The Church's calendar this month is almost entirely devoted to the season of Lent. Customarily, Lent is the time when we are urged to give things up: to avoid the temptation to indulge ourselves in those pleasures which at all other times of the year we take for granted. This practice is designed to enable us to identify with Jesus who spent 40 days and 40 nights in the wilderness, during which time he was tempted by Satan to use his status as the Son of God to exercise power and dominion over the entire world. Jesus resisted the temptation and said "Away with you Satan!" How many of us, I wonder, will have the strength of will to say "Away with you Satan!" when confronted with the things that give us pleasure but which we've vowed to sacrifice for the Lenten season? For the Christian, Lent is also the time to identify mentally and spiritually with Jesus' passion, the period that culminated in the ultimate sacrifice of his own life for the salvation of all people. Yet following his passion and death was his resurrection to new life at Easter and this new life for all is the Christian hope.

In more recent times there appears to have been somewhat of a shift in emphasis from giving things up for Lent to taking things on - something extra to our usual round of activities. It still requires discipline but it's seen as a more positive way of observing the season. If you feel that taking something on during Lent is for you, there are a number of Lent courses being run in the churches of the Welwyn Team. They will be challenging but also edifying and spiritually beneficial. Ted Sharp is running a course in Tewin at his home in Orchard Road on Thursdays at 7.00 (Tel: 01438 798594).

I said that March is *almost* entirely given over to the season of Lent, but there is one day on which a break can be taken from the rigours of Lenten observance. March 14th is Mothering Sunday and, of course, on that day we give thanks to God for our own mothers and for everything to do with motherhood. It's a day of celebration and there will be a service in St Peter's church at 9.30am during which bunches of daffodils will be given out to all the mums. If your mother can't be there you can take one to her. Come along; it will be a joyous occasion!

### Churchwardens' Notes

Since the last Parish News went to Press, we have had a visit from the Herts Air Ambulance charity at a Sunday morning service. The Hertfordshire Air Ambulance has only been introduced in the last year or so and involved considerable fund raising to 'get it off the ground'. It costs around £80,000 per month to operate the service, which receives no funding from the National Lottery. It relies on the generosity and goodwill of the people and businesses of Hertfordshire. Since its introduction, it has been called upon over 300 times and has already been instrumental in saving a number of lives. If you missed the opportunity but would like to donate, this can be done using a yellow St Peter's envelope. Our treasurer, Graham, will be able to recover tax under the gift aid scheme and remit the total to the charity.

As some of you will have seen, the vacancy for our Team Rector has now been advertised. Some interest has been shown and interviews are scheduled for the second half of March. However it seems unlikely that a new rector will be in post before September.

We have been asked about the floodlighting of the church to mark special occasions. This can be arranged by contacting Pete Johnson and usually operates from lighting up time to around 11pm. A donation of £10 (or more!) is appreciated by our Treasurer towards church funds.

Although not many people want to venture out in the dark winter afternoons to visit St Peter's, the service of Evening Prayer has continued uninterrupted throughout the winter. This is a quiet, contemplative service with no music and lasts about 25 minutes. All are welcome – just come along for 5pm. every Tuesday at the church.

During 2009, several issues indicated that the future viability of the society was in doubt.

Following the AGM the position of chair vermained vacant.

Several committee members had resigned, and the society no longer had a membership secretary, nor  $_{\mbox{\tiny $V$}}$  any one undertaking the news letter. The remaining y committee were few in number, and some of the √ committee were considering stepping down at the <sup>\psi</sup> next AGM, following many years as hard working <sup>\psi</sup> committee members.

y The secretary had indicated that she would be \$\psi\$ looking to step down at the end of 2009, and the treasurer also pointed out that she had exceeded her term under the constitution, and would stand down at the next AGM. In addition to this, the trustees, who are the retired chair, the secretary,  $\psi$  and the treasurer, were looking to handover their <sup>y</sup> responsibilities by the next AGM.

The Tewin society is a registered charity, and as y such, regulated by the charity commission. The y requirement for the Tewin society is a minimum three trustees, and if this is not fulfilled, then the society can no longer operate or function.

y A meeting of the trustees was held in mid 2009, wand subsequently several committee meetings were supporting the activities for which the society has held to discuss the way forward. It was agreed that a SGM should be called, with the situation put to the membership, together with a proposal to wind wup the society. The alternative was for those who wished the society to continue, to step forward and # take on the roles & responsibility soon to be vacant, and to ensure that the activities of the society could be effectively maintained. This did not occur. The proposal to wind up was accepted by √ a majority of members attending the SGM.

It was also agreed that prior to winding up, several  $\frac{1}{\sqrt{2}}$  donations should be made in the spirit of the aims of the society, which could benefit the village of Tewin. Any funds remaining at closure would be *Hon Treasurer* † transferred to the Herts & Middx wildlife trust, an <sup>\psi</sup> affiliated charity, which would be in line with the charity commissioners requirements.
