
The Tennis Club Finals are being held on 15th (p22) and the Bowls Club Finals on 14th (p9).

September in the Garden

While permanent plants may be the stalwarts of the garden, there is nothing to beat the party animals of the plant world—those that create an absolute riot of colour for a short time. Bulbs pop out of the ground to do their stuff from January right through to the Summer months and now is the time to plant them.

Early flowering bulbs, like Snowdrops and Crocuses, plus all Daffodils and Narcissi should be in the ground by the end of September to give them plenty of time to make root growth. But hold off planting Tulips until October or November as they tend to rot if planted earlier. Lilies should be planted in early to late Spring.

Planning Application Appeals

3/18/2211/FUL and /3/18/2212/FUL - Fairholme Stables, Archers Green Lane, Tewin - Amended Plans including visitors parking and bin collection area.

Original plans: Demolition of existing buildings, erection of 5 or 7 dwellings together with associated parking amenity space and access from Archers Green Lane -

Tewin Parish Council Objected to Both.

East Herts Council Refused both due to inappropriate development in the Metropolitan Green Belt and other harm identified in respect of adverse impact on openness and character of area. Very special circumstances have not been identified that would clearly outweigh the harm by reason of inappropriateness and the other identified harm. The proposal would therefore be contrary to Policies GBR1 and DES4 of the East Herts District Plan 2018 and the National Planning Policy Framework. Insufficient information has been provided to demonstrate that the loss of the existing equine recreational facilities can be justified in accordance with Policy CFLR6 of the East Herts District Plan 2018. The Planning Inspectorate dismissed the appeals for both applications in line with East Herts Council's refusal.

3/18/2100/HH - 7A Lower Green, Tewin - First floor front extension and insertion of window to flank elevation- *Tewin Parish Council Objection - East Herts Council Refused - Planning inspectorate dismissed the Appeal as the proposal would fail to preserve the character and appearance of the host property and the Tewin Conservation Area. It would also have a significant adverse effect on the living conditions of the neighbour due to loss of daylight.*

Hedges

Now that we are coming into September and the birds have finished nesting, Tewin Parish Council would be grateful if all residents who have hedges on their land bordering a footpath or pavement would cut them back if they are overhanging or partially blocking the path.



Team Vicar's Letter

Let's imagine that we meet in a room and in conversation I mention THE word: "Poetry", I say. At this precise moment something happens to your face. It may only last a fraction of a second, but it happens, and I see it. It might be your eyes immediately glaze, as they were taught to by dreary experiences of Milton at school. It might be a flash of excitement, as stored treasures of words and sounds are released in your mind, and Manley-Hopkins' 'branchy, bunchy bushy bowered' takes you back to those trees you climbed in your youth. It may be utter terror, and a sense that you would rather traverse every circle of hell in Dante's Inferno, than spend another minute in my company.

"Poetry". There, I've said it again. If you're still reading, find a mirror and examine what has happened to your face.

Sometimes I think the fear of poetry (which even has a name – metrophobia), comes because of how we were forced in school to know our tetrameters from our pentameters, the sonnet from the sestina. It became mechanical and tiresome. But worse than that even, was the pressure to explain what it all *MEANS*.

When we are faced with a painting, or wallow in a piece of music, or come across a sculpture, or enjoy the ballet – we don't tend to beat ourselves or the creator of it up by saying "It may be beautiful, but really what is it all about, what does it mean?" Somehow in other art forms we are able to find enjoyment in the shapes and colour and movement, for their own sake, and the things they evoke in us. If we were kinder to poems and to our own experience of them, I think we might be released to find the gem that sparkles within them for us, whether it is a word, an image or a phrase. I'm not saying that poetry should be utterly incomprehensible, after all language is all about communication, but the language of poetry is not that of a manual. Poetry uses a language of metaphors, sounds and patterns which communicate in a different way. Mark Oakley speaks of reading a poem as being similar to throwing a pebble into a pool. The words initially disturb your surface, and then as the poem does its work, over time the ripples of meaning head out to your shore, shifting your perspective and transforming your landscape. I'm home after a wonderful three months spent in the company of poetry and poets (some more jolly than others it should be said). The result of this is I have various poetical plans up my sleeves, ideas for services and ways we might look at some stuff together. Don't be scared. Be excited!

Our Father Which Art In Heaven

There cannot be any six words in the English language more well known or as frequently recited as these. They are the start of the prayer Jesus taught to his followers, spoken around the world in a huge number of different languages. One could imagine that there is never a moment of the day or night when the prayer is not recited. Tibetan prayer wheels are kept permanently in motion by monks. So here is a similarity. But not the only one. If the prayers are uttered without thought or the wheels spun as just a habit, they can be meaningless. Actually, the Lord's prayer should come with a warning not to ask for things which you do not want. Erroneously, it could be thought of in the meek and mild category whereas, in reality, it is a revolutionary prayer. Most of us are not seeking revolution. Things are just about ok and with a little tweak here and there could be really quite good. So, no change for me, thank you. "Our Father which art in Heaven. Who is meant by "our"? I like to know who is in and who is out but, as Jesus told us to love our enemies, is everyone in? I would find that difficult. Father is not necessarily an immediately helpful image. It has such strong human connotations and we know only too well our human frailties, weaknesses and needs. Is it potentially confusing to think of the creator of the universe in human terms? It must be the qualities of the most loving and caring father that we should have in mind.

"Hallowed be Thy name" is something we constantly fail to do. "Thy Kingdom come" is a real challenge if not even a threat. I don't know you personally but I can be sure that you think, say and do things which even in the most generous interpretation of them could not be other than deeply inappropriate in God's kingdom. Moreover, I guess that you enjoy them, will repeat them and would not wish to give them up. As for "Thy will be done", I say yes within reason, provided that it is my will as well and I have the time and it does not get in the way too much.

"Give us this day our daily bread". I'm in for anything that's going of course but perhaps this is not only about bread. God gives us all we have and much of it comes with obligations of care which we fail to live up to.

"Forgive us our trespasses". It is good to be free of a sense of guilt, failure or just falling short so we can restart with a clean sheet. "As we forgive those who trespass against us" is disturbing. If we only get as good as we give, does it necessarily mean that much. How often have you heard or said "I can never forgive x for that".

"Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil". Does a little bit of temptation do you good! We all like to be tempted and gain strength from resisting it, if that is just occasionally what we manage to do. A little bit of naughtiness from time to time surely cannot be prohibited can it? Who knows? Before saying the Lord's prayer next time, it might be wise for me to ask for forgiveness for not meaning everything I am about to say. Ted Sharp

The First Penny Bazaar

On 28th September 1894 a Yorkshireman with a head for figures and an immigrant pedlar from Poland teamed up to create the first Penny Bazaar in Britain - and one of the most famous business partnerships in the world. Today 14 million people shop at Marks and Spencers. Isaac Dewhirst from Leeds met Michael Marks from Poland, lent him £5 to set up as a market trader and introduced him to his cashier, Tom Spencer.

When Marks decided to acquire his first permanent stall in Leeds' covered market, he invited Spencer to join him. The agreement was signed on 28th September 1894.

Marks' slogan was ' Don't ask the price - it's a penny!'.

The first Penny Bazaar store (in Manchester) grew to 12 stores in the first 6 years. Today Marks and Spencer (M&S) is a major British retailer with over 895 stores worldwide.
