#### **BONFIRES**

Bonfires can be a nuisance - the smoke and smells can ruin residents' enjoyment of their property, preventing them from opening windows, hanging washing out and can prevent them from enjoying being in their own garden. They can also have damaging health effects, particularly in susceptible people, such as children, asthmatics and those with heart and chest problems.

<u>Please be considerate of your neighbours and aware of weather conditions</u> when lighting a bonfire. If the air is still the smoke may linger and if it is too windy, smoke may blow into neighbouring properties causing nuisance or across roads causing danger.

If someone is causing you a nuisance by lighting a bonfire at an inconvenient time you should first try to talk to them. It is likely that they may not have realised that their activities could be causing a nuisance and disturbing others. If there is a persistent nuisance that you are unable to resolve informally, it would be worth keeping a record of time/duration of incidents and then you can contact Environmental Health on (01279) 655261 and explain the problem to them.

Instead of having a bonfire, there are other, far less environmentally damaging methods of disposal such as composting, using the brown bin, shredding or taking your garden waste to the Household Waste Recycling Centres (the dump).

#### **LOWER GREEN**

The Parish Council are currently waiting to receive three quotes to reinstate conservation grade kerbing along the northern edge of Lower Green and hope to be able to agree to the works at the next meeting.

#### **NEW BUS SERVICE**

Several letters of complaint have been received about the new bus service with problems being: no service displayed on the bus, unclear which bus stand the bus will be at Welwyn Garden City, lack of room for people and their shopping resulting in standing room only and recently the 11.35 bus not turning up at all. The Parish Council has agreed to forward the letters and various issues to Herts County Council and continues to monitor the situation.



#### **Tewin Apple Day**

A big thank-you to everyone who helped with the Apple Day at the Pavilion on Upper Green. I cannot yet give the full total raised for the Wildife Trust to meet the Parish News deadline, but the home made cakes, biscuits, pies, teas and coffees alone raised over £700. It was our best attended one yet, thanks to the weather and the great support the village and Trust gave with staffing, guiding people to visit the orchard or food preparation. Anna and volunteer Steph Marshall's workshops for jam making and chutney production resulted in nearly 400 jars on sale of all sorts of recipes, all but six of which were sold, along with nearly all the 360 apple juice bottles. Stephanie Marshall wrote: 'This year for the first time I was able to walk around and properly see & enjoy the event. It was so lovely to stand back and watch just how much people enjoyed talking about the unsprayed fresh fruit and the preserves! Between the workshops and Apple Day we sold 75% of the produce! Anna, will you believe me now that your preserves are legendary? '

Lesley Davies, Director of the Herts & Middlesex Wildlife Trust wrote: 'We are so lucky to have such a great supporting group of volunteers and of course my wonderful colleagues who worked so hard preparing for the event and on the day. It was a real pleasure for me to be there.

Such a lovely, friendly atmosphere and a super way of sharing enthusiasm about the orchard and its wildlife. It was wonderful to see so many people and I could hardly believe the numbers going on the guided walks. It was really interesting to see the mix of visitors - some members of the Trust, some from Tewin, others from further afield. What I really like about it is that it attracts families and it was so lovely to see all those children learning about wildlife, seeing the reserve and learning that apples come from trees not supermarkets!'

The Badger Group were marvellous again and thanks to Peter Oakenfull we even had Lord Salisbury's brother Lord Charles (a great fan of apples and cider) join us. In fact Peter, who kindly took on the juicing demonstrations single handedly when Peter Creasey was double booked, was responsible for much of the fruit picking, along with many other volunteers. Parking, kindly agreed by Paddy before his sad death earlier this year, was possible thanks again to Valerie Loughrey and her family, Linda Crawford again treated us to her home baking and David Gregg made it all possible with the superb sign system. Patrick and Roz raised over £90 with the cider competition, won by Phil Bibby, visiting from Stevenage. And special thanks to Hilary Tipping for stepping into a hectic kitchen and producing calm and resolution to the rest of the afternoon's proceedings... I would like to thank everyone, but space is limited, so a very big thank-you all round! Michael Clark

#### **Tewin Allotments**

The first allotments in Tewin, certainly being worked in the 1920s and 1930s, were situated on the present site of Harwood and Godfries Closes on land known locally as Garden Field. The entrance was opposite the Rose and Crown. They were very large plots keeping many families in vegetables.

