TEWIN BURY FARM

Tewin Bury Farm were granted a license for outdoor music and sale of drink in the "Meadow Field" which is on the right as you go down Churchfield Road to the B1000. On Sunday 25th August they held a Farm Festival for one day only running from 10am until 3pm.

The Parish Council has agreed to works to repair the potholes in the Upper Green car park. The potholes at the entrance will also be filled in due course.

LITTER BINS

We are sorry that the litter bins are sometimes overflowing. They are usually emptied every Monday by East Herts, but sometimes we get missed out especially around Bank Holidays. It really doesn't help when they are filled up with pizza boxes etc after picnics as this rapidly fills up the bins.

Please be sensible as to what you put in the litter bins otherwise they overflow and cause a health hazard:

- Do not stuff large bags of rubbish in them as it leaves no room for genuine litter including dog poo bags
- Do not put waste food in the bins foxes will dig it out and spread litter all over the ground
- · Do not put household rubbish in litter bins.
- If you are having a picnic, please take your rubbish home with you.

NB: If your rubbish is going to fill the bin, then you should be taking it away with you.

HEDGES

Now that we are heading towards September and the birds have finished nesting, Tewin Parish Council would be grateful if all residents who have hedges on their land bordering a footpath or pavement would cut them back if they are overhanging or partially blocking the path.

COMMON RAGWORT

This is a common weed found throughout the British Isles however it is very toxic to horses and other livestock and can have potentially fatal consequences if ingested either in its green or dried state.

Under the Weeds Act 1959 the Secretary of State may serve an enforcement notice on the occupier of land on which injurious weeds are growing, requiring the occupier to take action to prevent the spread of injurious weeds. If you find you have it in your garden please put rubber gloves on and remove the plant and place it in the <u>black bin</u> to prevent livestock eating it.

Fragments of root will remain in the ground so new growth will have to be monitored and removed year after year.

On The Farm

After the last heavy storm, in the evening of July 15th, the following morning, I went out to see how the crops stood up to the heavy rain, fearing a lot of flattened oats and wheat. To my surprise all were still standing. Now let's get some decent weather & sunshine to ripen the crops. Most of my farmer friends started their harvest around the 20th of July, with winter barley and oilseed rape (OSR). I do not grow these crops, I grow naked oats, peas & winter wheat. Normally we harvest oats first then peas then winter wheat. This year the pace of ripening crops was unbelievable. July 29th was a lovely sunny day. We decided to look at the oats and found the oat head ripe, but the stem was still green- no good for harvesting, the stem has to be dry. Then we looked at the wheat on Lower Prairie Field - moisture 15 % -perfect it's ready to harvest. The pace of ripening this summer is unbelievable. We worked till dark, and harvested 65 acres of lovely wheat.

This summer I bought a Trailer Weigher, which means we know how many tons are in each trailer load. We have found it very interesting to know what each field yields. From Monday the 29th of July there were 5 very hot days. This hot weather ripened the oats. Naked oats are a funny crop to harvest, it's a slow job. At the end of the day we harvested the 42 acres. These Oats do not yield like wheat. We are paid a premium to grow them as they are very much in demand.

It was a joy to combine one of our new fields, called Airfield. The first results of the wheat quality show Hagberg (the weight of the grain) good, yields good, but our protein sample is not what we hoped for. It's early days yet, let's get the wheat in the barn dry, then have more tests done. We had light rain on Saturday 3rd of August, went to look at the peas and found them rattling in their pods. Another good day's Combining. At least they stood tall and were easy to combine. At the end of the day we had a pile of about 80 tons in our new barn. Our main grain store is for the rest of the wheat.

This summer I have been Yard man, mainly about the yard, helping to back the grain trailers into the store, tipping, taking samples of each load and pushing the grain up as high as possible in the store.

We finished Harvest on the 12th of August, the earliest for many a year, with a lovely crop.



Watching other people work, especially my husband, is an activity of great joy. I write this at my study desk from which I can see him through the window - back bent, arms flexed, pushing our monster of a lawn mower up and down, up and down. I wave cheerily as he passes. With the sweat running into his eyes, he doesn't wave back.

