Harvest Festival is on Sunday 17th (p18) and there will be a Coffee Morning in aid of Macmillan Cancer Support on the 29th (p2).


Tewin Stores urgently need the advice of a Solicitor see p30 for details.

### PLEASE BE VIGILANT

Around 11.00am on the 9th August offenders attempted a burglary at Bishops Road Tewin.

Please contact the police on the non-emergency number 101, if you have any information relating to this attempted burglary. Alternatively, you can call anonymously via Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111. Please be vigilant and do report any suspicious activity or behaviour in the area.

### Tips To Prevent Burglary:

Check all downstairs windows and doors are locked and secure before you leave or go to bed. If you are going out, lock upstairs windows too [if you remove keys, ensure you have a fire escape plan].

Don't leave car keys, mobile phones, wallets or other valuables on window sills, in hallways or in any other visible place.

Double-lock UPVC doors by lifting the handle and locking it to engage the security features.

Use timer switches on lamps to give the impression someone is at home.

Secure your rear garden: lock rear gates, securely lock sheds and garages, and keep tools and ladders locked away, as they could be used to break into your home.

#### **Speeding Drivers**

In May this year the DriveSafe team reported that Tewin will receive from the PCC's Road Safety Fund a permanent light-up Speed Indicator Device (SID) to be installed at Upper Green. Safety is a real concern at that location where many early-morning drivers still travel over 30mph, with too many over 35mph, and some even over 40mph.On one recent morning in mid-August the Drivesafe team recorded a vehicle at 59mph and another at 49mph driving Southwards past Upper Green. Moments earlier a pedestrian had crossed where one of the two footpaths emerge - it seems that a pedestrian injury or worse was just narrowly averted.

Advice from Herts Road Safety team is that the site-survey has been completed and the new SID should be installed within the coming two months. We know from feedback that most Tewin villagers detest speeding and DriveSafe will continue to show a high profile and hope that drivers take notice and drive with appropriate care. ## Team Vicar's Letter

Sometimes it is essential that we find time to rest.

There's a small little story in the bible in which the prophet Elijah is worn out. He's had enough. He is tired. He is so low. Frankly he wants to die. But in that weary place he is not alone. God sends angels to minister to him. When he awakes, the story tells us, Elijah finds cakes cooked by angels on hot stones and water.

Now we are not told exactly what these cakes are like. Personally I picture it as a wonderful Bake-Off affair, with angels in pinnies and a rather spectacular four-tiered Victoria sponge. We may not know the cake but the story does tell us the details of God's tender care, his kindness, his provision, when we need to rest.

Now Elijah doesn't immediately bounce back into life. He lifts his head, bleary eyed. He sees the cake and eats and then he lies back down - for when we are exhausted, sometimes it takes time to recover. But God doesn't shake him and say pull yourself together...rather he sends those baker-angels again. The food is waiting, as Elijah stirs once more, the kindness of God feeds him and this time he is rested. Those two small meals pick up a man who felt near to death and lead him back to life.

We all get worn out. Life may be busy or our health failing. Sometimes particular relationships can drain us, or those dreadful worries that wake us in the night.

So we all need chances to rest.

Every year I stay in one of the many Christian Retreat houses across the country. They are spaces designed to allow people to rest and restore. Many have the chance to give you a listening ear, if that would be helpful, or time to just be. They are often in beautiful settings and much cheaper than any hotel. You don't need to have a Christian faith to stay, all are welcome. Do ask me if you'd like to be pointed towards one or visit <u>retreats.org.uk</u>. Sometimes it is essential that we find rest.

#### Love Thy Neighbour As Thyself

Heaven forbid that I should actually do that. It would be inconsiderate and not what he or she deserves. The truth is that we love ourselves badly much of the time. Sometimes, we lavish upon ourselves a form of love which is actually indulgence, an encouragement to laziness or greed or complacency. We have innumerable ways of letting ourselves off the hook when there are issues we should address.

Sometimes, we do the opposite, showing ourselves no compassion, expecting perfection. Some of the time, we brick ourselves up inside too small a space with fear, shyness, embarrassment and self-consciousness. We keep in mind what we think we cannot do and re-visit past failures and shortcomings for re-enforcement.

If the biblical injunction had been "love thyself as thy neighbour" we might make a better job of that. We see in neighbours the attractive characteristics they possess. Energy, vitality, confidence, beauty, intelligence, courage,

strength and whatever we feel we ourselves might lack. If they have faults and failings, we are still full of admiration and possibly a bit of envy. The paradox is that they see the same admirable qualities in us and make allowance for our little shortcomings.

"Love thy neighbour as thyself" is therefore a real challenge to be tackled. It means recognising our imagined limitations, owning our potential and pushing at our boundaries. If we can aim to replace fear with courage, shyness with openness, negativity with confidence, loving our neighbour will be something he or she cannot fail to notice.