The Chalkley family ran the allotments on land rented from Walter Hale who farmed at Tewin Hill. Charles Chalkley ran a greengrocers business at the allotments, selling produce from a wooden shed on the site. He also kept pigs, chickens and rabbits and lived in a cottage on Lower Green in what was called the Alley, by the blacksmiths forge. The pigs were killed on the allotments and hung on the walnut tree in the cottage garden before being cut up and sold.

After the Second World War, as people gave up their allotments, Mr Chalkley took them over to keep them going. He sold the produce at Hertford, Hitchin and other local markets and also took it to London. When he became too old to continue, he sold the part of the allotments which he owned to Mr David Hale of Tewin Hill Farm. Eventually the land was developed into Harwood and Godfries Closes in 1971/2.

At the Victorian school building on Lower Green there were small plots where the boys were taught gardening and vegetables were grown and used for school lunches.

New allotments were later started in the late 1970s on land next to the new Tewin Cowper School building in Cannons Meadow. There were about forty plots. They nearly closed in the mid 1990s due to declining support, but, in recent years, their popularity has increased and there is now a a waiting list in operation. The growing interest in organic gardening is well represented and some plots are used for flowers, a wildlife pond and for rearing chickens.

#### Team Vicar's Letter

There are some things I'd love to forget but seem not to be able to – like the time I ended up with my mouth attached to the then Bishop of Bedford's ear. This may seem a difficult thing to do by accident, but I assure you it is possible. After a charity event at which I was speaking he leaned forward as we were saying goodbye. I thought he was going for the polite peck on the check. Turns out he was only stretching to open the door...

But then there are the times when I really want to remember something, like one of the many passwords I have been forced to set up for access to important accounts, and then my mind goes blank.

Memory can be frustrating, difficult and painful. Yet the failing memory of someone slipping in to Alzheimer's reminds us of how precious the ability to remember is and how much it roots us in our families and communities. Those caring for someone in that position will find their own memory of who that person was before the cruelty of illness both an aid in their continuing love for them and a painful reminder of what has been lost.

November is a time for memories and, because of that, can be a month which is bitter-sweet. We begin the month with All Saints Day – a time to give thanks for lives of courage and faith, whose memories have been passed through generations. The remembering of these past lives gives hope to the suffering in our present.

Then we have All Souls, a time to remember loved ones we have known, but from whom we are now separated by death. We will remember them by name in a special service on the 1<sup>st</sup> November. A week later people will gather again to remember those fallen in war – memories which are now largely passed to new generations to hold as important and precious for our future as well as our past.

Churches are a good place to remember: the history of generations gathering to do the same, the prayers of people before us soaked into the air and the strength of the walls which have held immeasurable hopes and fears, loves and loss, brokenness and healing. And they are places where the story of God is still remembered and proclaimed. So as we hold our memories before us, whether they bring us delight or sorrow, we come to be reminded that, soaring or struggling, God remembers us.

Suddenly there seems a lot to do and this must be akin to spring fever which hits us at the other end of the year. Perhaps it is a timely reminder that the church's new year starts on Advent Sunday at the end of this very month. We will not mention the "C" word! But first let's look at some of the events of September and October. 90 humans and numerous other species attended the pet service on the 20<sup>th</sup> September and this was followed the next week by our Harvest Festival. Our thanks go out to all those who decorated the church and who provided a wealth of flowers and produce with which to do it. Afterwards gifts of plants were distributed around the village to a number of those who may not have been able to attend. On the Monday the school held their harvest celebration in the church and what a joyous occasion that was. It was standing room only at the back but that did not detract from the wonderful performance given by the children. Some of us will still be singing "Cauliflower Fluffy" for months to come!

This newsletter may arrive too late to remind you that the feast of All Hallows or All Saints is on the first Sunday in November. Although the following day is All Souls we will be holding a special service for All Souls on the Sunday evening. The next Sunday is of course Remembrance Sunday when we will gather at the war memorial before attending a service in the church.

We have a couple of appeals for helpers. One appeal is for volunteers to join the church cleaning rota and the other is for both helpers and saleable items for the Christmas Market which is on Saturday the 28th November at the village hall. We are also asking the village for volunteer labour to help with the planting of the hedge which will surround the new churchyard extension. As you may know, the existing churchyard is nearly full which left us with a stark choice. We could try to extend the area or we could close the churchyard to further burials. The churchyard is a valued part of our village and valued by many, not just by a few churchgoers. It would be nice if a few that wish to see the churchyard remain open could let the churchwardens know of their availability to help with the planting. 


