Arthur Edwards 12th Feb 1918 - 17th Aug 2015

Many of you will remember Arthur Edwards who sadly died last year at the age of 97.

Arthur was an architect who lived in the village for many years. He was an active member of the Tewin Society and helped to campaign, successfully, against the extraction of gravel at Marden Hill in the late 1970s. The Tewin Society was a conservation group which was instrumental in planting over 1,000 trees and over 10,000 bulbs as well as opening up the footpath network with its Map. Arthur, with Alf Shearman, reviewed planning applications, a function that is now missed. In addition, Arthur ran an annual Litter Blitz where volunteers picked up litter in and around the village and the B1000. The majority of this garbage was from cars, although there was some along the footpaths. This clearance, together with the sterling work of Dickie Dunn and Dave Pullen, resulted in our getting several 'Best Kept Village' awards.



PLEASE HELP SAVE OUR POOL

You may not be aware that recent research states that 50% of British children cannot swim, even though it is part of the National Curriculum for primary aged children.

Tewin Cowper School is in the envious position of having its own outdoor heated swimming pool that allows all the children at the school to have the opportunity to learn to swim during the summer term. The pool also benefits the wider village community when the rest of the village is able to join the Swim Club and use the pool during the summer holidays. Over the years the pool has enabled many village children to learn to swim and has created many happy memories. More importantly with the summer holidays looming it provides our children with hours of fun swimming and playing with their friends, and some relief for the parents and carers!

The pool is run and managed by Tewin Cowper School Family Swim Club Committee, a small group of parents who volunteer their time to not only run and manage the pool but also organise fund raising events so that the pool is entirely self-financing.

The pool has been in existence for approximately 50 years, and now requires some significant expenditure to ensure that it can continue to be operational. A new pump house and filter is required, with ancillary works associated with this. To carry out these urgent works by Easter 2017 the Committee need to raise $\pounds10,000$. If we are unable to raise this total it is possible 2016 will be the last summer the pool is operational.

The committee is totally committed to raising this money to ensure the pool continues to be such a valuable asset to both the school and village in the future, and we will continue to carry out various fund raising activities throughout the year. However, as I am sure you appreciate this total is a huge mountain to climb for such a small village school.

Tewin Parish Council Accounts for the Financial Year Ending 31st March 2016

At the Annual Parish Council meeting on 9th May 2016 the Parish Council unanimously resolved to accept the accounts for the financial year ending 31st March 2016 and they were signed by the Chairman and the

Clerk as the Responsible Financial Officer.

<u>Tewin Parish Council Annual Return for the Financial Year</u> Ending 31st March 2016

At the Annual Parish Council meeting on 9th May 2016 the Parish Council unanimously resolved to accept and approve Section 1 Annual Governance Statement on the Annual Return 2015/2016 and Section 2 Accounting Statements for 2015/2016. The Annual Return was signed by the Chairman and the Clerk as the Responsible Financial Officer.

Tewin Tennis Courts

We would like to bring to the attention of all parishioners that they may use the tennis courts on Upper Green without joining Tewin Tennis Club, provided that they abide by the normal booking and playing rules. A returnable key is available from Tewin Stores, Hertford Road in exchange for a contribution towards maintenance of £5 per hour per court (£2.50 for juniors).

Tewin Hill Potholes

A Highways road closure notification has been received for Tewin Hill for drainage investigation works for 7 days during the period 27th June 2016 and 27th December 2016 when signs are in place. An alternative signed route will be provided for traffic whilst the road closure is in place.

Lower Green Kerbing

A notice of works application and a temporary traffic regulation order have been applied for and Herts Highways have confirmed receipt and will advise the Parish Council of the earliest possible date for the works once approval has been received. This will be a minimum of 8 weeks time as the road closure is required to be advertised.

Flytipping Hertford Road

At least four incidents of flytipping in Hertford Road have been reported over the last month and a request for CCTV surveillance at Lousehole Bottom has been requested.



