

The *THACS* Spring Show will be held in Tewin Memorial Hall on Saturday 6th April. 

Team Vicar's Letter

There's much fun that can be had telling Bible stories to children; hissing like the serpent in the garden of Eden, counting the animals two by two as they head into the ark, spitting out Jonah as that fish did upon the shore of Ninevah, baring teeth like the fierce lions that Daniel faced and clapping hands in a dramatic crash as the pillars of the temple fall down around Samson. I spend quite a bit of my time in church, schools and preschools retelling the stories and have built up a prop store that turns my colleagues green with envy. If you are ever in need of a rubber snake, life size dove or donkey costume ... I'm your woman!

The stories in the Bible are often colourful, characterful, packed with drama and surprising heroes. No wonder some of them have now been told for over three millennia. But I do wonder, what will happen to these stories that our children learn, when they reach adulthood.

Because there is a certain point where we should stop looking at these stories with the eyes of a child, and learn to look again with the tools of an adult. These stories were never really intended for children, and so with a little knowledge of political-social-historical context and with a bit of help to unpick the symbolism there is much to be discovered anew. For many of us our curiosity might stop with the question on how anyone can believe these tales to be literally true. But if we give up there then we miss out on a much deeper sense of truth. They are tales which look deep into our humanity, our needs and our struggles as well as opening a window onto our relationship with one another, the environment around us and with God.

This Lent our churches are offering the opportunity to look at five of these stories with adult eyes. Adam and Eve, Noah's Ark, Jonah and the Whale, Daniel in the Lion's Den and Samson and Delilah will each be examined using literary, historical and theological tools. There will be a group meeting on Monday nights at 60 Orchard Road Tewin and another group meeting in Datchworth Church Hall on Wednesday nights. Both groups start the week beginning 11th March at 8pm. I promise you it will be a fascinating course and that you will learn new things not only about these stories but also insights into how to approach other ancient texts. You don't need to be religious to come, you don't need to have any prior knowledge, you just need to want to explore in a friendly atmosphere.

Mothering Sunday

Mothering Sunday was a day in Lent when the fasting rules were relaxed, in honour of the 'Feeding of the Five Thousand'.

It is known on this date, about four hundred years ago, people made a point of visiting their nearest big church (the Mother Church). The church in which each person was baptised. People who visited their mother church would say they had gone "a mothering."

Young British girls and boys 'in service' (maids and servants) at the local Manor House or in a Mansion, were only allowed one day to visit their family each year. This was usually on Mothering Sunday. Often the housekeeper or cook would allow the maids to bake a cake to take home for their mother.

The most favoured cake was - as it still is in some families - the 'simnel cake'.

The Simnel cake is a fruit cake. A flat layer of marzipan (sugar almond paste) is placed on top of and decorated with 11 marzipan balls representing the 12 apostles minus Judas, who betrayed Christ.

It was not eaten on Mothering Sunday because of the rules of Lent, instead it was saved until Easter. The word simnel, probably derived from the latin word 'simila', meaning fine, wheaten flour from which the cakes were made.

Here they go again

In Advent just before Christmas and now a few weeks later in Lent, church people are encouraged or even obliged to undertake a lengthy period of self-examination. How and what they do is of course up to them individually.

Every church service includes a confession of sins, the original services using ideas such as that our sins are a grievous and intolerable burden. You may be thinking that church people must be a terrible bunch to need all this. Alternatively, you may feel that the church has got its emphasis slightly slewed.

But is there a way to make Lent useful apart from trying to make yourself feel more wretched than you actually know you really are? Traditionally in Lent, people give things up. Chocolate, fattening foods, alcohol are favourites. If your motivation is to look better, or to feel better or to save money, go for it, but do not imagine you are observing the basic idea behind Lent.

Apart from anything else, giving up has a bit of a negative feel to it. One of the church's confessions makes reference to wanting forgiveness for those things we have done which we ought not to have done and for those things we have not done which we ought to have done. Now that second part sounds much more promising and challenging as a Lenten activity.

If you are like me, you will know people you admire for the sheer extent of things they do for others by contrast with the little or less that you may yourself do. Why not make Lent 2019 different, take a leaf out of their book?

Give something up by all means if you feel you must and give any savings from it away, but, above all, why not take on something which benefits your friends, neighbours and colleagues or the community in general? As a by product of course it will also benefit you unless, in Lent 2020, whatever it might have been that you were going to do becomes added to the list of things which you did not do which you ought to have done.
