They say that 'Imagine' is one of the most popular songs ever written, and it's not hard to see why. The music is great, the Beatles are fabulous singers, and the song invites us to see that things can be otherwise. Just imagine...

I do not know whether cats and dogs can imagine things being other than they are whether a cat can say to itself ' I'd love some different fish' or ' wouldn't it be nice if there were more mice around here?' but I do know that you and I have this much in common - that we can imagine things being otherwise, and we can do it without even lifting a finger or moving one step from where we currently are.

Now don't get me wrong! He acts in ways that make us free.

My appeal to each and every one of us is that we get our imaginations going, that we imagine good things for ourselves and for others, and we ask the imaginative God to help us in that process God bless you all. Stephen

VACANCY FOR PARISH COUNCILLOR

The job of the Parish Councillor is voluntary and non-political. The Parish Council meets on the evening of the first non-bank holiday Monday of each month except for January and August, but Councillors can expect to volunteer more of their between meetings. The use of email plays a significant part in the day-to-day operation of the Parish Council.

The Parish Council's work includes the following:

- 1. Setting a budget each year, from which we set the precept to obtain funds via the Council Tax. All expenditure and income is monitored against the budget.
- 2. Upkeep of both village greens, various pieces of common land, and 100 Year Wood. The Parish Council also owns the pavilion on Upper Green, the playground on Upper Green, the phone box opposite the Rose & Crown, the bus shelters, the flag pole on Lower Green, and most of the benches in the Parish.
- 3. Examination of all planning applications in the Parish and commenting to EHC as necessary.
- 4. Projects such as the provision of a playground on Upper Green in 2007, and the current project to refurbish the pavilion on Upper Green.
- 5. Close liaison with Hertfordshire Highways to ensure that any problems with the roads are addressed.
- Shared responsibility with HCC maintenance of footpaths and bridleways.
- 7. Input as necessary to various consultation documents issued by other authorities.

resignation of Councillor Steve Stott. The Parish Isles however it is very toxic to horses and other and can have potentially consequences if ingested either in its green or dried state. Under the Weeds Act 1959 the Secretary of State may serve an enforcement notice on the occupier of land on which injurious weeds are growing, requiring the occupier to take action to prevent the spread of injurious weeds. The Weeds Act specifies five injurious weeds: Common Ragwort, Spear Thistle, Creeping of Field Thistle, Broad Leaved Dock and Curled Dock. By promoting good practice and good neighbourliness it is hoped that this weed can be controlled. If you find you have it in your garden please put rubber gloves on and remove the plant and either place it in the black bin or burn it to prevent livestock eating it. Fragments of root will remain in the ground so new growth will have to be monitored and removed year after year. ROAD CLOSURE

The B1000 from the Panshanger Lane (to Aerodrome) junction to the Hollybushes junction will be shut to enable bridge maintenance works to take place. It is anticipated that the section of road will be closed for up to 10 weeks, sometime during the period 26 April 2010 and 2 October 2010, when signs are in place. An alternative signed route will be provided for traffic whilst the road closure is in place. Please note that when a 'B' class road is temporarily closed, the diversion route legally has to be on roads of the same class or higher, i.e. 'B' roads, 'A' roads or possibly motorways. Therefore the shortest legal diversion route is the one Highways have specified using the B195, however, Panshanger Lane adjacent to the aerodrome will remain open and there will be nothing to prevent local vehicles from using this route.



Chairman's Report for 2009/10

Despite the recession the commitment of our loyal volunteers and the generosity of supporters from Tewin and beyond, our Jumble Sales and Fete broke all previous records. They were bolstered further by the efforts of our Friends of Tewin team and its Book Sales. This raised over £12,000 in 2009. In addition we secured a £4,000 grant from East Herts District Council and were given a £2,000 donation on the demise of the Tewin Society. These funds were carefully managed by our excellent Treasurer of many years, Peter Burleigh. We spent over £14,000, mostly on completing our window replacement project alongside other small maintenance jobs. Our Under 5s Group successfully secured a £25,000 grant from the Herts County Council and completed a major refurbishment of the Scout Hut. This was the largest such sum spent on Memorial Hall maintenance and improvements for 15 years.

2010 Progress

However, it hasn't stopped there as we hope to have a completed a total refurbishment of the toilets by the end of this month, much of this being achieved thanks to the hard work and generosity of Ian Clemency. We hope all this effort will benefit our fellow villagers and encourage more people to hire our hall for weddings, functions, staff training days and local groups allowing it to provide a focal point for our community. In recognition of the economic climate we have decided not to increase our hire rates, which remain incredibly competitive. Even though we are concerned at the huge rise in our heating costs and the additional maintenance challenges that lay ahead. Despite this year's success and generosity including significant donations from the History of Tewin Book Team we cannot afford to be complacent about the future sustainability of our hall.

As always please allow me to call upon you all to consider joining our diminishing volunteer team. Every year helpers at our fundraising events tell us how much they enjoyed the spirit of community and friendship. Even if you can only manage a few hours a year it will make a real difference and you will work alongside experienced fellow villagers willing to guide you as required. Anyone wishing to respond to this please feel free to make contact.

Finally, due to limited space I apologise to those people's names that are absent from this report but rest assured we are truly grateful for your continued commitment and support without you this year would not have been such a success.
