

### Grants Available from East Herts Council in 2015

East Herts Council is pleased to launch its 2015 capital grants programme in rural East Herts only. We have £80,000 to allocate to new projects improving quality of life for residents in rural East Herts. Applications and Terms and Conditions are on our website, go to <u>www.eastherts.gov.uk/grants</u> to find out more.

For projects that cost up to  $\pm 16,000$ , the Council may award up to 50% of costs. The maximum grant available is  $\pm 8,000$ . To be eligible to apply for a large capital grant, you must have 1/3 of the total cost of the project available at the time of application.

In the past, we have funded such projects as equipment to enhance sports coaching in the community, equipment to improve play opportunities, upgrade to village hall kitchen and improved access to facilities. Successful projects are those that are well-thought out and are a close match with the Council's own priorities. The deadline to submit an application is 5 pm 1 June 2015.

The sun is shining so now is the time to get out there and enjoy our lovely countryside with the added bonus that walking is good for your health. Through the website <u>www.hertsdirect.org/walking</u> Hertfordshire residents can keep up to date with the latest organised walking events, links to existing walking groups across the county, such as the Hertfordshire Health Walks (<u>www.hertfordshirehealthwalks.org</u>), and have the opportunity to commit to increasing their physical activity levels by completing the 'Pledge to Walk' survey. In return for their pledge, residents can choose to receive the monthly Hertfordshire Year of Walking newsletter, and via <u>www.hertsdirect.org/walking</u>, have easy access to resources including circular walk routes and maps for their local area.

#### Take a step challenge

Most people take on average 3,000 steps per day, while the recommendation for maintaining good health is around 10,000 according to exercise experts. Aim to increase your daily steps by 500 on a weekly basis until you're closer to that target.

#### **CHAIRMAN'S REPORT**

The hot topic of the moment is the Herts County Council ("HCC") proposal to decimate the bus services through Tewin. Obviously for most of us, the car is always there, and we give no thought to the far off day when that is no longer an option. But we are doing our best for

those parishioners for whom the bus service is an essential part of their daily lives in getting to work or to medical services etc. The consultation is now closed, but as a result of the excellent response to the petition, we will have the opportunity to make a further presentation directly to the relevant HCC committee.

Another source of major concern to parishioners is the state of various verges in the village after the depredation of heavy construction traffic. We are in the process of getting the corner of Lower Green by the Memorial Hall covered in cobbles so that larger vehicles can cut the corner without making a mess. When the building work is complete on the north side of Lower Green we will set about repairing the verge along here. We are still pressing the Riversmead Housing Association contractors to repair the verges at the entrance to Grass Warren.

We have now entered the financial year 2015-16 so we should see the County Council install the pathway from Godfries Close to Upper Green, which should sort out the mess on Maypond Green. We should also finally see Highways sort out the problem that is causing the hole on Lower Green. East Herts Council ("EHC") continue their methodical progress towards a new District Plan. They are only too aware that other local authorities have had their new plans thrown out by the inspector because they have failed to take account of the constant stream of new legislation from central government. It is a moving target which is almost impossible to keep up with. EHC are still proposing that Tewin will drop into the Group 2 category, limiting new housing to only infill sites within the existing village boundary. The only objections to the consultation last year were from various landowners who had put forward sites for development around the boundary of the village.

Until a new District Plan is approved, Tewin has some protection, in that most of the immediately available land within the village boundary has already been developed and land outside the village boundary is Green Belt. Even without new development, there will still be construction traffic as houses are sold, and some, particularly in Tewin Wood, are the subject of large scale improvement.

The Parish Council precept for 2015-16 is £28,500.

On behalf of the Parish, I thank the Clerk and the other Councillors for their work throughout the year. Thanks also to our District and County Councillors, and our local MP, Sir Oliver Heald, for their assistance on various topics.

Finally, we get comments from parishioners and visitors alike, that we are lucky to live in such a nice village with such a rich community spirit. Please join in and help us keep it that way, even if it is just for two hours once a year manning a stall at the fete or picking up any litter that you see in the road outside your house.

