In Memory of Margaret Knight

It was sad to hear of the recent passing of Margaret Knight of the Mill House, Archers Green.

Many people will know of her most obvious legacy - the planting of the many roadside daffodils, crocuses, and ornamental trees that we enjoy around the village. She also organised other working groups to care for and improve the natural environment around Tewin. She was involved in the planting of the Hundred Year Wood at the top of Upper Green and, more recently, the Millennium Oak on Lower Green.

She was an active member of the Tewin Society and always a welcoming host when we held our meetings at the Mill House, after she became less able to get around. She was the first recipient of the Tewin Society Award presented by THACS in 2011 in recognition of all she had done to enhance the village.

She served as Tree Warden for Tewin, and advised the Parish Council on various tree issues. When she became too frail, she would send her gardener out to help and to plant sacks full of bulbs.

She opened her extensive garden for charity events, especially for the National Gardens Scheme. For those of us who explored such an interesting garden, and then had afternoon tea sitting on the terrace with the Mimram flowing gently past, these are days never to be forgotten. She will be sadly missed but her legacy lives on.

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT April 2017

One of the main functions of the Parish Council is maintaining the fabric of the village. To this end, we have undertaken the significant expense of installing granite kerbstones along the northern edge of Lower Green, to protect the edge of the Green and to enhance the Conservation Area.

Also, following discussions with the Parish Council, Greene King have protected the green triangle in front of the Plume of

Feathers by installing a wooden surround.

The Parish Council owns the Pavilion on Upper Green which has been successfully run by the volunteers of the Community Interest Company. We have obtained planning permission to extend the front of the Pavilion to provide much needed extra space. We are now looking into costings and funding. The new East Herts District Plan continues to progress. Following the recent consultation exercise, the plan now goes before the Planning Inspector. Only factual corrections have been made at this stage. It is still being proposed that Tewin will be a Group 2 Village, only allowing infilling within the existing Village Development Boundary around the Lower Green area. There may be different opinions as to what are the essential characteristics of a village, but the Parish Council believes that if you keep adding 10% more houses every ten years or so, then eventually those essential characteristics will be lost. House building places a burden on the village and its residents. Sevenacres and its residents are part of the village now, but the development has been ongoing since 2007 and there are still outstanding problems. Last year, the Sevenacres Residents' Association were disappointed that I had not mentioned that they were still trying to get various problems fixed by the builders. Well this year I can make amends, and say that they are still trying to get some problems fixed. For instance, if you buy in a road of new houses, you don't expect to find out that Thames Water has not adopted parts of the sewer system. One of the benefits of living in Tewin, is the many organisations run by volunteers. In particular this year, we mention the Drivesafe Team, who go out two or three times a month to set up a portable roadside speed indicator to make drivers aware of the speed that they are driving. This helps to make Tewin a safer place. The Drivesafe Team have also provided the justification for a permanent flashing speed sign and applied for funding on behalf of the

Council. They need more volunteers and can be contacted by email at **drivesafe.tewin@gmail.com**

The Parish Council is one of the organisations that has given a grant to the Tewin Community Bus project, which is currently running a minibus service to Hertford and Welwyn Garden City each Saturday.

It is also worth mentioning that Tewin is not about to become part of Welwyn Hatfield. Current talk of boundary changes only applies to the constituency boundary for MPs. Tewin remains part of East Herts District Council. Current headlines about brown bin collections only apply to Welwyn Hatfield. The continued delivery of the Welwyn Hatfield Council magazine to local addresses is the fault of the systems used by the commercial company that handles the delivery.

Thank you for the help and support from the other members of the Parish Council, our two District Councillors and our County Councillor. And we all appreciate the efficient work of our Parish Clerk.

A special thank you to the parishioner who provided funds to buy a new Christmas tree on Lower Green after some vandal decided to drive at and over the original.

The Parish Precept for 2017-18 is £29,500. All Councillors are unpaid volunteers and all Council business is decided by a majority vote.

Cancer Screenings Could Save Your Life – Prioritise Your Health

The letter arrives inviting us to attend a cancer screening but we don't have symptoms, we are busy, the screening process might be undignified – we justify not taking part in the screening. With a focus on two types of cancer we would like to remind you why screening is so important:

Bowel Cancer - screenings available for those aged 60-74

- · Around one in 17 people in the UK will develop bowel cancer.
- It is the third most common cancer and the second biggest cause of cancer deaths. Bowel cancer screening has been shown to reduce the risk of dying from bowel cancer by 16 per cent.
- Bowel screening can detect bowel cancer in people that have no symptoms.
- When diagnosis is made early, before it has had a chance to spread, bowel cancer can be cured in over 90% of cases. The later a diagnosis is made, the more difficult bowel cancer is to treat.
- The sample is taken in the privacy of your own home.
- If you are eligible for screening but have not been contacted please call 0800 707 6060 Monday-Friday, 9am – 5pm to order a kit.

Cervical Cancer - screenings available for women aged between 24-64

- · 3000 women each year are diagnosed with cervical cancer.
- Cervical cancer is the most common cancer in women under the age of 35.
- Screening detects abnormalities that can be treated to prevent cancer developing.
- Screening prevents 75% of cervical cancer developing yet 1 in 4 women do not attend when invited.
- This 5 minute test could save your life.
- If you are eligible for screening but have not been contacted then please contact the surgery to find out when your next test is due.

Joy!

If you ever meet Arch-Bishop Desmund Tutu, one of the things you will notice is that he giggles. A lot. I was once at a service in St Albans when he was preaching. As he processed in he beamed and throughout the service he smiled and giggled to the people sitting next to him – and on the way out, surrounded by rather 'proper' cathedral clergy, he danced. He is a man who radiates joy. In a book recently published, entitled 'Joy' Tutu discusses, in conversation with the Dalai Lama, how that sense of joy has been formed within them, despite the fact that both of them have known great suffering in their time. It is something, they argue, that we can find, despite our outward circumstances, because it comes from within. It is something that we can cultivate.

It is also one of the qualities that we have been exploring as congregations this year – and to rejoice in joy we have invited a local Gospel Choir to run a singing workshop and evening concert on the 6^{th} May, at St Mary's Church Welwyn. It's an event open to all. Come sing yourself into joy, with the wonderful passion and exuberance of gospel music – music which also originated out of situations of suffering, and yet manages to express such joy. There are more details in the magazine about how you may take part.

Also there will be another occasion of joy this month. A rather special 'wedding' will be taking place at All Saints Church on the 20th May, as we welcome a travelling theatre company to perform their play 'Our June's Wedding'. You'll be invited to imagine yourselves as guests and enjoy an afternoon with a joyous father-of-the-bride, nervous groom, lost best man, disgruntled mother-in-law and enjoy watching the drama unfold! Again, more details can be found in the magazine.

For Tutu, the most certain way to increase joy in our lives is to increase it for others. Joy is most deeply found, he says, in acts of generosity and compassion. If that is true, I wonder where you may find joy today?
