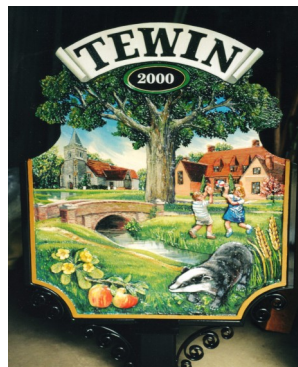

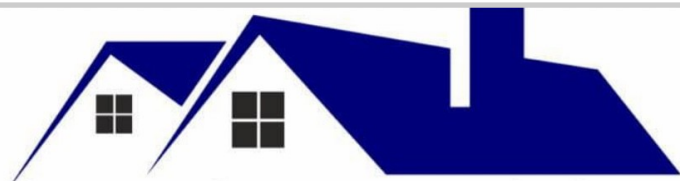

On 2nd October 1571 whilst carrying the coffin of Matthew Wall to his funeral in Braughing a pall bearer slipped on some leaves and dropped the coffin causing Matthew to be revitalised. On his death 20 years later he left a bequest to facilitate the clearing of leaves from Fleece Lane every 2nd of October. The vicar and children of the village sweep the lane with brooms and tend his grave.

On The Farm

Harvest seems to just come in a flash and went in a flash, a great looking crop of wheat, full of expectations, which when harvested did not come up to my expectation. At least the crop was dry, about 13/14% moisture and proteins about 10.5 %. I would have loved them at 12 to 13%, to make the milling grade. The crop lacked sunshine. This seems to be countrywide, of very mixed reports. Luckily the oats and peas have done well, good quality and yields.

There has been great demand for straw this summer. My friend who buys our straw has done a great job of getting the straw baled and carted straight away, leaving the fields ready to be ploughed or mini tilled with our Sumo Cultivator. This leaves Martyn and Chris free to get on with ploughing and cultivating, after they each had a week's holiday.

We now have planned next year's cropping, very much the same. Once you harvest your crops and clear the straw the land soon dries out and cultivations get harder as the sun just bakes the soil hard.

The seed wheat is now dressed by a company called Agrii. They take the small seeds out and treat the remainder to protect it from disease. As of today's date, the 14th of September, most land is ready for sowing the seeds but we will not start for another 10 days or so. Why is this? It's because we don't want the crop to be too advanced growing into the winter.

We have sold a few loads of wheat, as there has been demand in the north, as they can be a couple of weeks later than us, with the weather being more unsettled and wet than us.

Dealing with UK power networks for our new electricity supply to our new farm barn is a major problem. Let's hope it can be sorted soon. It seems to have been going on for months.

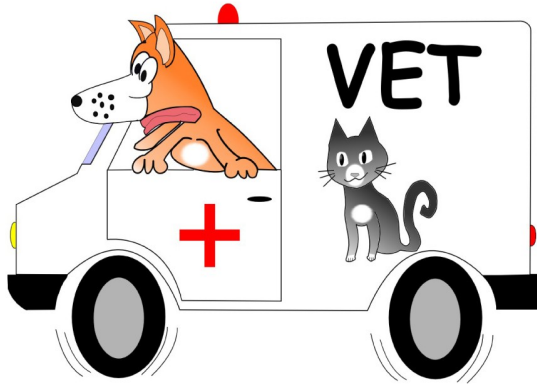

I have to admit that prayer does not seem to be in that category. It can feel like being on the end of a dead phone line.

Much prayer seems to be lots of words asking God to do something. He is asked for this, that and the other just to remind him in case he has overlooked or forgotten something important to me or people I know and needs to get it sorted. Or, he has not done exactly what we, or I, want in the way we want it and needs to be put on the right track, ready for the next request.

Perhaps I need him to forgive me for something I did or said which offended one of my neighbours or friends when in fact only the neighbour or friend can forgive me, if I am brave enough to apologise.

It must be confusing. The Russians pray for victory at the same time as the Ukrainians pray to repel the invaders. So, is prayer a waste of time? Well, if I am only asking, never thanking, listening, thinking or quietly reflecting, perhaps, yes.

Surely, God is not there just to do the things we are too busy to do or too lazy to do, or which are difficult, unpleasant or inconvenient. He gives those tasks to us.

If prayer works, it changes us. I cannot imagine that it changes God.

Team Vicar's Letter

The nights are drawing in, which makes it a good season for star gazing. We have had some spectacular night skies this year, with the rare occurrence of the aurora borealis, super moons, and the (strangely red) blue moon. There is something about the sky that, since ancient times, has drawn people to contemplate the deep mysteries of existence – of life and love and longing.

In ancient times people saw the small glimmering lights as a glimpse into the heavens. Now, we might have less of an idea of a physical heaven being ‘up there’, but still the majesty of the galaxies that surround us stir many hearts to ponder our place within it all.

