Upper Green Road Works

Unfortunately due to unforeseen circumstances the road closure planned by Herts Highways for 9th August at Upper Green Road to work on the gulley at the entrance to Sevenacres was delayed and will be re-programmed at the earliest available opportunity. Indications are that it is

now planned for 6th to the 9th of November, but this is yet to be confirmed by Herts Highways.

Parish Council Audit

BDO LLP has completed the external auditor report and certificate in respect of the annual return for Tewin Parish Council and has issued an unqualified audit opinion as they consider the information in the annual return is in accordance with proper practices and the relevant legislation and regulatory requirements have been met. This was approved and accepted by Tewin Parish Council and the notice of conclusion of audit and audit form is displayed on the Parish Council notice board for the statutory 14 days.

Defibrillator

The Parish Council has agreed to pay, install, maintain and be responsible for a defibrillator outside Tewin Memorial Hall.

If you hire someone to dispose of waste, check that they have a licence to carry it – if your waste is dumped illegally, you face prosecution and a fine of up to $\pounds 5,000$. This includes scrap dealers.

You should:

- · Ask to see their waste carrier licence registration certificate
- Ask for a receipt detailing where the waste is going, vehicle details and carrier's authorisation number
- Phone 08708 506 506 and ask for a waste carrier validation check. Or check at

www.gov.uk/access-the-public-register-for-environmental-information.

Fly-tipping offenders can, and will, be prosecuted. Anyone found guilty at court faces a fine of up to $\pm 50,000$ and/or 12 months in prison.

Please call the council on 01279 655261 and ask for Environmental Services or email operations.admin@eastherts.gov.uk. Please take photos but don't touch the fly tip or remove any evidence. *If you see fly tipping actually taking place call the police on 999*.

Team Vicar's Letter

'Love never ends...' These are words we often hear read at a wedding, as part of St Paul's letter to the church in Corinth, it is a beautiful passage about the importance and everlasting nature of love. Yet I often think that they are words we might most need to hear at the end of life, because they remind us of the importance of the love we have shared with people, love which is not diminished or devalued by death.

For Christians God is the source of love - love which knitted us together in our mother's womb, as the psalmist tells us, and love which covers us even in death. And in Jesus, we see that love in flesh and in resurrection. Love which enters the reality and sorrow of our lives, and love which is unstoppable and turns even death into life once more.

Each year at St Peter's we hold a memorial service for people to come and hold before God in prayer, those they have loved who have since died. It is a quiet, reflective peaceful service. We hear the names of loved ones read out in that holy space, and light candles to remember that love for them that still burns within us.
