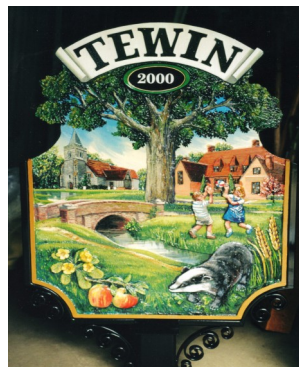

3/25/1999/PIP - Land To The North Of 3 Fairholme Stables, Archers Green Lane, Tewin

Permission in principle for erection of three detached dwellings

Tewin Parish Council has objected to this application as it is contrary to the East Herts 2018 District Plan, the short timescales extending over the holiday period, the apparent lack of onsite notices and our limited ability to publicise this application to local residents. Tewin Parish Council referred planning to comments made by residents against the original application on the Fairholme Stables site 3/20/0810/FUL.

SPEED MANAGEMENT STRATEGY SURVEY

Hertfordshire County Council (HCC) are updating the Speed Management Strategy which provides a consistent approach to setting speed limits in Hertfordshire. The Speed Management Strategy provides the benchmark against which HCC decides on how new speed limits are set, as well as deciding on whether physical road calming measures are required and which would be appropriate. HCC receive several hundred requests each year from residents and stakeholders to reduce speed limits. Each request is assessed against the Speed Management Strategy to determine whether a reduction is appropriate. They would like hear your views on current speed limits in the county, as well as understanding and developing the processes the County Council should follow for setting new speed limits.

This survey should take around 5-10 minutes to complete and is open until **11.59pm on Monday 16 February 2026.**

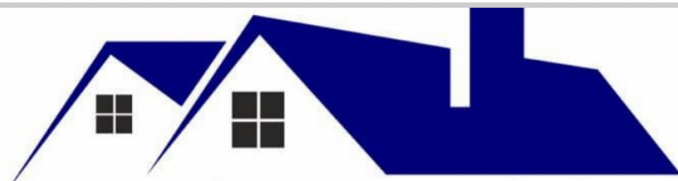
Notes From An Apiary

The start of a new year and the anticipation of what our bees will bring to us in 2026. We have had some cold days over the last couple of months with deep frost. These have been followed by warmer, usually wetter spells. Cold dry days are no problem for our bees; they can survive much lower temperatures than we see in the south of England. Cold wet times make it difficult for the cluster of bees to maintain temperature and causes moisture and dampness to build up in the hive, a challenge to the colony and a possible cause of colony collapse. Modern hive design takes this into account and provides adequate ventilation.

Modern hive design can be traced back to the early 19th century in Europe. The designs were from trial and error. Reverend Lorenzo Lorraine Langstroth was able to take these designs and develop the concept of Bee Space, a discovery already used in European hives. The discovery was that a gap of a $\frac{1}{4}$ to $\frac{3}{8}$ of an inch would not be closed by the bees. Smaller and it is sealed up with propolis, bee cement, greater and it is filled with wax comb. Thus, designing a hive that incorporated this concept allowed for hives to have easily removable internal parts, frames. Because frames could be easily and gently removed from the hive the bees could be inspected without enraging the colony. Langstroth developed multi layered hives and a method for ensuring the Queen was excluded from the upper layers. The upper layers or supers are used by bees to store honey. Excluding the queen ensures that the cells stay free from brood and are filled with honey. This makes harvesting much more practical.

The Reverend Lorenzo Lorraine Langstroth died on October 6, 1895, in his church pulpit, just as he was beginning a sermon on the love of God. His discoveries live on.

Our first event of the year is always the **Seniors' Lunch** at the Memorial Hall, where anyone over the age of 60 and living in Tewin was invited to join us for a two-course meal. We were delighted to host the Lunch on 18th February. The Memorial Hall once again resounded to the sound of laughter and chatter as just under 100 residents enjoyed their meal. They were put to the test though with a light-hearted quiz and the event ended with tea/coffee and chocolates.

