Tewin Parish Council



Recent Upper Green Road Closure

This was due to Herts Highways mending a broken gulley pipe to stop water overflowing down the road and causing the road surface to break up.

Churchfield Road Bridge

The Parish Council are concerned about the potential dangers when vehicles meet at the bridge. Herts Highways advised that they have visited the bridge and examined the serious accident statistics and determined that there were none. They advise that no additional road signage was required but will send a team out to clean the signs and ensure the white lining is in good order. Cllr Evans advised of a death at the junction many years ago. The Parish Council agreed to ask for a site meeting with Rosemary Chatindo, Assistant Highways Manager (Eastern Herts), Highways Operations and Strategy.

Parish Litter Bins

Please be sensible as to what you put in the litter bins. Too often there are large bags of rubbish stuffed in to them, leaving no room for genuine litter including dog poo bags. If you are having a picnic, please take your rubbish home with you. Please do not put household rubbish in litter bins. If your rubbish is going to fill the bin, then you should be taking it away with you.

Common Ragwort (Senecio Jacobaea)

This is a common weed found throughout the British Isles. However it is very toxic to horses and other livestock and can have potentially fatal consequences if ingested either in its green or dried state.

Under the Weeds Act 1959 the Secretary of State may serve an enforcement notice on the occupier of land on which injurious weeds are growing, requiring the occupier to take action to prevent the spread of injurious weeds. The Weeds Act specifies **five** injurious weeds: Common Ragwort, Spear Thistle, Creeping Field Thistle, Broad Leaved Dock and Curled Dock.

By promoting good practice and good neighbourliness it is hoped that this weed can be controlled.

If you find you have it in your garden please put rubber gloves on and remove the plant and place it in the <u>black bin</u> to prevent livestock eating it. Fragments of root will remain in the ground so new growth will have to be monitored and removed year after year.



More Tea Vicar?

One of the clues to how I am obviously a real and proper vicar – is how much tea I drink. I just love it. On occasion I can be classy with some Lady Grey or even a Lapsang Souchong – but most of the time my days are fuelled by bog standard builders tea. The day does not begin until at least two cups are consumed, and then for every task, every procrastination, every writing of a vicar's letter – a cup of tea is a familiar friend. But of course the best way to drink tea, is with others.

The invitation 'fancy a cuppa?' has often been the catalyst for deepening friendships, for truth telling, for talking through griefs and problems and for a bit of happy gossip and laughter.

The Japanese have a tea drinking ceremony where strict traditions are followed and honoured. Our tea drinking is perhaps less ceremonial, but still a cultural necessity in terms of giving attention and time to one another.

I have a tapestry on my kitchen wall that was made by a Palestinian women's project in Bethlehem. 'Make tea, not walls' it reads. It is a reminder of the great power of spending time with others, and the consequence of not giving proper attention to the building of relationships.

Perhaps today you might think who you could give the gift of a cup of tea to? It's probably the cheapest gift we have to offer and yet, perhaps, for someone you know it might be the most precious.

From One Dog Owner To Another

As a dog owner we are concerned at the increasing amount of dog pooh on the paths, pavements and green spaces around Tewin.

It is most unpleasant to tread in dog pooh and potentially dangerous for children who come into contact with it when playing. We cannot predict where people will walk or children will play. It may surprise you to know the legal position below.

The following has been taken from the East Herts District Council website:

Dog Fouling

You must clear up after your dog on any land in the District. Failure to clear up after a dog is an offence and you will be fined or prosecuted. The order applies to any land within the area administered by the Council which is open to the air and to which the public are entitled or permitted to have access either with or without payment (including woods and agricultural land).

Means to pick up

You must produce a means to pick up your dog's waste when asked to do so by an authorised officer.

Remember you can use Litter Bins to dispose of dog waste too.

The Month of August


