
## What's happening to your river?

On November 20<sup>th</sup> at 7.30pm in Welwyn Civic Hall, Affinity Water will be presenting their final Water Resources plan at the Friends of the Mimram Open Evening. This is the plan which they will be just submitting to Defra. It includes how they will manage water supply over the next 25 years, an increasing population, leakage, and importantly, what will happen to our rare chalk streams.

The second major topic will be a talk on Lafarge's newly published plan for the future uses and access to Panshanger Country Park. The plan was due for submission to Herts County Council in October, so it will be hot off the press. This should be a great amenity for us all to enjoy.

# Team Vicar's Letter

The Bishop of St Albans has just written a new book and each church and church school has been presented with a copy. *Saints and Pilgrims* records the stories of inspirational and faithful people in the Diocese of St Albans. One for every day of the year. The book will be on display in St. Peter's and All Saints and at both of our schools if you fancy a browse to discover whether any historical locals have made it in to the Bishop's list.

November is the time of looking back, of remembering. All Saints, All Souls and Remembrance Sunday each turn our minds to people who have gone before us, those who we have known, whose memories we treasure and those who may have died many years before, but whose lives have helped shape the world and traditions we now enjoy.

The older I have got, the more connected and grateful I find I feel to people in previous generations; grandparents, great grandparents, ancestors who I have never met but somehow have played their part in shaping my present. And of course on Remembrance Sunday we bring to mind those who not many of us will personally remember but whose lives and deaths secured the freedom we so often take for granted.

The church has long had a tradition of remembering Saints, often with stories and characters as colourful as the windows they are displayed in. This year at St. Peter's church we are having a special All Saints day celebration for children. On Friday 1st of November 2 -4pm there will be a variety of activities, stories, games and crafts for children to explore some of the most loved saints of the church. The afternoon is free and open to children of both parishes - feel free just to turn up.

But we all know there are saints who walk amongst us now: ordinary men, women and children whose lives display something of the character of God, who show great courage, faith, compassion and charity. I wonder, if our church windows were to be redesigned with living saints of these two parishes, who we might see imaged in colour and light? Maybe, even, it might be you.

This work is mandatory to ensure the fire safety of all electrical items in use.

St Peter's welcomed Louisa Katie Spring into the Church family at her baptism held on Sunday, 13<sup>th</sup> October.