The traditional village **Maypole Dancing** came next on 2nd May which we ran in conjunction with Tewin Cowper school. It was a lovely spring morning and the children from Otter Class, Year 3, danced around the Maypole on Lower Green and surprised us all by finishing with a beautiful song. Something to live up to for 2026!

This was closely followed by the **VE Day 80th Anniversary Commemorations**, announced by the Government to be held over the May Bank Holiday. Unfortunately, the lovely weather we'd had for the Maypole wasn't to be and Monday 5th May proved to be rather wet but, luckily, by 2pm the rain had

stopped and we were able to go ahead with the Village Picnic on Lower Green. Not too many picnics were in evidence but our hot tea and coffee and our delicious home-made cakes went down well and the children enjoyed some good old-fashioned fun - egg and spoon races, sack races etc!!

Our biggest event, however, is the **Tewin Classic Car and Craft Show** which in 2025 was on 17th August and the weather was at its best. Upper Green was at capacity with Classic Cars, and the public came in their droves. It was a wonderful day and I am delighted to say that we made a profit of just over £9,000 which is in the process of being distributed to any 'not for profit' group, club, organisation, school in Tewin to help them with the work they do within the Community.

On Sunday, 9th November Catriona Griggs laid a wreath on behalf of us all during the Remembrance Service at St Peter's Church.

Sadly, the weather didn't favour us for our last event, **Carols around the Christmas Tree**, on 18th December. Plan B came into force as we all gathered in Tewin Cowper School's hall where we were warm and dry. The brass band livened us up with our favourite Carols and I'm sure the mulled wine, together with the hot chocolate, mince pies and sausage rolls, helped with the singing! Our grateful thanks go to Tewin Cowper School for the use of the Hall.

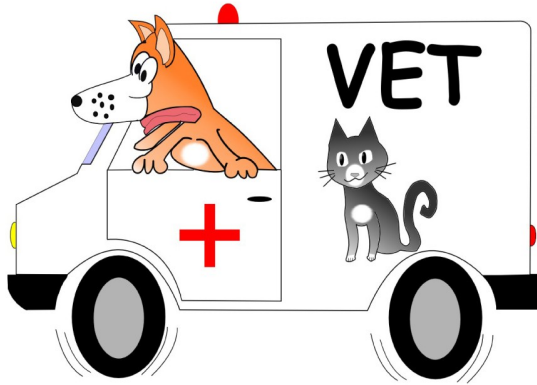

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

There was one day in January when it was so cold outside on the day I went to the church to set the timers for the heating and lighting for the week, that I actually found it felt warmer inside the church than out!! As I left, the snow started to fall and it looked like it was set in for the day, but ten minutes later, it stopped. I have had pictures of heavy snow in Warsaw, all across Europe and of course everywhere north of here. The blue skies, rain and sun and mild temperatures since that very cold spell are unseasonable for January. The bulbs are waking up too early. The church flowers, the nativity scene, and the tree remain in the church until Candlemas at the beginning of February. A special service to celebrate Candlemas will take place at St Mary's Welwyn at 6.30pm on 1st February. And then we shall be rushing towards Lent which starts on Ash Wednesday on 18th February, after Pancake Day (17th February) when we propose to organise a race between 3 villages on Burnham Green.

As usual we hope to run a Lent course. This year it will be with All Saints Datchworth and will take place for five weeks on Fridays at noon at the Datchworth Church Hall from 27th February. The theme this year is "Mission".

