HELP US LOOK AFTER THE VILLAGE GREEN AND VERGES

It has been a particularly wet year which has made grass areas vulnerable and the grass along the edges of Lower Green has been worn down by vehicular traffic.

Whilst the green will rejuvenate itself when the grass begins to grow we would be very grateful if in the mean time everyone could help us by being careful not to drive over the edge of the green or grass verges.

HIGHWAYS WORKS

Godfries Close Footpath Patching Works – These have been completed except for the twitchel path between Harwood and Godfries Closes and works are scheduled for March 2025.

Give Way Sign at Holly Bushes – This has been purchased and attached to the existing post.

Boundary Signs – These are scheduled to be replaced in March 2025

TREE WORKS

Queen Hoo Lane – An Ash tree on the verge outside Highfields, which is Common Land, has dropped a large branch and the Parish Council has been advised that it needs to be removed. Traffic management will be in place when the works are carried out.

HEDGES

It's time to cut back your garden vegetation shrubs, hedges and trees in time for spring. The main breeding season for nesting birds usually runs throughout March to August, so please think now about trimming any vegetation which may be overhanging public roads, footways and footpaths in time for spring. If you have not signed up for an East Herts garden waste bin, you can take cut back vegetation to one of the HCC recycling centres.

Notes from an Apiary

With a rare dry January day, cold but blue skies it's an opportunity to see how the bees are getting along and apply an "oxalic acid "treatment to reduce the number of Varroa mites in the colony. Last year we had very low Varroa counts and I think that is a result of our Integrated Pest Management Plan (IPM). Winter application of oxalic acid solution is an important part of our IPM.

The image below shows the Varroa mite on bees:



In fact two bees with mites (rust coloured dots) sitting on the thorax, a problem in the hive as it would indicate a high mite count. The mites won't kill the colony but the viruses they transmit could quickly lead to colony collapse. Back to our action plan. A lovely dry day so on we go. We need our oxalic acid solution. To make this we prepare a 1to1 sugar solution

(100g sugar in 100ml water) when we have this, we dissolve sufficient oxalic acid in the syrup to make up a 3.2% solution. Care is needed in this preparation as oxalic acid presents its own hazards. We can then carefully pour this into a special "applicator". Now to the bees. As they are netted to keep woodpeckers off we need to remove the nets. Then the roof and cover board, exposing the colony. It's important to work quickly as we don't want to chill the colony. Our applicator helps this as we can easily apply a 5ml dose to each "seam" of bees. Once done replace the cover board, roof and netting. When I applied the treatment this year, I found that four of our five colonies were in a strong state with plenty of bees in the nest. However, one had not survived the early winter. Plenty of stores but no viable bees. It is hard to see this and difficult to know why, possibly just a weak or small colony not able to withstand the cold snaps we have had.

All in all it's satisfying to have executed this step in our plan. I know that we have four colonies that look in good shape, so far, never counting the "chickens". The hive with the expired colony has now been cleared from the apiary and will be cleaned up. We will sanitize the hive parts just in case there was some underlying disease that caused the failure.

It's winter but always something for the beekeeper to do.

Interesting fact, when Queen Elizabeth II died in 2022, the royal beekeeper tied a black ribbon, in a bow to each of her hives and requested that the bees stay put with a promise that their new master would treat them well.

British Summer Time



There are several outbreaks of Avian influenza (bird flu) in wild birds and domestics flocks across the UK at present.

The health risk to the general public is very low, however it is important to follow advice to stay safe and help prevent the spread of bird flu.

Wild birds

If possible, do not touch or handle wild birds or their droppings.

If you find dead wild birds, you can report finding them to the Department for Environment, Food & Rural Affairs (DEFRA). Keep your distance from wild birds as much as possible – aim to stay at least 2 metres away if you can. There are some steps which you can follow to reduce the risks:

Keep the bird outside - do not bring it into your house or an enclosed space.