“When I look at your heavens, the work of your fingers” says the writer of Psalm 8 “the moon and the stars that you have established, what are human beings that you are mindful of them, mortals that you care for them”

Professor Alistair McGrath is both a physicist and theologian. It was while he was working in the laboratories of Oxford University for his doctorate in biophysics that he found his study of the makeup of the universe led his mind, like the psalmist, to ponder further on the meaning of it all. In the patterns and shapes of the smallest molecules, and in the uncovering of the deepest workings of the universe McGrath saw the hand of a creator. “We need to raise our eyes” he says “and see the meaning that lies behind it all. For things of this world are but signs and pointers, and we must let them lead us to their source”.

Look up, whisper the towers and spires of our churches, look up.

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

September is the month in which we traditionally celebrate Harvest. We know from last month's *On the Farm* notes in this magazine that Ivor managed to finish Harvest on 12th August, with a good crop and the earliest for many years. So for us to celebrate this at the very end of September seem a bit past the event. Nevertheless it has been the main focus for Messy Church, which began again on the 15th, and for the main congregation on 29th. Thank you to everyone who has given dried or tinned goods for our Harvest services which will be taken to the Food Shed in Stevenage.

The Bike N Hike Day took place across Beds and Herts on 14th September when energetic souls ask for sponsorship to ride or walk around churches in the diocese. This is in aid of the Beds and Herts Historic Churches Trust. Thank you to David Rawlins – half of his sponsorship money goes to the charity and the other half to St Peter's for essential repairs. We are still waiting for a date to start the repairs to the damp in the north wall and new drainage. This is going to cost the church over £20,000 so such monies will go towards that work.

We are still trying to agree with the diocese and other heritage organisations where we might site a new meeting room for the church. We are now working with the Diocesan Advisory Committee and Historic England. Ours is a special Grade I listed building and we all want to find a solution to this which will enhance the existing building and meet the spiritual needs of the congregation and community.

Meanwhile thank you to Mr Down who kindly repaired the long bench in front of the church. It is a marvellous job which means the seat should last for many more years. We have at last found a contractor to help reseat the fallen gravestone on the south side of the church. The church clock has had the odd hiccup in its working recently – fortunately we have chaps who can deal with that. All these things keep us busy.

You may have noticed the bells ringing on days other than Wednesday -the normal practice night- or Sunday mornings. Obviously we also ring the bells for weddings and other special events. Ours is a very popular set of church bells as we have six, and other bell ringers like to visit us to ring our bells, consequently we often receive requests from other groups. Indeed, on 5 October the County Association has asked to use our bells for a teaching session at Tewin, which may last all day.

Susannah has been on her hols this month and we have welcomed other visiting clergy to lead our services. We are just about managing to cover the many jobs which Pete Johnson has gamely carried out until her move up north. Working parties will be gathering fallen leaves soon. Several trees in the churchyard need to be pruned and we have noticed that some are dying. The inconsistent weather patterns we have experienced in recent years is clearly having an impact.

In October we shall start to think about services for Remembrance Sunday and All Saints in November, and then it will be Advent and Christmas before we can look about.

If you have lost loved ones recently, or are in poor health or spirits, please remember the Welwyn team of clergy are there to give support.

Notes from an Apiary

September, summer is passing into Autumn and the beekeeping year goes on. The Spring crop was sparse and by July it looked like a very poor year for honey crop, then it all happened at once. It seemed like one day there was no nectar about, then it arrived and kept coming. The nectar flow coincided with the Lime trees flowering, a bit later this year. On sunny days in July, you could hear the bees on the Lime trees of Lower Green, they sounded like a swarm as they feasted on the nectar. The honey from this nectar is a light amber with a yellow, faint greenish tinge. Our crop certainly had that aspect to it. Sweet, slightly spicy, with a fresh citrus taste. It is in Tewin Stores now, get some and see what you think.

The number of bees in the colony increase through Spring and Summer, reaching a peak in August. There could be about 40 to 50 thousand bees in each of our hives at peak. The colony numbers will now decline as the Queens' laying decreases and older bees die. Bees from eggs laid in Autumn will form the hive force for next Spring, lasting through to March. They will protect the Queen through winter, forage early flowers and raise the new Spring brood before dying off. They will have done their job and passed on responsibility to the new generation.

Our responsibility is to ensure the colony remains healthy through the year. Part of this is to minimise infestation, particularly by Varroa. We treat the colonies with a thymol-based medicine to control Varroa mites, a bee parasite. Thymol is a natural substance that kills varroa mites in bee hives by binding to nerve receptors in the mites. The vapour from the thymol must be strong enough to kill the mites but low enough not to harm the bees. This is why we use a proprietary, registered veterinary medicine. Treatment will be on the hives for four weeks, to cover the life cycle of the mites. We can only maintain a healthy colony by minimising mite numbers.

Tomatoes are pollinated by "buzz pollination". Bumble bees can buzz pollinate, honeybees cannot. You won't see any of our bees on your tomato plants.

Our preparations for Winter and next Spring are starting now. Where did the summer go?
