DOG FOULING ON UPPER GREEN

Tewin Parish Council has received complaints about dog fouling on Upper Green and would be grateful if everyone would be a responsible dog owner and clear up after their dog. Bagged dog mess can be disposed of in any litter bin and there are currently two on Upper Green in the car park and adjacent to the playground . Please bear in mind that the green is regularly

used by children and for sports and report irresponsible dog owners to the East Herts Council Animal Warden 01279 655261 with as much information as possible about the dog, dog owner, times and locations the owner walks the dog.

HEDGES

Now that we are coming into October and the birds have finished nesting, Tewin Parish Council would be grateful if all residents who have hedges on their land bordering a footpath or pavement would cut them back if they are overhanging or partially blocking the path.

DRAINAGE WORKS

The initial inspection of the drainage systems has been completed and drains unblocked in Orchard Road and Tewin Hill. The Parish Council unanimously agreed to accept the quote for installing two sets of kerbing around two existing gulleys in Upper Green Road to stop erosion of the verge and prevent future blockage. They also agreed to accept the quote to install a new drainage run from the ditch outside 49 Upper Green across the village green connecting into an existing gulley adjacent to the Plume of Feathers green to stop surface water runoff flooding across the road and creating a hazard.

HCC BUS CONSULTATION CLOSING 8TH OCTOBER 2014

Herts County Council need to save at least £700k from their £3.8m budget for bus services and in order to protect the majority of services they support they are proposing to withdraw funding to services that run after 6.30pm from Monday to Saturday and also withdraw funding for services that run on a Sunday.

The Parish Council agreed to object to the proposal as it would affect the 388 bus, in particular the last bus which comes from Hertford at just after 6pm on Mon-Fri and turns round at Welwyn North at around 6.40pm to go back after coinciding with the fast train from London. They also agreed to express their concern at the lack of information and notice for users about the consultation.

PROPOSED HIGHWAYS FOOTPATH ALONG UPPER GREEN ROAD

At a recent meeting with Herts County Council ("HCC") the Parish Council expressed their concerns about the latest version of the proposed footpath, in particular the hazardous location of the proposed crossing just north of 80 Upper Green Road over to the Tewin garage site driveway, the proposed dropped kerb on the footpath outside 76 and 78 Upper Green Road in order to allow vehicles to run over onto the footpath and the narrowness of this part of the footpath as it is bordered by a hedge

and a fence which will trap pedestrians if an oncoming southbound vehicle mounts the pavement. This section of the road is already an existing pinch point evidenced by the wearing of the grass on the edge of the road caused by vehicle overrun. The HCC representatives agreed it would be safest to cross further south outside

37 Upper Green Road but the cost of culverting the ditch would be prohibitive and not in line with current policy on flood prevention which prefers open ditches to pipes.

In view of the receipt of an acceptable outline quote for culverting a section of the ditch Tewin Parish Council agreed to discuss with HCC the option of self funding the culverting of the ditch which would enable the crossing to be moved further south. HCC confirmed that they will extend the proposed path from 56 Upper Green Road behind the earth bund up to the Upper Green car park entrance and the two trees marked for removal could stay as they would adjust the line of the path to go round the trees and that none of the earth bund needed to be removed.

TEWIN CONSERVATION AREA & MANAGEMENT PLAN 2014

Tewin Parish Council agreed to make a very strong objection to the proposal to change the Conservation Area boundary at the eastern end of Hertford Road. They also agreed to comment that the entire document contained many typos, errors and inaccuracies and they raised concerns that no mention has been made of the existing "Tewin Conservation Area Character Statement" published by East Hertfordshire District Council in 1995.

The National Gallery houses one of the greatest collections of paintings in the world and entrance is free. The collection contains over 2,300 works, representing all major traditions of Western European painting, from the artists of late medieval and Renaissance Italy to the French Impressionists. You can preview the collection on line at http://www.nationalgallery.org.uk/ artists/. This could help you identify areas of the gallery where you may wish to spend more time.

In addition to the usual paintings on show, this autumn the National Gallery has a special exhibition *'Rembrandt: The Late Works'* - the first ever in-depth exploration of Rembrandt's final years of painting. The cost of entry to this exhibition is £18 for adults, £16 for seniors (60+) and £9 for National Art Pass holders. If you intend viewing this exhibition we recommend you pre-book, either online via the above site or by telephone (020 7747 2885). You might be able to buy tickets on the day from the ticket desk in the Sainsbury Wing Foyer but if demand is heavy there is no guarantee of availability. The coach will leave the Rose and Crown at 9:30am and leave the National Gallery for the return home at 4:00pm. The seats cost £8.50 for *THACS* members and £11.00 for non- members. Please book early to be sure you don't miss out.

THAMES PATH; A RETIREMENT PROJECT?

