

The map can be loaded onto your smartphone, making it easy to follow your position on a map as you go. This is a fantastic new way to explore over 3000km of rights of way in the county, making the network much more accessible to new digital audiences.

Our rights of way are a valuable asset, providing endless opportunities for people to get out and active in the countryside. As well as improving health and wellbeing, this can support the goals of the Council's Local Transport Plan, which prioritises active travel.

The Parish Council were very pleased to provide a £20,000 grant to assist with the purchase of the freehold of Tewin Stores and would like to thank everyone who helped achieve this on 30th August 2019.

#### **Appeals**

3/18/1796/OUT - Land At Upper Green Road, Tewin - Construction of 4 Dwellings. 3 Affordable Houses consisting of 2 x two bedroom and 1 x three bedroom and 1x three bedroom marketable house and new vehicular access.

TPC Objected to this application and its use of the Rural Exception Site facility and the fact that no prior need has been established as specified by the NPPF so the application could not satisfy Item 1(b) of Policy HOU4 of the new District Plan. NB: seven affordable houses were built in Grass Warren, Tewin in 2014.

EHC Refused - The site lies within the Metropolitan Green Belt as defined in the District Plan 2018. The proposal would constitute inappropriate development in the Green Belt and further harm would result from loss of openness and visual impact. No very special circumstances have been demonstrated in the proposal that would clearly outweigh the harm by reason of inappropriateness and the other identified harm to the Green Belt. Accordingly the proposals would be contrary to Policies GBR1, VILL2, and HOU4 of East Herts District Plan 2018 and contrary to the revised National Planning Policy Framework 2018.

<u>Appeal Dismissed</u> - Substantial weight must be given to the harm to the Green Belt by reason of the inappropriateness of the proposed development. The harm from loss of openness and the harm to the character and appearance of the local area adds to that harm. The totality of the harm is not clearly outweighed by the other considerations. There are no very special circumstances to justify the proposed development.

#### **Community Bus Grant Request**

Tewin Parish Council is very pleased to provide a grant of £500 to CDA for Herts to help keep the Saturday Minibus from Tewin going for a third year, having commenced in November 2016. The grant from the Parish Council along with further donations from Friends of Tewin and a grant from East Herts Council will mean that they can continue to provide a viable, much needed and valued service to the Tewin community.

**Art Workshop on Tuesday 12<sup>th</sup> November** This year's workshop is all about mono printing which is the most painterly method of printing. You will be printing from natural forms and man-made objects to produce a series of experimental images using oil-based inks. Our tutor Jude O'Sullivan will be showing you how you can cut your prints into shapes which you can use to make your own prints or individual greetings cards. This course is suitable for all abilities. It is not necessary to be able to draw to achieve great results. Health and safety note - the inks we will be using are Caligo safe wash inks and clean up using vegetable oil and soap and water. The course will be held in the beautiful Bramfield Village Hall. Its ceiling-to-floor windows give a very special light. The timing is from 10am until 4pm and participants are asked to bring something to share for lunch. Tea and coffee are provided. The cost for the day is for members £33 and £36 for non-members with payment by 7<sup>th</sup> November.





#### Team Vicar's Letter

This month I have been invited on a special trip, to visit CERN, the world's largest particle physics laboratory. Set up after the second world war and based in Geneva, it is run by 23 member European states. It was the birth place of the world wide web, and houses the Large Hadron Collider, a piece of equipment which is buried 100 metres below the ground and runs in a 27 km circle across the French/Swiss border. It was with this that the Higgs boson particle was discovered, an elementary particle whose existence was suggested by physicist Peter Higgs in 1964, but only 'sighted' in 2012 with the aid of the LHC.

The Higgs boson, some of you will be aware, has often been referred to as the 'God particle', a name Peter Higgs was never fond of, but a description given because together Higgs boson particles create an invisible field of force which allow other particles to bond together and make form.

This trip has been organized by our diocesan 'Take your vicar to the lab' project. It is a project aimed to encourage clergy, and thus churches, into wider engagement into the scientific world. For someone like myself, who spent her school science lessons gazing out of the window desperate for the break bell to ring, the language and concepts of the world of particle physics are proving strange and alien, and giving me an insight into how bewildering the language and concepts of faith must be to those who come to them for the first time.

But science and faith, I have always been convinced, are not in conflict with each other, they are different disciplines and ask very different questions. In a simplistic sense we may say science looks at the 'what and how' of the universe and faith looks at the 'why and who'. There are many eminent physicians who are Christian, indeed I shall be meeting some of them at CERN. Infact I am excited that this experience of seeing the awe-inspiring size of the LHC, and to meet with people who dedicate their lives to discovering the mysteries of the universe by the search for the smallest of things, may in fact resonate with the work of faith, which often seems to be discovering the enormity of God within the tiniest of things; a grain of sand for Abraham, a mustard seed for Jesus, a hazelnut for St Julian of Norwich, and each gentle act of kindness and humility that it's possible to simply pass by.

Perhaps you might look for the small wonders of the world today, and see what awe that gives you for the miracle that is life.

#### **Cholesterol Awareness Month**

October is National Cholesterol Month and is dedicated to raising awareness of cholesterol.

We need cholesterol in our blood to stay healthy. Cholesterol keeps your body's cells intact and it is also converted in the skin to vitamin D which is important for bone strength. However, when you have too much cholesterol in your blood it can be a problem. High cholesterol over a period of time can lead to heart disease. The only way to know if you have high cholesterol it is to get a cholesterol test.

There are 2 types of cholesterol in the blood - LDL cholesterol which is bad and HDL which is good.

Women naturally have higher HDL cholesterol levels than men. Women should aim for an HDL cholesterol level above 1.2mmol/L while men should aim for above 1mmol/L.

What raises your bad cholesterol?

Your blood fats – your cholesterol and triglycerides – can become raised for a number of reasons.

#### For example:

- a diet which is high in saturated fats
- not being active enough, so the fats aren't used up for energy
- genetic conditions which mean the fats aren't processed in the usual way.

If your cholesterol is raised, there are treatments available if you need them but it's usually possible to lower cholesterol naturally with healthy lifestyle changes.

A cholesterol check involves a simple blood test. When you get a check, your doctor should also check your levels of triglycerides – another type of blood fat. A cholesterol test can be used along with some other simple tests to give a good idea of your heart health. These include a blood pressure test, finding out your BMI (Body Mass Index) and your waist measurement.

The 2019 Festival will be held on Sunday 6th October from 12.30pm



Hi my name is Oli and you may have heard about my story already but I wanted to share it and say thank you to those that have supported me to take part in this massive adventure. In October 2017 I applied to take part in the World Scout Jamboree in West Virginia, America and was successfully awarded a place after attending a selection day. In order to take part I had to raise £3770 which paid for both my trip and subsidized people from less wealthy countries to attend. I was assigned to UK unit 15 comprising of 36 scouts and 4 leaders all from the Hertfordshire area. We met up monthly doing camps and various scout competitions.
