Upper Green Playground Extension and Resurfacing

Tewin Parish Council would like to thank everyone for their patience while the playground extension and resurfacing has been completed.

Welwyn Hatfield Council Promoted Sites Consultation 2019

Tewin Parish Council submitted comments to Welwyn Hatfield Council on the following Promoted Sites Consultation:

<u>WGC4</u> (edge of Panshanger) & <u>WGC9</u> (edge of Panshanger) - both border the boundary of Tewin Parish Council and East Herts District Council. There is a great danger that any development on these sites will have a serious detrimental impact on the views of the Mimram Valley both from the valley itself and from the plateau to the north of the valley. Any development on these sites should not extend beyond the edge of the southern plateau on to the valley slope. The edge of the southern plateau should incorporate suitable landscaping and tree planting to protect the setting of the Mimram Valley. There should be no access to the site from the B1000 via Money Hole Lane because (a) without improvement to the lane, the increased traffic at the B1000 junction would be a serious hazard or (b) any improvement to the lane to normal standards would be development detrimental to the setting of the Mimram Valley. The risks associated with these sites may make it not worth taking them out of the Green Belt in order to develop it.

<u>WGC11 (dog training field adj to B1000)</u> borders the boundary of Tewin Parish Council and East Herts District Council. By extending Welwyn Garden City down to the B1000, this site would appear as ribbon development of Digswell into the open countryside, it would urbanise this rural stretch of the B1000, and be detrimental to the setting of Tewin Water House. Tewin Parish Council trusts that this site will fail the selection process.

Dig5 (between B1000 and Mimram as you approach Digswell) borders the boundary of Tewin Parish Council and East Herts District Council. This site would effectively be ribbon development of Digswell into the open countryside, it would urbanise this rural stretch of the B1000, and be detrimental to the setting of Tewin Water House. Tewin Parish Council trusts that it will fail for the same reasons that it failed in 2016 - "The site is not within or adjoining a settlement excluded from the Green Belt; All or the majority of the site is designated as a Registered Historic Park and Garden ".

At the Annual Parish Council meeting on 13th May 2019 the Parish Council unanimously resolved to accept the accounts for the financial year ending 31st March 2019 and they were signed by the Chairman and the Clerk as the Responsible Financial Officer.

<u>Tewin Parish Council Annual Return for the Financial Year Ending 31st</u> <u>March 2019</u>

At the Annual Parish Council meeting on 13th May 2019 the Parish Council unanimously resolved to accept and approve Section 1 Annual Governance Statement on the Annual Return 2018/2019 and Section 2 Accounting Statements for 2018/2019. The Annual Return was signed by the Chairman and the Clerk as the Responsible Financial Officer.

For example, we had one gentleman who made a six mile round trip to the office to voice his annoyance. His complaint? Another memorable complaint came from a gentleman who was annoved that his villa did not contain any soup bowls. When our Rep went into the kitchen to check she showed him two bowls. His reply? "No dear, they're cereal bowls -I want soup bowls"! The same gentleman also said he hadn't got enough ashtrays. The Rep agreed to get more for him but was somewhat surprised when later she offered him a cigarette and he said "No thank you - I don't smoke". She then reminded him he'd asked for extra ashtrays, and his reply was "Oh ves. I like to see them scattered around – it makes me feel at home"! Another incident to recall was when we were confronted at the airport by four gentlemen who had just flown in. They came up and started ranting at us because they said that three of them were booked into one hotel, but the fourth man had been put into a different hotel. Rather perturbed by this, we quickly checked our papers and told them that we had no record of this man's booking, to which they replied "Oh no – he didn't book with you – he booked with another company"! This same group proved to be a problem on a number of occasions during their stay - one was when they'd been out and had a minor car accident and were furious that there was nobody in the office to sort it out for them – at 3am! However, at the end of their holiday, on the way back to the airport they'd driven on the wrong side of the road and caused an accident. They then came into the office with their tail between their legs because the police had arrived and they needed us to sort it all out for them! These were just some of our experiences, but one of the most memorable we heard about happened to another company. One of their clients came back from his holiday and demanded all his money back because his holiday had been ruined. The reason? That the soap dish in his shower was too shallow so his soap got wet! Perhaps you will understand why we were often heard to mutter "Some people shouldn't be allowed further south than the Isle of Wight"! Launch of the 2019 Summer Reading Challenge – 'Space Chase'

Hertfordshire County Council's library service is inviting children to take part in this year's Summer Reading Challenge to celebrate the 50th anniversary since man first walked on the moon with this year's theme, 'Space Chase'.

