

Now that we are coming into September and the birds have finished nesting, Tewin Parish Council would be grateful if all residents who have hedges on their land bordering a footpath or pavement would cut them back if they are overhanging or partially blocking the path.

BUS CONSULTATION

Herts County Council have launched a consultation into the financial support that they provide for bus services in Hertfordshire and they would like as many people as possible to take part in this consultation, both bus users and non bus users.

The County Council need to save at least £700k from their £3.8m budget for bus services. To protect the majority of services they support and the most used services, the County Council is proposing to:

- withdraw funding to services that run after 6.30pm from Monday to Saturday
- withdraw funding for services that run on a Sunday

This proposal would affect the 388 bus, in particular the last bus which comes from Hertford at just after 6pm on Mon-Fri and turns round at Welwyn North at around 6.40pm to go back.

This 12 week consultation runs until 8 October 2014 and affects the 388 service..

Monday 13th October 2014 - Flower Arranging Presentation

A flower arranging demonstration will be given in Tewin Memorial Hall on the evening of Monday 13th October, so do please come along.

The presenter will be Gill McGregor, who is a qualified and experienced floral design tutor and NAFAS demonstrator both in the UK and world-wide. Gill describes her presentations as "inspirational designs with distinction wrapped in a conversation of humour", so the evening should be enjoyable, informative and fun.

Gill has written a number of books. Her latest published book is entitled "50 techniques used in Contemporary Floral Design" and it is a learning resource to assist students learning contemporary flower arranging or for experienced flower arrangers wishing to research a variety of techniques to enhance their floral designs. Copies of Gill's books will be available for viewing and purchase. The aim of the evening is to encourage and inspire more people to have a go at flower arranging. Gill will demonstrate four different designs at a pace that will enable her to comprehensively explain their methods of construction with enthusiasm and humour. So the evening's presentation will be suitable for both the novice or less experienced aspiring flower arranger as well as for members of local Flower Clubs.

The evening starts at 7:30pm with free wine / fruit juice, with nibbles. The demonstration will begin at 8:00pm and will be followed by a raffle of the resulting four displays. The evening should end by about 10:00pm.



Tewin Bell-ringers' Outing 2014

On the last weekend in July the Bell-ringers went on their annual outing. We returned to The Crown Inn at Frampton Mansell, Gloucestershire. The churches we visited were, Watermoor, Cirencester (which was a ground floor ring of 8), Siddington 6, Ashton Keynes 6 (with a very dodgy spiral staircase), Kempsford 6 (which had the most beautifully painted ceiling in the central crossing), Meysey Hampton 6, and finally Coln St Aldwyns 8. We had a very short ring at Kempson as they forgot about letting us in and we had to go and find a key. We lunched at The Old Spotted Cow at Marston Meysey, a very lovely pub at the end of the village. The day was finished off with a lovely meal back at the hotel. On Sunday various activities were undertaken, two went horse riding, two went canoeing, two went windsurfing, although there didn't seem to be much wind! Six went cycling, whilst the remaining two spent a leisurely morning sitting by a lake reading the Sunday papers and drinking coffee. A lovely way to start the day. We all met up again at The Gateway Café in the Cotswolds Waterpark, where we had lunch before returning home. Most of us took over 4 hours to get there on the Friday, as it was the first weekend of the school holidays and traffic was very heavy round the M25, but going home took half the time. We all had a lovely weekend and missed Audrey immensely. We all wish her well on her road to recovery.

The County 8 Bell Striking Competition

On Saturday 28 June, Broxbourne were hosts to the Coburn Trophy, the County 8 Bell Striking Competition. The Eastern District, of which Tewin is a member, entered a band, the members of the ringing band being:

Team Vicar's Letter

Earlier this summer a handful of us from Tewin and Datchworth churches visited the team at Stevenage Foodbank. We went on a Friday evening to the council offices where they operate and after a slightly surreal encounter of spotting Matt Allwright ("Look! There's that man off the telly!" "What man?" "You know the one from Rogue Traders. The one who sits on the back of the bike") we entered in..

The room soon filled and the team members were busy. People come having received a voucher from Social Services or another agency. This is not about creating dependence, they are limited to three vouchers a year, although the organisers recognize that for many of the people they meet their financial problems run much further than that. The people who turn up are a mixed bunch; the elderly, the disabled, single men, parents with young children. One young man has been given emergency custody of his son. They have been temporarily housed in a hotel room with breakfast provided. He explains they have not yet received the child benefit payment so they have no money for food. Living in the hotel they also have no way to cook anything. only a small kettle. The foodbank volunteers scramble among the tins and pasta to try to find food for the child – biscuits, cereal, cup-a-soup. A man is his 60's tells me his partner has recently died. He moved in with her to be her carer. The tenancy for the house was in her name. On the day of her funeral he received an eviction letter from the council. He used to be a long-distance lorry driver but failing eyesight means he can no longer drive. This is the first time in his life, he tells me, that he has not worked. He can't believe he is facing homelessness. He never imagined he would be queuing at a foodbank

Another woman comes in with a thank you card. She is now working and back on her feet. She tells the team they were the only ones who showed her dignity when she fell on hard times. It meant a lot. She wanted them to know. John Mead, a town councilor, set up the foodbank in response to meeting a local mother who was having to choose between feeding her child or herself. John will speak at our Harvest Festival Service this year, 21st September. Please bring along tins and packets which will go to the foodbank. Pot plants and fresh produce from the flower displays will afterwards be dismantled for local villagers. The collection will go to the Olive Tree Project organized by Embrace the Middle East which supports Palestinian farmers.

