## **Your opportunity to help improve the River Mimram**

Last year 2012 the Mimram dried out – and in 2006 before that. For years the Environment Agency has said that too much water has been taken out of the river by the water company for the river to sustain itself, its habitats and the wildlife.

At last, under new owners, our water company, Affinity Water, want to reduce the amount of water they are taking out of six of our area's rare chalk rivers, including the Mimram.

In fact they want to almost stop taking any water from Fulling Mill and Digswell pumping stations. This will improve the consistency of the river flows, thus improving the river's quality, environment and the wildlife for us all to enjoy. The extra cost on our bill of reducing the abstractions is £10 pa.

This is one of their key recommendations in their Water Resources Management Plan which is out for public consultation until mid August. It is one of a bundle of recommendations that includes water saving measures and reducing leakage.

However, to get the plan adopted we each need to show our support. Please take a few minutes to fill in their survey at [www.affinitywater.co.uk](http://www.affinitywater.co.uk) . They need the evidence of what their customers want in order to get Ofwat to approve the plan.

We have just completed the second season of films shown at our very own **Screen on the Green** at Tewin Memorial Hall. I should like to thank all those who have supported this venture, which is making a small contribution to Hall funds and a large contribution to convivial village life. In deciding what films to show for our third season, the film group carried out a review of the range of films shown in the past two years. For the benefit of those who have not yet come to film night, we show these once a month at 7.45pm on a Monday evening at the Memorial Hall. We have an excellent full screen, with good acoustics including a hearing loop for the hearing impaired. We sit at candle lit tables (no-one need have a poor view of the screen!). We serve complimentary tea and coffee beforehand. Ice cream and snacks are on sale and everyone can bring their own tipples and nibbles. Tickets are available at the village shop priced £4. If you haven't been - you might like this informal way of seeing movies in the village with your friends.

You may be surprised to see what we have managed to cover in only 15 films. It is very difficult to please everyone all of the time and to ensure that we show things that we hope people will enjoy. Everyone's taste is different but we have tried to include as broad a selection as possible showing sometimes the familiar, sometimes something a bit different and challenging. All the films shown have won awards and/or been great box office successes. At the beginning of every showing Kevin Brasier gives a full outline of each film's achievements.

**Wednesday 9<sup>th</sup> October 2013 - Visit to *Lowry and the Painting of Modern Life* Exhibition at Tate Britain**

Without Lowry's pictures, Britain would lack a pictorial account of the experiences of the 20th-century working class. He said "I saw the industrial scene and I was affected by it. I tried to paint it all the time. I tried to paint the industrial scene as best I could."

This summer, Tate Britain presents a major exhibition of landscapes by the much-loved British painter L.S. Lowry – the first to be held in London since the artist's death. Focusing on the best of Lowry's urban scenes and industrial landscapes, the exhibition includes Tate's *Coming Out of School* 1927, *The Pond* 1950 together with significant loans. This timely and carefully selected exhibition aims to re-assess Lowry's contribution to art history and to argue for his achievement as Britain's pre-eminent painter of the industrial city.

*Lowry and the Painting of Modern Life* reveals how Lowry developed his structure of the city based on his personal relationship to social space. Works such as *Pit Tragedy* 1919 (The Lowry, Salford); *An Accident* 1926 (Manchester Art Gallery) and *The Fever Van* 1935 (Walker Art Gallery, Liverpool) demonstrate Lowry's unique engagement with street life. His development of a cast of characters portrays the ways in which his subjects' lives unfold and become unstuck, highlighting the unpredictability and unsteadiness of working-class life.

As a modern painter, Lowry wished to show what the industrial revolution had made of the world, yet his dominant status in British art coincided with a disappearance of the industrialised world he engaged with. The exhibition's final room presents for the first time all eight of his less well-known, late industrial panoramas. These large panoramic landscapes fall into two groups: the first, from the 1950s, are titled, with intentional generality, *Industrial Landscapes*. The second, less well-known group was painted in the 1960s in the mining valleys of South Wales, the heartland of the Labour movement. In both the tone is valedictory.

Concession prices are available for people aged 60 or over. Tate members should bring their cards on the day.

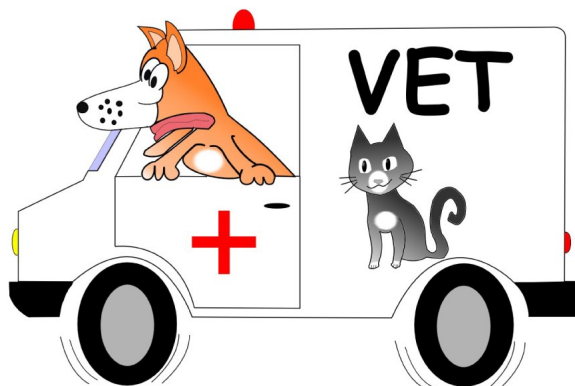

Everyone enjoyed a variety of attractions, with children in particular revelling in the fairground rides and games, whilst adults tried their hand at games of skill or browsed among stalls selling crafts, plants, cakes and much more. The barbecue, bar and tea room also drew many visitors on such a hot day, whilst ice cream proved very popular, as did the Pimm's stall, which sold more glasses than ever before!

Entertainment from the Lindy Hop Dancers and the PDF band added to the happy atmosphere, as did the Auction, which has now become a traditional part of the Tewin Fete. Actor, Jake Wood, again kindly donated an 'EastEnders' plaque, signed by the cast, which he presented to the successful bidder, who also bought the miniature collectors' racing car signed by Lewis Hamilton, both of which items are destined to finish up in Australia! ### Organists Required

Rosemary Knight, our organist at Tewin, has left to take up a position much nearer home in Leverstock Green. Indeed at a church in which a dear friend is vicar (and yes we did have words about whether it is OK to pinch other people's organists and still expect to be taken out for a pub lunch the following week, but love and forgiveness is something we Christians sign up to).

We hope that in the very near future (perhaps by the time that you read this) the bare earth area on the west side of the drive just before the turning circle will have been repaired with a system which should prevent the area becoming a mud bath in the winter and which will help to protect the grass. We owe great thanks to the Friends of Tewin who have generously paid for this work.