Last year, over 20,000 children took part in the challenge in Hertfordshire, and we are once again challenging children to read six library books over the summer and return to the library to tell our staff and volunteers all about them. They can read anything, including story books, fact books, talking books, and even e-books (available to download for free from our e-library).

As part of this year's challenge, children will use their Mission Folders which will be provided once they start the challenge to search for a mysterious buried treasure. For each book that they report back on, they'll collect stickers to put in their Mission Folders to help them find the location of the hidden treasure.

Every child who finishes their six books by Saturday 7 September will receive a medal and a certificate. All completers will then be entered into a prize draw to win a VIP behind the scenes pass to Mission Control with guest speaker children's author Steve Cole, who wrote the well-loved Astrosaurs series. Only 80 passes are available so this is a super exclusive event.

The challenge is free to take part in – all children need to do is visit their local library from Saturday 13 July to collect a starter pack, while stocks last, and complete their six books before 7 September. During the summer, Baldock, Bishop's Stortford, Borehamwood, Bushey, Royston, St Albans, Waltham Cross and Welwyn Garden City's libraries will also sell Space Chase kitbags for £2 each.



Team Vicar's Letter

Dear Friends,

This year in our Summer Evensongs (see p18 for dates and locations) our theme will be 'Agents of Healing', when we will be looking at six Christians who have been instrumental in founding or reforms places or agencies of healing. This was partly prompted by the death of Jean Vanier, the Canadian founder of the L'Arche communities. L'Arche communities are found around the world and are for people with developmental difficulties. Vanier's profound insight was that it was possible for those with developmental difficulties to live in the community with their carers, and that there could be a sort of equality between carers and cared for. Those cared for were not to be seen as burdens or unfortunates but as valuable persons in themselves, who had something to contribute to those communities and to teach to those that cared for them. We'll hear more about him and others over the summer.

What I take from Vanier's insight for everyday life, is the fact that disability and illness have various physical or other symptoms, but what makes them better or worse is the way that societies cope with them. Very practically for instance, being in a wheelchair is made much better or worse by the consideration or otherwise of those who construct the physical environment in which the wheelchair user lives. And beyond that, society can react in different ways to illness and disability - with stigma, shame, or even a feeling that it is God's judgement. Indeed what are today simply lifestyles were classified as illnesses less than a generation ago. So whilst we may not be able to heal or found a hospital or movement, how we interact with those who are sick or disabled will make a huge physical and psychological difference to those people. So we call to mind the example of Jesus the healer, who not only healed the sick, but also, perhaps more importantly, saw those brought to him as whole human beings whatever their circumstances

St James' Day

St James' Day is celebrated on 25th July. It is also known as Grotto Day because children used to make grottos and caves and decorate them with shells, the Scallop shell being the emblem of St James. The English oyster season officially opens on St James' Day. Whitstable Bay on the North Coast of Kent is famous for its oysters. It has been associated with oysters for hundreds of years. An old Kentish tradition has it that Julius Caesar was attracted to Britain by tales of the Whitstable oysters. On St James' Day locals hold an annual Oyster Festival, an event dating back to at least the early 19th century when it was the custom for local fishermen to celebrate with a service of thanksgiving. Bogus Door-to-Door Salesmen

Keep a look out for Nottingham Knockers - door-to-door traders who try to sell goods on the doorstep.

Nottingham Knockers are reported to have been knocking on consumers' doors in the south of Hertfordshire offering dusters, biros, felt tip pens, cleaning products, etc., sometimes from a bread crate. The individual will usually have an "ID badge" hanging from a lanyard around their neck; the credentials on the ID cards are mostly worthless.

There's often a storyline of just having been released from prison and efforts to get back on their feet. However Nottingham Knockers are not part of any recognised rehabilitation scheme. The governmentbacked Community Payback scheme does not involve door-to-door sales.

Hertfordshire Trading Standards advice is don't buy or sell on the doorstep.