Wear clothing that will stop you being injured by scratches or bites (trousers and long sleeves) and disposable gloves and eye protection (for example, goggles or glasses).

Wash clothing and eye protection after use.

Dispose of gloves by putting them in a plastic bag, tying a knot in the bag and then placing in an outside bin.

If possible, wear a surgical face mask or a multi-layered cloth face covering (which should be washed after use).

If you take the bird to a vet or animal welfare organisation or similar, phone ahead and follow their instructions about taking the bird to them.

If you take the bird in a vehicle, put it as far from you as possible in a secure ventilated box, and keep the windows open while travelling.

Dispose of any disposable items that have or may have been contaminated by the bird, by putting in a bag, sealing the bag and disposing in your outdoor bin.

Use disinfectant wipes to clean any surfaces that cannot be disposed of that have or may have been contaminated by the bird.

Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water.

Disposal of dead wild birds in household or municipal waste bins If you choose to dispose of a dead wild bird with your household or munici-

pal waste, you should:

Pick it up wearing disposable gloves or a plastic bag over your hand.

Put the bird in a plastic bag and tie it - make sure the bird does not touch the outside of the bag.

Put the bag containing the bird in a second (preferably leak proof) plastic bag, along with the gloves or plastic bag you used to pick it up and tie it take care not to touch the outside of the gloves with bare hands.

Put the tied bag in your outside household or municipal waste bin.

Wash your hands thoroughly with soap and water.

How are you? Now, how are you really? That's a small phrase that one member of the congregation tends to use. Or you could join with a friendly bunch from your local church community as we gather weekly during Lent for food, learning and discussion on the subject 'How people pray'. Each week the churches in the Welwyn Team will dip into a different Christian spiritual tradition (Franciscan, Ignatian, Prayer Book, Celtic, Charismatic) and learn from their wisdom how God might be encountered anew.

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

It is good to get January and February out of the way. The snowdrops started to appear in the churchyard at the end of January, which always brings a smile to my face. Thank you to Gerry Murphy and David Rawlins who organised the first bi-monthly working party of the year in the churchyard. The Memorial Garden in particular looks splendid now with all the leaves and debris tidied away. It is always lovely to see how many people enjoy the churchyard in family groups or just walking their dogs. Our next working party will be on Saturday 8th March. Do come along to help, there is always plenty to do and all are welcome.

Susannah was on jury service for the last week in January and the first in February. But she was still around at the weekends and in the office at St Mary's, Welwyn to take bookings for special events in our lives, such as weddings and baptisms. If you live in the village, you automatically have a qualification to be married, baptised or to have your funeral at St Peter's. The Clergy Surgery is open at St Mary's every Saturday morning from 10-11am.

Also at St Mary's, we have been enjoying a free concert, usually on the second Saturday in every month. These are becoming more and more popular and are very good. The church requests a donation which pays for the musicians and the rest goes to church funds.

The Parochial Church Council (PCC) met in January to review the work of the church, its funds and its state of repairs, and to look forward to the events in the church calendar for the first half of the year. Among other things we agreed to the expenditure for repair of the downpipe on the north wall, and to placing a new shed on the base in the churchyard where one existed until it was burnt down some years ago. We now just have to get permission from the diocese for this. At present many church items, that are not used very often, are stored in people's garages, lofts and spare rooms and at other church buildings in the Welwyn Team.

Looking forward to March, we shall have our normal services of Holy Communion at 9.30am on the 1st, 2nd and 4th Sundays in the month, and Morning Prayer at 9.30am on the 3rd Sunday. Messy Church is at 3pm on the 3rd Sunday, followed by a 6.30pm service of Holy Communion. There will be a special service on **Ash Wednesday morning** (5th March) at 10am for the laying on of ashes at the beginning of Lent. This is a solemn service with time for reflection at a time when we remember Christ fasting in the wilderness, and some of us give up eating chocolate for example, to commemorate this.

If you need support, have lost loved ones recently, or are in poor health or spirits, please remember the Welwyn team of clergy are always there for you.