Tewin has many retired people, keen to maintain their health and fitness, and with a need to recalibrate their lives after work has ended and the kids have flown the nest (retirement is the biggest change in life since the arrival of baby no 1.)

There are of course a thousand ways of recalibrating life but I am here to advocate a simple project which involves gentle exercise, wonderful scenery and a walk through England's art, architecture and history. This is the Thames Path, beginning near Cirencester in Gloucestershire and finishing 184 miles away at the Thames Barrier near Woolwich in London. It is very easy walking, almost entirely flat and for the most part on madeup paths (you do walk across fields in the early sections). I am mobility impaired but aim to walk three or four miles in a day. Taking advantage of the fact that most sections of the Path are an easy drive from Tewin, Anne and I have covered 116 miles of the 184 in maybe a dozen visits since we commenced the project in summer 2010. We take two or three days each visit and stay in lovely pubs and hotels, or with friends. The thing to note is that if I can manage the walk virtually everybody can manage it. And the things we have seen on or just off the Path! Roman British remains in Cirencester; the most beautiful small medieval chuch in England at Fairford near Lechlade; the amazing World War II defensive line "Stopline Red" reaching along the Thames from Lechlade; the house of William Morris the Arts and Crafts designer, the house of William Morris the motor manufacturer; the beauties of Cricklade, Lechlade, Oxford, Abingdon, Dorchester, Henley, Marlow and much else. And we are nowhere near London yet! We have passed the territory of Alice in Wonderland and Mr Toad of Toad Hall and had a drink at the pub (at Pangbourne) where the Three Men in a Boat finished their odyssey in the 1880s.

I will probably not finish till 2016 or 2017 at our present speed, but I don't mind a bit, it is just a magical experience and the longer it goes on the better it will be. We ended our last section with lunch and a drink at a marvellous pub called the "Bounty" at Bourne End; next time it's on to Cookham the home of the great artist Stanley Spencer where we see a gallery of his work, then on towards Maidenhead. Every mile has a new treat, I can't wait to get to the next section. Give it a try! Mike Horsman

Team Vicar's Letter

The drama, the tension, the laughter, the tears; perfect rises, soggy bottoms, custard thefts and the infamous 'bincident' (Google it if you don't know what I'm referring to) the Great British Bake Off has been compelling TV.

The bakes are ingenious (are you able to create a whole city landscape out of biscuits or a three-tiered chess-set out of sponge?) Yet it is the passion of the bakers which is so infectious; their care and love for what they create a key ingredient in the mix. They put the whole of themselves into it.

And then the bake is taken and broken and eaten, until all that is left are crumbs.

At the heart of the Christian faith is food. Christians have always placed great importance on eating together and on feeding the hungry. And yet when we meet on a Sunday all that is offered is crumbs as bread is taken and broken.

Yet this presentation of small and humble broken bread is the richest meal that can ever be shared. It is a meal where the love and passion of the host is so total, so complete, that he literally puts himself into it.

"Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you all."

And so when we kneel and hold out our hands, and receive broken bread, ragged and rough-edged, we are reminded of the Passion involved in the making of it. We remember the Divine baker who puts his heart and soul into the bread.

At St. Peter's we receive this bread no longer as smooth individual wafers, but rather as bread which is torn and broken: an important reminder of the blood, sweat and tears involved in its making. The broken body of Christ which reminds us of our own brokenness. The broken body of Christ which makes us whole. The broken body of Christ which unites us into one body.

"I am the bread of life" says the Lord, "whoever comes to me will never be hungry". Susannah

CMS Church Mission Society

The 'Link Letter' from Dave and Rine Ingleby in New Delhi arrived in mid August and it is good to know that they, Sem and Joanne are well.

It is a year since they were home for four months and they spent a happy day with us at St. Peter's when we all enjoyed lunch together at the vicarage in Datchworth.

Delhi has had its hottest summer for 62 years and in early June the temperature was 48C. They also had dust storms with high winds which they all found a frightening experience. The two month school holiday at this time meant that Sem,8 and Joanna,5 had to stay indoors for much of the day.

There was a general election in India in May. The Hindu Nationalist Bharatiya Janata Party had a huge majority. They claimed that their 'agenda' was primarily one of growth and development – but the grinding poverty in a deeply entrenched caste system still keeps the poor in their place, especially girls and women.

At a recent launch of Asia CSM in Kuala Lumpur Dave and Rine were given the opportunity to speak briefly about their work. Dave stressed how encouraged he was by the prospect of a grant for the housing project for the very poor and disabled on the outskirts of Delhi.

Rine continues her work with two projects, one with the Burmese refugee community and the other working with disadvantaged children and women in both a slum and a rehabilitation area. Dave continues his work with Habitat For Humanity to provide decent and secure housing for poor communities and families.
