As some of you know, acting as a mediator takes up a part of my professional life. What I often say to parties in dispute, who ask me to help them negotiate a settlement, is that if the process is to be successful there is one golden rule that it's wise to bear in mind. Both sides have to give something up.

Ouch! For some people that's really difficult and challenging, and I can see it written all over their faces. You mean I have to give something up?' Yes. As John Kennedy used to say: We cannot negotiate with those who say, 'What's mine is mine, and what's yours is negotiable'. Giving something up can be very painful indeed. It may require courage, or self-discipline, or frankly thinking more about somebody else's interest than I do about my own.

Shortly we'll be entering the period of Lent - the prelude to Easter, during which we traditionally try to 'give something up'. The idea is that we are trying to follow in some way the great sacrifice of Jesus, which is the key and the heart of the Christian faith. Here was Jesus 'giving up everything' for us, and Lent is the time for making a response in our turn. The tougher our self-denial, the more valuable it is likely to be, if it enables us to get a grip on some aspect of our life that we would prefer to be different.

What might any of us 'give up' this Lent that could make a real and lasting difference to our life - or better still, to someone else's life?

## Churchwardens' Notes

It was good to see the church full for the Carol Service, the Crib Service and Midnight Mass and so many children and grown ups at the Christingle Service. This year the Christingle Service was immediately preceded by the Children's Activity Morning where the children made their own Christingle and painted and glittered a marvellous array of decorations for the Christmas tree in the porch. Many thanks to the army of adults who made this possible and to Ivor Williams for providing the tree.

Many thanks to Rosemary and the choir for their contribution to the Carol Service and the Choral Evensongs on the first Sunday of each month. They work so hard practicing and their voices really do enhance the services.

During the recent bitterly cold weather the heating has been on for an inordinately long time prior to each service without really making much difference to the temperature inside. All we can do now is to remind you to wear extra layers and please try to keep the doors shut as much as possible.

We had another visit from the architect in January to check up on the final stages of the work high-lighted by the quinquennial inspection last year. We have decided to leave the decoration of the new plaster in the porch and the toilet until the spring, but hope to re-instate the notice board in the porch and the hand rail in the toilet sooner than that. There is still some work to be done to the window above the north door, to replace cracked panes of glass.

We have made a start on clearing out the cellar where the old heating boiler used to be and got rid of a substantial number of old heating pipes. This has provided sufficient storage space for the excess items from the Christmas Market.

One piece of late news has recently come to hand. The sum of £160 was raised by the sponsored Bike 'N Hike event held in September in aid of the Historic Churches Trust. Once again our thanks go to all those who took part as bikers, hikers, sponsors and providers of refreshments on the day.

At the time of writing these notes, the final details for the Lent Courses still have to be finalised so please watch out for notices in the porch and in the pew slips. There will be a service of Holy Communion at St.Peter's on Ash Wednesday evening at 8pm taken by Diane Whittaker to mark the start of Lent.

#### PAVILION REFURBISHMENT

At its meeting in early December, the Parish Council agreed to go ahead with the full-scale refurbishment of the Pavilion on Upper Green.

#### PRESS RELEASE FROM HERTFORDSHIRE HIGHWAYS Re GRITTING

As from Monday 11 January Highways will be operating a reduced salting/gritting network as advised by the Government. Highways has developed the reduced network plans in consultation with the Police, Fire and Ambulance services and have ensured that the main bus depots and hospitals are part of this reduced network. Information about the change has been loaded onto

www.hertsdirect.org/salting, put out by Press Release and by interview on local radio, and circulated to MPs and key partners. The duration of the recent cold weather period was a major cause of the difficulties. We have been working virtually continuously since 15th of December – twice as long as last February, and the coldest period for nearly 30 years (1981/82). Although the resupply system has been poor, and has not fulfilled the commitments made following last winter, the extent and severity of the cold weather would have caused major problems regardless of any failings in it.

## Re REFUSE COLLECTION

Waste Collection should now be running according to the current schedule available thewebsite onwww.eastherts.gov.uk and click on Alternate Refuse Colnately due to the severe weather refuse, recycling or sites. Your nearest site can be found on our website. garden waste was not collected from East Herts'

homes on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday (Jan 6-Jan 9). Our website was continually updated last week indicating that the service had been suspended, but we were not able to provide further detail until it became clear when conditions would improve. Following an assessment on Monday morning (Jan 11), all collection services were resumed, although there will be some locations that are still difficult to access. While it is sometimes possible to 'catch up' if there is disruption for a day or two, or if only parts of the district are affected, our contractor simply does not have the resources to make the 64,000 collections that were missed last week and undertake this week's collections. This is exacerbated by the additional Christmas waste being collected meaning that resources are already stretched. The Council usually undertakes 160,000 collections per fortnight. These are carried out by a fleet of 20 vehicles and crews. Having considered all available options, collections this week will be those planned for this week only, as detailed in households' existing calendar. We fully understand residents will be disappointed that, in some cases, they will need to wait a further two weeks for their missed collection (either refuse or recycling depending upon which was missed last week). To help communicate the reasons for the delay the following 'frequently asked questions' / answers are being put on our website this week.

- Q. Why can't you come back and collect my waste this week? A. Our contractor is resourced to collect every day. We don't have the resources to collect the missed four days. Any spare resources we have (for breakdowns etc) are being used to collect the excess Christmas waste.
- **Q.** Why can't you collect at weekends? A. We are already collecting on Saturdays to catch up for the Christmas bank holidays. Waste disposal sites are not open on Sundays and we would therefore have nowhere to take the waste.
- Q. Why could the refuse crews not operate during the snow? A. We have to take a view about whether it is safe for the public and staff to operate services. Vehicles weigh 26 tonnes and are lethal in icy conditions. Although primary roads were gritted estate roads and most pavements were not. Handling heavy bins and boxes on icy pavements can be hazardous for collection staff.
- Q. What can I do with my waste / recycling until the next collection day? A. Your waste can be stored outside PRESS RELEASE FROM EAST HERTS COUNCIL in bags and presented at the next collection day. We will collect excess bagged side waste at the next collection.
- Q. Is storing my waste a health hazard? A. The outside temperatures are lower than your fridge at the moment. If possible keep the waste away from pests. If you have any lections, then click on ARC Collection Information (from concerns or have nowhere to store the excess waste, it can Nov 09) and the click on Refuse and Recycling Schedule be taken to your local Household Waste Recycling Centre.
