Upper Green Road Ditch

You may have noticed in the latest edition of the Hertfordshire Horizons magazine, that Highways has found some extra money to clean out ditches etc. Well our section of ditch has been put on that program,

hopefully to be done sometime this year. Not only will they dig out the silt, but they will bring a jetter to clear any blockages in the pipework. This will also incorporate a camera to check out the reason for any blockages.

Works on Footpath 30 (Tewin Close to Cowpers Way)

Some surface improvement work to Footpath 30 will shortly be taking place. It is a joint project between the Rights of Way Service, Herts County Council and Tewin Parish Council who are contributing to the work using their 2016 Parish Paths Partnership grant.

Litter Bins

Please be sensible as to what you put in the litter bins. Too often there are large bags of rubbish stuffed in to them leaving no room for genuine litter, including dog poo bags. If you are having a picnic, please take your rubbish home with you. Do not put household rubbish in litter bins. They are certainly not intended for the bag of empty hair dressing bottles observed in the Lower Green area recently. Basically if your rubbish is going to fill the bin, then you should be taking it away with you.

Changes to Hertford Car Parks

In October 2016, East Herts Council will introduce new pay and display machines in all its car parks – enabling people to pay by credit or debit card, contactless cards, Apple Pay, Android and cash. Card users will be able to pay when they leave so they can spend as much time as they need in town.

Smartcard holders will no longer be able to use their cards once the new machines have been introduced. No Smartcards will be sold after September 1, nor will existing cards be topped up. Between October 1 and November 30, holders can obtain a refund on the unused element of their Smartcard by completing an application form available on the council's website or pick one up from their offices in Hertford or Bishop's Stortford. This should be returned to the council along with the card.



Screen On The Green

We begin the 2016-17 Season, with a 2015 film – "Sunset Song". This is based on the classic novel by Lewis Grassic Gibbon, the nom de plume of James Leslie Mitchell, a Scotsman who settled in Welwyn Garden City in 1925 with his wife, and who died there ten years later, aged only 33 years from peritonitis brought on by a perforated ulcer. So – a local link.

"Sunset Song" is the first book in a trilogy known as "A Scots Quair" and is considered to be among the defining works of the 20th century Scottish Renaissance. It has been adapted for television in the past and is now a full length film, directed by Terence Davies. It tells a story of hope, tragedy, and love in a rural Scottish community, at the dawning of the Great War. And especially of the inspirational effect of the landscape on the strong women it portrays. It stars Agyness Deyn, Peter Mullan and Kevin Guthrie.

I will announce the dates and other films to be shown this season in the next edition of the magazine.

Team Vicar's Letter

This summer our country has seen political shifts like never before; Brexit, leadership challenges, change of government, uncertainty of markets - all reminding us of the fragility of leadership and power in the highest of institutions.

But regardless of what side of the referendum that we sit on or political allegiance we hold, in an imperfect world, where no system will be without flaws, we should be grateful for living within a society where we can peaceably cast a vote. The Archbishop of Canterbury has called democracy the "reconciled form of civil war. It is the way people take power without actually shooting each other. And I have spent enough time in countries where they do shoot each other to say 'Praise God' that we have this, and thank you to the politicians who make sure it works".

The responsibilities of government are huge, and the decisions made can be life-changing for individuals and on a global front. With decisions of national security, foreign diplomacy, war and peace, poverty and wealth, healthcare and education, being Prime Minster, David Cameron once said, is like "being in a sort of asteroid shower. 



The Month of September

Did you know that nothing whatsoever happened in British history between 3rd and 13th September 1752? Until then two calendars had been in common usage. The Gregorian Calendar was based on the astronomical year with 365 days per year and 97 leap years every 400 years. The Julian Calendar was based on the solar cycle and, with 365.25 days per year, was fractionally too long falling out of step with the seasons. Britain decided to abandon the Julian Calendar and adopt the Gregorian Calendar. By doing so the 3rd September instantly became the 14th September. Thus nothing whatsoever happened in British history between 3rd and 13th September 1752. Many people thought that their lives would be shortened and demanded their 11 days back.
