#### <u>Consultation on Initial Proposals for New</u> <u>Parliamentary Constituency Boundary Changes</u>

The Boundary Commission for England is conducting a review of parliamentary constituencies. They have to ensure that every new constituency has roughly the same number of electors: no fewer than 71,031 and no more than 78,507.

While proposing a set of boundaries which are fairer and more equal, they are also trying to reflect geographic factors and local ties.

The initial proposal is that Tewin will continue to be part of Hertford Rural North and Hertford Rural South wards which come under East Herts District Council, but both these wards would share an MP with Welwyn Garden and Hatfield instead of our current MP Sir Oliver Heald. MPs tend to operate at two levels. At one level, they deal with the concerns of their constituents and interface with local councils and other bodies as necessary. The other level is national affairs in Parliament. To see details of the proposed changes go to https://www.bce2018.org.uk/ and enter vour postcode.

This will show the proposed new boundaries. If you click on the blue

BOUNDARIES button you can also select to see existing boundaries, ward boundaries etc. Note that some features are only displayed if you zoom in enough. The 12 week consultation is running from 13th September 2016 until 5th December 2016 and comments can be submitted to the Boundary Commission for England :in writing to : Boundary Commission for England, 35 Great Smith Street, London,

#### **Dangerous Parking**

A vehicle causing an obstruction is one which has been parked and left

unattended in such a way that it is considered to be a hazard to other road or footway users. For example, a vehicle may have been parked on a bend on the carriageway or at a junction, creating a safety hazard to other users; it may have been parked across a footway blocking free passage to pedestrians, particularly those using mobility scooters or with push chairs; or a vehicle may have been parked in front of a driveway blocking access to private or public property.

The enforcement of yellow lines, time limited waiting and other parking

restrictions in Hertfordshire is entirely the responsibility of the East Herts Council and their Civil Enforcement Officers. They can also issue a Penalty Charge Notice to vehicles obstructing a dropped kerb that serves a driveway, cycle track or pedestrian access.

**To report dangerous parking or parking that has caused an obstruction** - Please contact Hertfordshire Constabulary on the non emergency number **101** with as much detail as you can e.g.:-

Your name, email or contact address, your telephone number

Location of the vehicle causing obstruction, e.g. at junction of , outside house

number

Make, model, colour of vehicle and registration number

Details of any suspected local owner/registered keeper of the vehicle

# There is a car parked in my road which I do not recognise, and it hasn't moved for some time. Who do I contact?

Firstly, you should check with your neighbours, to see if they know who owns the car. Failing this, there are a number of things you can do:

• If the car has been stationary for some time, and appears

abandoned, you should report it to East Herts Council 01279-655261.

• If you think the car may be stolen, due to damaged locks / ignition or being left insecure please ring 101 and Police will conduct checks on the vehicle.



### The Month of November

In the original Roman calendar, November was the ninth month of the year. It got its name from the Latin word "novem" which means nine. However, it became the eleventh month when the Romans added the months of January and February to the start of the year.

The last Sunday of the Church Year, the Sunday before Advent, is often called 'Stir-up Sunday'. (Advent begins four Sundays before Christmas.) Stir-up Sunday is the traditional day for everyone in the family to take a turn at stirring the Christmas pudding, whilst making a wish.

A Christmas pudding is traditionally made with 13 ingredients to represent Christ and His Disciples.

A proper Christmas pudding is always stirred from East to West in honour of the three Wise Men who visited the baby Jesus.



# Team Vicar's Letter

On November 8<sup>th</sup>, the months of spectacle, sleaze and spin will culminate in American citizens voting for their new President. It has been an election campaign like no other. A reminder of how low we can stoop when power is at stake.

As yet, as I write, I have no idea of the outcome. 2016 has had many surprises in store in British politics and so I'm loathe to trust the polls entirely. With the rest of the world I wait, with a slightly sick feeling of what might be.

But November, in the Church's calendar, is an apt time to reflect on those who are trusted with positions of power.

All Saints day falls on the 1<sup>st</sup>. It is a day we remember the example of people who, despite still having their flaws, lived lives in the service of God and others. Who often turned aside from riches in order to care for the poor and the outcast.

All Souls is on the 2<sup>nd</sup>. On it we face the frailty of human life and our utter reliance on God's mercy. We bring before God in prayer those who have died, whom we have loved, but it is a time for sombre humility, for remembering that although we are precious in God's eyes, we are *not* God, we are all mortal. That before him, we will one day be accountable for the choices we make and the lives we have lived.

Remembrance day on the 11<sup>th</sup>, a century after the first war it remembers, still has every relevance. It forces us to look at the outcome of human greed and pride, the potential dangers of nationalism, the horrors made possible by xenophobia and the impact the decisions of a few can have on the lives of many.

The month is rounded off with the festival of Christ the King. It is the end of our church year. On it we gaze at Christ on the throne, but also remember his example of humility, of putting aside power for the sake of love, of emptying himself, being born on earth in human form, in the poverty of a stable, in the company of people oppressed.

"Do nothing out of selfish ambition or conceit" says St. Paul "but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. Let the same mind be in you, that was in Christ Jesus" *Philippians 2:4-5* 

Any new President would do well to take note. Susannah



### Have Your Say On The Future of Transport in Hertfordshire

Forecasts for the next 35 years predict that the county's population will have grown by around 400,000 to over 1.5m. This will have a huge impact on congestion and journey times, particularly during peak travel periods. The Transport Vision for Hertfordshire, which is now open for the public to comment on, sets out a programme of transport improvements to help deal with this growth.

The major schemes proposed that we want to hear your views on include:
