

### When do the Christmas Decorations Come Down?

Tradition has it that Christmas decorations stay up until **Twelfth Night**. When is Twelfth Night?

The short answer is the **5th January**.

According to the Church of England, Twelfth Night "refers to the night before Epiphany, the day when the nativity story tells us that the three wise men visited the infant Jesus" - and Epiphany is on January 6th.

Some people will be marking the 6th January as Twelfth Night, as the 6th is technically the 12th day *after* Christmas. But they'll be a day late.

Popular superstition states that it's bad luck to leave your decorations up after the 5th. Christmas decorations not taken down by Twelfth Night should be left up until Candlemas Day (2nd February) and then taken down.

Insufficient information has been provided to demonstrate that the loss of the existing equine recreational facilities can be justified in accordance with Policy CFLR6 of the East Herts District Plan 2018

Amended Plans incl visitors parking and bin collection area. *TPC Object to the simplistic responses of putting grasscrete on the front lawns of houses to solve car parking problems, putting an area of hard standing for a collection point at the main entrance for waste and recycling problems and the unrealistic expectation that bins will be stored on the rear patios of some of the houses.* 

### **Christmas Tree and Carols**

The Parish Council would like to thank Friends of Tewin for decorating the Christmas tree this year and for helping to organise the carol singing event. They would also like to thank Mr. V. Murray for kindly PAT testing the tree lights.

### **Precept**

The Council reviewed Estimate to Year End for Financial Year Ending 31.3.2019 and the precept options for the Financial Year Ending 31.3.2020 and in accordance with the Financial Regulations of the Council they unanimously agreed that the precept be increased by 1.67% from £30,000 to £30,500.

### Tewin Drivesafe Speed Awareness Group

The Parish Council unanimously agreed to finance 5 large "Slow Down Community Speed Watch Operates Here 30mph" signs at £53.10 plus vat, each to be used in the parish on existing posts to promote speed awareness.

Tewin Drivesafe Speed Awareness Group is a dedicated team of volunteers that turns out 2 to 3 times per month to speed check vehicles entering or leaving the village. They use a portable speed indicator device ("SID") which highlights each

car's speed to help improve all drivers' speed awareness as many people are not aware how fast they are driving on local roads which have a 30mph limit. Tewin Parish Council are very supportive of the Drivesafe group and are hopeful that their continued operation will encourage motorists to slow down through Tewin. # Annual General Meeting on Monday 14th January 2019

The eighteenth *THACS* AGM will take place in Tewin Memorial Hall on Monday 14<sup>th</sup> January 2019 at 7:30pm. The evening will start with the AGM and then there will be refreshments (including wine) followed by a talk from our guest speaker.

Our guest speaker is Chris Bell and the subject of his talk will be *How Photography Changed Painting Forever.* 

Chris graduated from the Royal College of Art with a Master's degree in Photography and has spent 30 years as a professional photographer working with UK and international clients, ranging from Harrods to IBM. He is an accomplished lecturer and an entertaining speaker.

His talk will be illustrated with projections of art works before and after the advent of the lens and after the photographic image arrived. This is an area little explored by the general public or the art world, who in the early days saw it either as a threat or as an inferior type of image making. The use of the lens influenced painting in many ways even before photography itself was invented and certainly in the years after. In more modern times photography has also been instrumental in changing our understanding of the way we see ourselves as well as the world around us.

There is no admission charge for the evening and no booking is necessary. This is an important meeting for *THACS* and all members are urged to attend. Non-members are very welcome but not able to vote. Any non-members who just wish to attend the talk are advised to arrive by 8:30pm.

### **River Thames Frost Fairs**

The worst cold spells in Britain occurred between 1550 and 1750. It was known as the Little Ice Age and was so cold that the River Thames froze over each year. It was not uncommon for the freeze to last for three months.

The first recorded Frost Fair was held in 1608 on the frozen Thames. There were tents, sideshows, food stalls and even ice bowling.

Henry VIII is said to have travelled on the river from Central London to Greenwich by sleigh in 1536 and Elizabeth I took walks on the ice during the winter of 1564.

The last Frost Fair was held in 1814. It began on 1st February and lasted just 4 days. An elephant was led across the river just below Blackfriars Bridge.



# The Other Side of the Story

By the time you read this, it will be over for another year. Beautiful carols, gentle adoring animals round the crib, probably a pristine crib in a stable, love and joy and friendliness in full swing and, there is nothing wrong with that. Joy in our recollection of the birth of Jesus is very appropriate.

The commercial exploitation around it is perhaps not, as your credit card statement may have revealed.

What lies behind it however could not be more different from the image we see. The reality is a woman in the latest stage of pregnancy with her husband-to-be and a donkey on a journey to fulfil a bureaucratic requirement of no benefit to them personally. They end up with no accommodation with the child being born in a stable. If you have not been to a working stable, a primitive one, they are smelly, unhygienic and not the place to have a child. How would it be reported if it had happened in Hertford?

And just try giving your child gold, frankincense and myrhh?

Was the world full of rejoicing? Well certainly not the authorities. This child was seen by Herod as a risk to be dealt with immediately and later by the temple authorities and the Romans, who mistakenly thought they had.

And, from whatever religious position you hold, it is hard to imagine that any birth has had a more profound effect on the world in the subsequent centuries. Because of the impact of human manipulation, not all of that impact has been benign and has sometimes been a travesty of the real message of love and compassion.

The birth was the first chapter. Do you know the rest of it? If not, there is an interesting book you could read and it could be free on request.