But before you feel too sorry for this hard done male of the species, he too finds joy in the efforts of others. In the run up to harvest this year, Bob, along with some other villagers who will remain nameless, got quite animated at the thought of watching the combine. So much so that Datchworth farmers, Pearman, were pestered about when the cutting would begin. On the afternoon the combine harvester appeared in the field at the back of the Rectory garden, Whatsapp messages started pinging and these friends downed their own tools ready for the spectacle of watching others at work. The comfiest chairs were brought to the end of the garden and a rather special bottle of English fizz was opened. Three men raising a glass to the farmers as they worked for hours in the 30 degree heat. Passing the spectators Dave Pearman hopped out of his tractor and called over the hedge - 'you can go off people, you know'.

It's easy to forget the hard work that goes into the food we enjoy, but harvest festival is a time when we celebrate all who produce our food, as well as giving thanks to God for the good things the earth provides.

Notes from an Apiary

June is gone and into July. You may have noticed a lack of notes from the Apiary in June, it was the June Gap. The beekeeping year does experience the phenomena of a June gap. It is the transition from spring flowers to the summer flowers and can be made significant by poor weather. Forage for the bees dries up. They will start to consume honey they have collected through the spring and our honey crop declines. We were getting warnings from the British Beekeepers Association to watch out and feed syrup if necessary. As I said in May, I don't like to put in sugar syrup feed so left them with enough honey to see them through the gap. It reduces the honey crop but ensures it is all from plant nectar. I think that is best.

We did take some honey crop in early June, and it has now all been sold by the Tewin Stores. Many thanks to the team at the stores and our loyal customers. We will try and crop again in late July, early August, all being well. To crop honey, we clear the "super" boxes of bees over a couple of days, then remove the boxes from the hives. Individual "frames" are "de-capped" placed in an extractor, essentially a centrifuge, and the honey spun out of the cells. An arm tiring business as the extractor we use is manual. The raw honey is filtered and allowed to settle then packed into new jars. We always use new jars for our honey, so we know they are perfectly clean and hygienic. Please keep an eye out for the Asian Hornet and the "Asian Hornet Watch" app. Three Asian Hornets have been captured and DNA testing shows they came from a nest identified in 2023. This does not mean they are "established" but they can get through a UK winter. So far this year some 15 sightings have been confirmed across the UK. Finally, I read that bees don't do well in space with Queens not producing sufficient viable eggs. The hypothesis is that they don't like high G forces during rocket launch. So how will we pollinate crops in space? That's the big question of the month.

News from Danesbury and the Queen Victoria Memorial Hospitals

As I write to you at the beginning of August summer has finally arrived - we have had both relentless pouring rain and now a couple of beautiful very hot days – too hot for some I expect.

In my last article I mentioned the stalls run by the Friends of Danesbury during the Welwyn Festival Week. I can now tell you that both Saturdays were very successful - our stall in the Street Market on the first Saturday raised £559 and that on Singlers Marsh at the end of the Festival raised £780. This is a tremendous achievement so thank you to everyone who donated toys and other gifts for us to sell, to those who came and bought and to the volunteers who put in such hard work working on the stalls on both days. The staff and patients at the two hospitals are so grateful.

Something that I wanted to tell you about this month are twiddle muffs. Some patients suffering from acquired neurological conditions or dementia become agitated – this can affect patients in either the Danesbury hospital or the OVM. It has been found that people with dementia and other neurological difficulties often have restless hands and it helps to have something to keep their hands occupied. Twiddle muffs are knitted with different colours and textures and with interesting additions including ribbons and buttons to provide a wonderful source of visual, tactile and sensory stimulation. They also keep hands warm and snug at the same time. Volunteers, staff and visitors have put their knitting skills to good use to help create more twiddle muffs for our patients. I have written before about the critically important contribution our volunteers make to our fund raising efforts. Nearly all our funds come from our charity shop in the High Street in Welwyn – this is managed and staffed by our commercial manager and her assistant and by Brian and Heather who must be two of the longest serving and best known shop staff in Welwyn. However, there is also a great deal of unseen work done by volunteers behind the scenes – accepting donations, sorting them into different categories of saleable items and pric-

ing donations, sorting them into different categories of saleable items and pricing them before they are displayed in the shop to be purchased. Some also help in the shop by selling behind the counter. Many of our valuable volunteers have been with us a long time and now we would very much like to see some new faces as volunteers.
