PRECEPT

At their meeting on 2nd December 2024 the Parish Council reviewed the precept options for the Financial Year Ending 31.3.2026 and in accordance with the Financial Regulations of the Council they unanimously agreed to increase the precept by 14.5% from £38,000 to £43,500 to accommodate inflation rises and ongoing annual parish tree works.



Notes from an Apiary

On a wet Sunday morning, 1st December, I look out and reflect on the bee keeping year.

The bees expanded in spring giving us five good colonies. I think we did a good job in controlling swarming, but the Spring harvest was feeble. Why? A worry, then reassurance that all local beekeepers were in the same boat. The "drought" of nectar continued until mid-July with great forage from Lime resulting in a good summer crop. September preparation for overwintering, particularly ensuring the hives are watertight and well ventilated. Mouse Guards are in place to prevent small mammals getting into a cosy spot and netting to discourage woodpeckers from drilling into a feast of honey and bees. The cold is not a problem to bees, but dampness will harm the colony. Ending the year with cleaning, repairing any damaged hives and setting up for next year. One very important activity is planning a second treatment to reduce Varroa mites, a cold job for deepest winter. What are our bees up to just now? Not a lot. They have worked themselves to death, literally, over the summer to build stores and a strong colony of bees to take the colony through winter. There will be around 10,000 bees in a good colony over winter. The cold weather stops the Queen laying and there will be little if any brood in the colonies. At this time of year there is no forage so the only reason for bees to leave the hive is on "cleansing" flights. The main objective for the workers is to keep the Queen warm. The bees will be in a ball with the Queen at the centre, keeping her at a cosy 35 Celsius.

We look forward to the next cycle in our beekeeping journey. What will 2025 bring? We will be thinking through our plans and what we need to do to continue to support the bees we are responsible for.

I hope you have found reading these notes from an Apiary of mild interest. And anyone who has invested in our honey, that you have enjoyed it. To anyone who would like to try, it is available from Tewin Stores. To end the year we would like to send you all our best wishes for the festive season.

Saturday Recitals in St Mary's Welwyn on 11 January at 12 noon

On Saturday 11 January we have an instrument we have not so far heard in three years of monthly recitals – the saxophone - when **Rob Burton** will be accompanied on the piano by **Mark Rogers**. Rob Burton won the Woodwind Category Final of *BBC Young Musician 2018* and went on to secure a place in the Grand Final at Birmingham's Symphony Hall, where he was concerto soloist with the City of Birmingham Symphony Orchestra.

Since then Rob has been a soloist with some of the UK's leading orchestras, including the Britten Sinfonia and Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra as well as performing at prestigious international festivals, including Cheltenham, Harrogate, and the Oundle International Festival. Featured as one of Classic FM's 'Stars of Tomorrow', he has performed in prestigious venues including Wigmore Hall, St John's Smith Square, St James' Piccadilly, Buckingham Palace and Windsor Castle.

Rob previously studied Classical Saxophone on a full scholarship at the Royal Academy of Music with Huw Wiggin, and, while a scholarship holder at the Junior Guildhall School of Music, he was Principal Saxophone with the National Youth Wind Orchestra of Great Britain. He has recently completed his Masters degree at the Zürich University of the Arts in the renowned class of professor Lars Mlekusch, and began the prestigious Advanced Diploma degree at the Royal Academy of Music in September 2024.

These concerts are free to attend, with a collection afterwards to provide artists' fees and support the church's work to introduce youngsters to singing and music generally.

The doors are always open.


Messy Church