The Service will be a Family Communion at 11:15am for the whole church family. After the service there will be a harvest lunch. All are welcome. Please note there will be no evening service that day.

On 31 July, Lord Laming opened an exhibition in St Peter's Church to commemorate the centenary of the start of the First World War. Research had been done into the names on the War Memorial, resulting in a poignant display of the sacrifice made by many Tewin families. Beautiful flower arrangements formed a backdrop to the exhibition and to the evening of First World War Poetry and Music held on Saturday 2 August. The service on Sunday started with an act of remembrance at the War Memorial. The preacher was Simon Chapman, an ex RAF chaplain, who challenged the congregation to work for peace and reconciliation in all aspects of life. The exhibition closed on August 4 with a service of Evening Prayer when the names of all those on the War Memorial were read out. Later that evening a quarter peal was rung on half muffled bells in memory of those who died.

On 5 August the Beit Memorial was cleaned due to the generosity of the Beit Trust. We are very grateful to them for financing this work. On the same day the plinth of the War Memorial was repointed,

On Sunday 10 August it was the turn of St Peter's to host one of the summer Evensongs which move round the five churches in the Team during August. This year's theme is 'Saints and Pilgrims'. Usha Hull preached on the life of William Cowper, poet and hymn writer.

The weather was kind to us on 16 August when twenty five members of the congregation and friends enjoyed a canal trip from Ware to Hertford and back organised by our reader, Mick Simmons. A picnic lunch was eaten on board. Everybody had a great time and all voted to do it again next year!

Looking ahead, the Annual Sponsored Bike'n Hike in aid of the Historic Churches Trust will take place on Saturday 13 September. As usual, refreshments will be available to the cyclists at St Peter's. One of our Bell-ringers, Mark Hall, will be cycling. Please consider sponsoring him; there will be a form available in church.

We will be celebrating Harvest Festival on Sunday 21 September with a Family Communion Service at 11.15 am where we are encouraged to donate a tin for the food bank which is regularly supported by St Peter's. Pot plants will also be welcome for distribution to the sick and elderly in the parish. The service will be followed by a Harvest Ploughman's Lunch. Tewin Bell-ringers Commemorate The Start of World War One

On Monday 4th August, the local band of bell-ringers rang a half-muffled quarter peal to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the start of World War One

Panshanger Aerodrome

This grassed airfield to the west of Welwyn Garden City was, from the early 1930's, a private flying club known as Holwell Hyde.

Shortly after the commencement of the Second World War it was taken over by the Royal Air Force and used as an additional landing ground for the Hatfield based No.1. Elementary & Reserve Flying Training School until mid-1940 when it was converted to a decoy field by the construction of "dummy" timber and hessian hangers and assembly buildings and with mock aircraft dotted around the site. The purpose of this was to detract the attention of enemy aircraft from the De Havilland aircraft factory at Hatfield busily engaged on the war production of fighter aircraft, particularly the outstanding fighter-bomber, the DH Mosquito.

By the summer of 1941 the airfield returned to its former use and in September 1942 the No.1. Elementary & Reserve Flying Training School moved back from Hatfield and with a large complement of the famous Tiger Moth training biplanes. With its official change of title from Holwell Hyde to R.A.F. Panshanger, the Training School was fully occupied on grading courses for volunteer pilots and teaching basic skills. With the later introduction of more sophisticated and faster aircraft, higher standards of pilot training were introduced.

A detachment of the 8th US Army Air Force was also at this site operating homing beacons for Bombers returning from raids on mainland Europe and some were accommodated in civilian housing in Tewin.

In May 1947 the airfield was redesignated as No. 1. Reserve Training School and remained so until it was finally disbanded in March 1953.

Many Tewin residents were gainfully employed in civilian tasks at R.A.F. Panshanger

Reverting to a private Flying Club, some spectacular air shows were staged in the 1960's and a "war film" was partially made there.

Employees of De Havilland Aircraft Company at Hatfield were able to take subsidised private flying lessons on Tiger Moth biplanes at £1 an hour.

In the 1980's the airfield was abandoned and rapidly became derelict. However, in the mid- 1990's private flying was resumed and the airfield and some buildings partially restored and was once again in active use and welcomed training and visitors. The airfield is due to close on Saturday 20th September 2014. The Moneyhole Lane bridleway that ran across part of the site was closed by wartime emergency measures but was not reopened after the cessation of hostilities.

Many of the former wartime buildings may still be seen including "Blister" and "C" type Hangers, Transport Office, Motor Workshops, Messrooms, Guardroom, the NAAFI (Forces Welfare Canteen), and Air Raid Shelters. Some of the original "Nissen" huts at Bericot Green behind Warrengate Farm off the B1000, are still occupied by families.




