### **Tewin Parish Council**



#### Planning Application 3/17/1952/OUT - Land North of Godfries Close access off Upper Green Road.

Construction of 4 dwellings- 2 three-bed and 2 two-bed and new vehicular access

Tewin Parish Council's response: This application is

basically the same as application 3/17/0722/OUT, with four dwellings instead of nine. The number of dwellings was not a factor in any objections to 3/17/0722/OUT, nor in the EHC decision to refuse that application. Therefore all objections to 3/17/0722/OUT can be taken as objections to 3/17/1952/OUT and TPC are confident that EHC will again refuse the application. If there are

fewer public objections to the latest application, it is because

(a) local residents have expressed confusion over whether this is the same application that they have already commented on

(b) no apparent display of the usual yellow planning notice adjacent to the site. For the record TPC repeat our principal objections:

(a) the applicant has not justified building on Green Belt land

(b) the proposals are incompatible with the submitted District Plan, and are thus not a sustainable development

(c) it would create a precedent for other developers with land around the village The futility of these applications re-enforces our view that they are part of a ploy to influence the Inspector at the District Plan Hearings, knowing full well that in order to get the application site taken out of the Green Belt, the whole of "site 8" would have to be declassified, and hence be open to further development.

#### Speed Indication Device ("SID")

This is due to be installed on the verge opposite Upper Green on 25th October 2017. The SID will show the speed a driver is travelling at and if the vehicle is within the speed limit a smiley face, if above the speed limit a frowning face.

#### **East Herts District Plan Hearing**

An Inspector has now been appointed by the Secretary of State to examine the East Herts District Plan.

The hearings are now in progress and are available to watch via Live webcast on the East Herts Council website. For more information about the District Plan and the EiP and for a more detailed timetable visit www.eastherts.gov.uk/ districtplanexamination where you'll also find the link to the webcasts.

#### Parish Survey

Professor Martin Philip, University of Leicester and Professor Darren Smith from Loughborough University have been conducting a survey in Tewin since mid October comparing how rural places in UK, France and USA are changing in the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. They have selected Tewin because it was one of the villages in an academic study by the influential sociologist Ray Pahl in the early 1960s. The study is not being commissioned by any interest group or organisation and they aim to publish academic material from the survey as well as share a summary of the research with members of the case study villages.

The study will involve a questionnaire survey of a cross-section of residents in Tewin and will include questions on people's perceptions of the village, their reasons for living in the village, how they have transformed their homes, their use of local services, their cultural preferences and their perceptions of change in the countryside.

#### Herts & Middlesex Wildife Trust Apple Day and BBC's Countryfile at Tewin Orchard, 8 October and 12 October 2017

On the 5 November Countryfile is featuring the Hide at Tewin Orchard with some spectacular pictures of the badgers and atmospheric studies of the orchard in the autumn sunlight, including Bramley Seedling apples recorded falling to earth in slow motion. The BBC camera crew arrived just after we celebrated the Apple Day on Upper Green, all thanks to the kindness of Valerie Loughrey and the Pavilion Committee. This year's winner of the cider competition, the answer to which was A for the Herefordshire bottle, is Liz Keen of Watford who has also received a box of the Berkhamsted Hertfordshire variety Lane's Prince Albert apples with the flagon of cider as part of the prize. The Wildlife Trust staff put in a great effort to make the Apple Day a success and we have local Trust group members and other volunteers to thank for harvesting the crops. The Countryfile producer, Ruth Davies, was also very interested in Eileen Soper's Diaries and thought they deserved a programme of their own.

Thanks to Stephanie Marshall we have digitally transcribed them and edited them for publication. Eileen, who lived at Harmer Green and illustrated the Enid Blyton Famous Five books, has a big following in the USA and Japan as well as here and we are looking for an international publisher for the diaries, drawings and paintings. Her diaries are accounts of her badger watching and other natural history encounters between 1951 and 1986. Presenter Ellie Harrison was excellent, the badgers performed beyond the call of duty and the two visiting watchers were super, despite sharing the hide with a film crew. ### Team Vicar's Letter

Oscar the cat loves a threshold. At the top of the stairs, the front door, an open window, he sits or lies neither in nor out. He doesn't care if he trips you up. He doesn't care if the wind makes the house draughty and blows in the leaves. A threshold is a special place for a cat.

"I am the gate", says Jesus, "Whoever enters by me will be saved. I came that they may have life and have it abundantly" John 10: 9-10 Oscar sits on the threshold of my study door as I write this. It is a holy place.

#### <u>Tewin Community Transport Project</u> Update from the Steering Group - October 2017

We were very pleased to receive a £500 donation from the Friends of Tewin. This will be match funded by East Herts Council which means we have enough funds to continue until 31 March 2018.

The Saturday Community Minibus continues to run every week leaving Tewin at 9.30am and returning at 12.50pm. The Minibus takes a route via Welwyn North and WGC to Hertford and back. Every other Saturday the Minibus does an extra trip to Stevenage Town Centre leaving Tewin at 10.30am and returning at 13.45pm.

If you are disabled or otherwise need assistance you can be picked up at home with prior notice and subject to access. There is space for one wheelchair on the Minibus. Please discuss your needs when you book.

We are looking at trying to include Burnham Green residents so please get in touch if you live there or know anyone who does who might wish to come on board.

The Steering Group is considering how to extend the Service to other residents. At the moment the Minibus that is available is only suitable for adults or children over the age of 12 years. We know that this excludes parents with young children but we wish to change this for the future of the Service.

In the meantime we are looking at the needs of young people over 12 years who may wish to travel out of the village during the evening or at the weekend, and we would like to hear from them. We will be launching an online questionnaire soon in order to gather information.

The Fare is £4 Return or £2 One Way and it is half price for under 18s.

Please note that the Minibus will continue throughout the Autumn and Winter but there will be no Service on Saturday 30<sup>th</sup> December.