## Tuesday 7th July - Visit to Audley End House & Gardens

Audley End is an English Heritage site at Saffron Walden, Essex. It offers a wide range of attractions, including extensive landscaped gardens, stunning views, a decadent Jacobean mansion house, an 1880's service wing and a working Victorian stable yard. There is something there for everyone, so come along and join us for a great day out!

There are two cafes, the Servants' Hall Tea Room (locally-sourced hot and cold meals, drinks and snacks) and the Cart Yard Café (light refreshments).

Disabled access is reasonably good, although there is no disabled access to the first floor of the house and the tea room is only partially accessible. Mobility scooters and wheelchairs are available free of charge, but must be booked in advance.

English Heritage members get free entry to the property but they must bring their membership cards with them on the day. Other people in our group will benefit from the 15% discount given to groups like ours. The resulting prices are shown below:-

### The Bowls Club Diary Dates



# **Team Vicar's Letter**

The comedian Russell Brand, a man with unstoppable hair and an unstoppable mouth, caught public imagination when he campaigned last year for people not to vote "It's not going to make any difference" he declared. His comments resulted in a flurry of interest and interviews, sharing couches on late night chat shows with Hollywood actors and rockstars.

The Church of England Bishops, a group who added together probably have less follicles than Brand on his own, have recently issued their collective thinking on today's political landscape. There has been, of course, less media excitement about this, although some newspaper columnists started suggesting that the Bishop's letter was deliberately partisan – but that is simply not true.

The letter states it comes out of their experience of meeting with many people who are cynical and disillusioned with politics, yet also their encounters with politicians who, with very few exceptions they say, are motivated by a deep desire to make life better for people.

The letter sets out a vision which they hope may re-engage people with politics. It looks at the postwar administrations which changed society; the Labour victory of 1945 which led to the founding of the NHS and welfare state and the Conservative victory in 1979 which stressed the importance of market economics and challenged the growth of the state. The Bishops suggest that it is now time for a new model, which captures the strengths (and avoids the weaknesses) of both. The 'missing link' they suggest, is that we need to avoid the way power has built up in the state or the corporate sector, and return it to local communities and neighbourhoods.

Of course it is easy to say that the Church should not get involved in politics. From a Christian point of view that doesn't add up; the bible repeatedly shows God's concern with how people live together in society and how power in the hands of individuals and states is used or abused. From a democratic point of view also the statement makes no sense, we all have a right and a duty to engage and debate. The Church in particular has much it can contribute. The parish system ensures a presence in every community, in areas of wealth and deprivation, village and city, engaging with businesses, schools, neighbourhoods and other faith groups. It is from the richness of experiences of Christians and their neighbours that the authority of voice can come.

Personally, I am still hugely grateful for people who have won the right for us to have a vote, and to live in a country where I can vote without fear. However disillusioned we may feel, I still believe those two things will never be worth throwing away.

### Earn While You Learn

Today's apprenticeship schemes are diverse and cover a huge range of career paths. They're a great way to get ahead in the field you want to work in; earning while you learn.

Across Hertfordshire, there is a vast choice of schemes from hairdressing to accountancy, with an average pay of £138 per week (as of 26 March 2015). That's £56 more than the national minimum for apprentices elsewhere around the country. Currently, there are over 300 roles available across Hertfordshire, with a number of available positions working for Hertfordshire County Council directly. So there's a lot of choice out there.

Sophie Mance, aged 21 from Baldock joined the Hertfordshire County Council Apprenticeship Scheme in February 2014 and completed an NVQ in Business and Administration earlier this year. An apprenticeship was an excellent choice for Sophie to enable her to develop office skills, as well as gain a qualification with a wage coming in.

Sophie said, "There was nothing in particular that I wanted to study further after school and so I decided not to go to university. I knew with very little office experience, an apprenticeship would be the best way forward with the added bonus of a qualification at the end of the year. I found out that Hertfordshire County Council had a Business and Administration Apprenticeship Scheme available. I knew this was the best place for me and applied."


