, it welcomed a record number of visitors, who were greeted by a record number of donations from members of our community. This in turn resulted in record takings of over £3,600 with some extra monies still to be added. Expenses for advertising, catering etc. have to be deducted, but even so, we will have well exceeded the targeted £3,000 figure! A fantastic effort.

This is largely due to the generosity of people who donated, for which we are most grateful, but also to the amazing efforts of our helpers, our army of 'Jumblers', who turned out in great numbers, starting with collections during the week, resuming at 3pm on the Friday before the sale, when many people turned up to set out tables etc., and continuing right through to closure on the Saturday. The new storage unit at the Memorial Hall has proved to be a great asset, since we received so many donations - in fact we've been collecting since before Christmas. Also, last year's purchase of new tables was invaluable and enabled us to set up even more stalls in the car park. For those who haven't been to our Jumble Sales, we are now able to utilise every room at the Memorial Hall – the main hall, the Parish Room, the Kimberley Room, the kitchen, even the corridor, as well as the Scout Hut and the whole of the car park. All these facilities make the Memorial Hall an enormous asset to the village, which is why it's so important that we raise as much money as possible to maintain it.

The Memorial Hall Committee therefore wish to thank everyone who made this sale such a success – all those who donated goods, and of course all our 'Jumblers'. Although it's not possible to name everyone because there are so many, we would mention the new attraction provided by Jerry and Paula Collins, who set up a stall in the front of the Hall to serve the waiting queue with tea, coffee and soup, and then transferred everything to the back where they served bacon rolls, hotdogs etc. so visitors could enjoy sitting in the sunshine and then, fully refreshed, resume their shopping! A great new initiative. So our thanks go to them and to all our marvellous team, who included several newcomers. The success of the day was due to their efforts. Their commitment and good humour sums up the wonderful community spirit in Tewin, also not forgetting those hard-working people from Welwyn, Digswell and other areas who came along and gave such willing help.

- When I visited a woman in hospital last week who has been told she is dying and she asks me (sincerely) how *I* am, and our corner of the ward is full of laughter and prayer.
- When I am down in the dumps and a neighbour appears at the right time on my doorstep and gives me a hug (thank you).
- In the field from my study window which has turned from brown to green and will move later in a cloth of blazing gold.
- When visiting a person with dementia and struggling to know how to connect with them, until I begin to say the words of the Lord's Prayer...
- When the tiniest morsel of broken bread can make a congregation sing with gusto: How Great Thou Art.
- Whenever I see the Furniture Friends van pass me in the street.
- In my nephew.
- When I have visited the Living Room project in Stevenage and seen people acknowledge their frailty and lift one another out of addiction.
- In the opening sentence in the funeral service where St Paul says "I am convinced that neither death nor life...nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God"
- In the image of a poem by Rowan Williams : "death running off his limbs like drops from a shower."
- In seeing a life which seemed stuck a year ago, flourish and thrive today.
- In the movement from stripping the altar on Maundy Thursday, to the church abloom on Easter morning.

And as well as seeing it - there are times I still long to know it. Things in life which remain broken, grief which is still raw, disappointments and sorrows. But what holds me is the picture of the risen Christ still marked by his wounds. Resurrection is not denying suffering and scars but it does show that God bears them with us. And it tells us there is nothing which cannot be redeemed.

Where do you see it? Where do you long to see it?

No, silly, "See Round" is the Diocese's monthly news letter which is always at the back of St Peter's Church for those who want to know what's going on around us. So if you want to know what's happening or happened: See Round!! The March edition had three interesting items in it.

Firstly, news that our Archdeacon, the Venerable Trevor Jones, had received the degree of Doctor of Theology and Ministry at Durham Cathedral. His project was undertaken part-time over 6 years but one wonders how on earth he managed to fit it into his busy schedule.

The second item of local interest was one featuring Catherine Jupp, a member of the Welwyn Team, who sits on the Council for the Development of Ministry in the Diocese.

Thirdly, there was news that St Francis of Assisi Church in Welwyn Garden City had recently received three legacies totalling an amazing £259,660.

This was part of an item which featured a new web-site dealing with legacies and how people can leave money to a church in their will. St Peter's benefited from two legacies from former parishioners in 2013 and would be delighted if others thought kindly of us in this way when next reviewing their wills. Legacies to a church (being a charity) could reduce the amount of any Inheritance Tax that might be payable on an estate; so the cost might be 40% less than you might first think.