New year, new beginnings. You may have wondered if the church was still trying to get permission for a new meeting room close to our Grade 1 listed ancient church. It is a bit like walking through treacle but we are plodding on. We have now accepted quotes for two essential surveys before any new designs may be considered. These are for a topographical survey of where things are in the ground for example, ancient graves, and for a tree survey to see where the roots of trees planted near the church may be a problem for a new building. After those have been done our new architect will produce a couple of new designs for the PCC to look at and for us to share with the village. Meanwhile we have a minor conundrum – the East Herts Planners have refused planning permission for a shed where a shed used to be in the church yard,. It burnt down many years ago and we have used the base more recently for bonfires. We have many items scattered in

corners of the church and in people's garages and spare bedrooms which are used from time to time but would be better housed in a building close to the church. Curiously, the church authorities by contrast, have granted a faculty (permission) for the shed, and Historic England, who can be difficult, also raised no objections, nor did the Parish Council or any Tewin residents. So now we must go back to the planners and reapply trying to fit in with some of the points made in the refusal or appeal to the Secretary of State. It is one step forward and two back. If you would like to support the church in this endeavour, please send me or David Rawlins, rawlins31@btinternet.com, a letter to go with our latest effort.

Our collection from Christmas services was over £400 and will be split between two different charities – the Children's Society and Resolve, which is a local charity in Welwyn Garden City helping people with problems with addiction. This month the PCC has met to review a number of policy documents with a special focus on Safeguarding in the church.

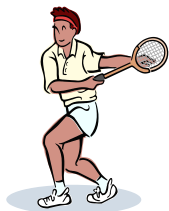

Tewin Tennis Club

No sooner do I write last month's Tewin Magazine missive than we are hit by a weather bomb. For the best part of two weeks in early January the courts were hardly in use. A mixture of ice and/or rain put paid to play for a longer period than any of us could remember.

Personally, I am happy to make an early call to stay home and drink another cup of coffee, but even chairman Mike, with his trusted tennis ball machine, was deterred.

Such was the desperation for a match that the Saturday morning crowd almost decamped to Gosling for a match indoors, but the reality of trekking over to Welwyn Garden City, together with the significant cost of the court rental, didn't drum up enough support.

Maybe we are the victim of our own successful fiscal policy. Our courts are owned by the Parish Council, and our membership fees are largely aimed at covering the current and future costs of the upkeep and periodic replacement of the courts, plus other incidentals and social event costs. We are, of course, run entirely by volunteers.

Before moving here 24 years ago, I'd been playing at Harpenden Lawn Tennis and Croquet Club (which like Alexander Boris de Pfeffel Johnson, reinvented itself. Harpenden LTC seemed less posh to the proletariat). Mind you, the fees are still posh. The annual membership at my old club is now £490 for an adult, plus a £250 joining fee.

My son still plays there, gets high quality league and friendly matches every week and reckons it represents fair value for money. Compared with pickleball, padel or golf I am sure he's right.

But Tewin Tennis Club is purposely kept as affordable as possible, with last year's fees set at just £50 for adults and £15 for juniors. I am guessing members could afford to pay for the occasional foray to Gosling but it may take some forward planning. Food for thought.

Enough of my wittering. Please make sure you put the date of the AGM in your diary now, Friday 27 March, in the pavilion by the tennis courts.

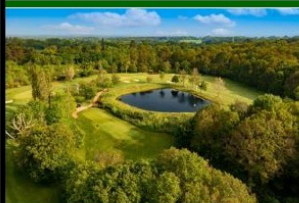

That evening I mashed the tatties and bashed the neeps and put the haggis in the oven as per the advice from Smithfield – no need to prick the skin, it's porous. At the appointed hour with the guests seated and awaiting the arrival of the chef with the haggis to be admired and addressed I opened the oven door to be greeted with an almighty bang and an explosion of haggis. All over me, the wall, the ceiling – weeks later we were still finding bits of haggis in the kitchen. The haggis from the local butcher was not encased in a porous skin but in plastic which should have been pricked to relieve the pressure. As I said earlier, we were young, there was enough haggis from Smithfield to go round and enough whisky and McEwan's Export to be shared and enough friends to help with the clean-up – once they'd stopped laughing.