CMS - The Church Missionary Society

At St Peter's, like many other churches in the country, we help to support missionaries in different parts of the world. For the last five years we have supported David and Rine Ingleby who work in Delhi. In May we received a letter from them:-

Dear Friends,

It is with mixed emotions that we write this letter. After several months of powerful consideration, we have come to the decision that it is time for us to move back to the UK for the foreseeable future. We feel that this is the right thing to do at this time. There is no overriding factor for this decision but rather several small reasons which have affected our decision making. Delhi is not an easy place to bring up young children: the climate is extreme, there are limited places to play and the air pollution is terrible and quite dangerous. But we have coped with the challenges and Sem and Joanna are very happy here. At the present time they attend The Metro Delhi International School.

David will be sad to leave 'Leprosy Mission India' as he feels that he has got into his stride and there is so much work to be done. The need for staff continues. In India there are about 125,000 new cases of leprosy every year, around10% of these being children.

Rine has loved her work and will continue to volunteer for Sugandh from the UK.

We wish them well and give them our sincere thanks for their friendship and for sharing with us their life and work in Delhi.

They plan to settle and work in Gloucester near to David's family.

After we received David and Rine's letter, St Peter's PCC agreed that we wished to continue to support CMS and their work overseas.

We have subsequently met Andrew and Andrea Young. They are at present training in Oxford and will shortly go out to Nepal. They came to St Peter's on Sunday 5th June and we were very pleased to meet them. They have worked in Nepal before and, when they return, they will be living in Kathmandu. We look forward to hearing from them.

Team Vicar's Letter

I am now a wearer of glasses. I've been waiting for this moment for years. As someone who has been deeply in love with The Smiths since the 1980's my teenage wardrobe always felt incomplete without a pair of thickset NHS spectacles, like my Northern beloved Morrissey (I do realise there will be some of you who at this point have NO idea what I'm talking about).

But about a month ago, after my first eye-test in 20 years, it was confirmed by an Optometrist that yes indeed, for reading only, specs would finally be a part of my life. "It's what we would expect for people your age" he said, with deep sincerity.

It's taking a bit of time to get used to. They are another-thing-to-remember and still can make me slightly self-conscious. However, they are multipurposed - good for pinning back hair and for sucking the arm of, when I need to ponder. They are also very good at helping me see. I didn't realise what I was missing until I put them on and blurred letters transformed into crisp, clear words.

Faith is a bit like wearing glasses. Sometimes people think it is a set of rules, a doctrine or creed – but it's perhaps better described as a lens. It helps me see in a particular way.

When God made humanity, the book of Genesis tells us, he made us in his image; there is something in every person that bears the mark of God. When you do something for the least, says Jesus in Matthew's gospel, the imprisoned, the hungry, the thirsty – you do it for me; there is something particular about the weak, rejected and desolate in which we can see Christ. This is the lens through which Christians look out at the world. It is a lens also, which encourages us to see the possibilities of hope and forgiveness, even when all seems dark. When we look at the world through the gaze of the cross, we are shown how violence and hatred will never be ways to win, it will be love that pours itself out, which will bring new life.

These are the glasses that the bible invites us to put on. And sometimes they take a while to get used to, and sometimes they can be uncomfortable – but also they can open up to us a new beauty, in surprising places, that we just hadn't seen before.





Tewin DRIVESAFE Speed Awareness

Between Feb - May 2016 Tewin DriveSafe volunteers have **speed-checked over 800 vehicles** entering or leaving the village during the regular 2 or 3 sessions each month. The Speed Indicator Device (SID) highlights each car's speed to help improve all drivers' speed-awareness, as it seems many are often not aware of how fast we are driving on local roads. On one occasion almost 50% of passing cars were speeding in Tewin's 30 mph zone. Worst offenders doing the highest excess speeds are logged to the Police computer system. **In Feb - May, 43 speeding vehicles** have been contacted by E.Herts police with **warning letters**. It is hoped that local speed awareness will improve greatly and reduced speeding will avoid the need for the Council, Police & Highways to consider more expensive or intrusive speed-control roadside arrangements in Tewin.
