CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

In this report, I shall give a brief overview of which parts of Tewin are cared for by the Parish Council (TPC).

The Parish Council actually owns very little land. It owns Village Green 70 which runs alongside Bramfield Road, north of its junction with Queen Hoo

Lane. It also owns 100 Year Wood at the top end of Upper Green. Both are covered in trees.

The Parish Council rents Upper Green, Maypond Green and Lower Green from Hertfordshire County Council (HCC) on a long term lease at peppercorn rent. TPC is responsible for the greens as if it were the owner but still needs to get permission from HCC for any major works. TPC owns most of the fixtures on the greens.

TPC rents land from a private owner in order to provide an allotment facility.

There are a number of small pieces of registered Common Land within the parish, such as the grass triangle at the roadside end of the church drive. Common Land is privately owned but registered "commoners" can have rights such as gathering firewood, grazing animals, etc. Within Tewin, none of the Common Land has known owners or commoners. It falls to the Parish Council to look after these areas.

Roadside verges are a very mixed bag. They can be privately owned by the roadside property, common land, the responsibility of Hertfordshire Highways, owned by Herts County Council (HCC) Estates, owned by Sovereign Housing Association, etc.

Most footpaths, bridleways etc are on privately owned land, but HCC effectively owns the topsoil so that it can maintain the surface if necessary. TPC organises the grass cutting in the parish, but HCC, East Herts Council (EHC) and Sovereign pay for the areas that they are responsible for. TPC keeps the grass and hedges trimmed on footpaths.

Occasionally, the Parish Council takes care of land that it is not responsible for. The small area of land immediately south of the Rose & Crown does not have an owner. It is in a central public area with a footpath running through it, so TPC looks after the trees, and this year, has tidied up the undergrowth. Every Spring, the Parish Council does a Risk Assessment to see what maintenance is required. Most of the outcomes are the responsibility of TPC, but some is pursued with other agencies. A major component of the Risk Assessment is now checking the trees that the Parish Council is responsible for. In the last

three years we have spent over £11,000 on tree works.

The Parish Precept for 2024-25 is £38,000. The household charge is circa £44 pa Band D (£88 pa Band H).

My thanks go to the other members of the Parish Council, and to the Parish Clerk for their help and support.

Our two District Councillors, Michael McMullen and Linda Haysey, both retired at last May's elections, and it was sad to hear that Michael died earlier this year. He was a good friend to Tewin, and often seen at village events with his wife Angela. Following recent reviews of the East Hertfordshire Council wards, we now welcome Bob Deering as our District Councillor for the whole Parish.

Thanks go to our County Councillor Ken Crofton and to volunteers who help the Parish Council throughout the year. All Parish Councillors are unpaid volunteers and all Council business is decided by a majority vote. Parish Council documentation is on the Tewin Village website.

On The Farm

The industrial waste was cleared away from the gateway off Churchfield Road on the 19th of March with help from various people. I have decided to put up a pole and install 2 CCTV cameras which will log into our security system.

We have passed the Spring Equinox when we have more light than darkness and crops seem to wake up. How have our winter crops survived the winter deluge of endless rain and wet soils? Mostly ok. We have several ponds in fields due to the excessive rainfall, some areas of fields where there is nothing due to the rotting of the seed and several areas of headlands of fields where there is nothing. But it could be worse, our soils have a gravel subsoil which is free draining. All crops have had their nutrients leaked away with the heavy rainfall over the winter months. Martyn has been spreading TSP (Triple Super Phosphate) and Nitrogen to boost crop growth, and at odd times when conditions are ok, he has been cultivating the 50 acres of pea land, which was ploughed when quite wet, and now he has used the Unipress, twice, to get some tilth and be ready for sowing. We will wait till early April, when the soil temperatures reach about 11degrees. Peas don't like being sown too early in the cold and wet, they like warm soils and get growing right away. By the way we sowed the peas on the 13th of April and I sprayed the soil with a herbicide on Sunday the 14th to control the weeds. Hopefully they will be off to a good start.

This month's weather has been very unsettled. It's been difficult for us to have calm days (no wind or rain) to spread fertilisers or go spraying.

On Monday 20th May we will be showing "Living" (2022) starring the talented and versatile Bill Nighy at the top of his game.

Team Vicar's Letter

It is not just the Underwoods who think the Rectory is their home. Every year we have a couple of starling families who tuck themselves under the eaves and whose bossy babies keep their parents busy, flying constantly from lawn to roof carrying bugs for their breakfast. We also have a rather persistent blue tit, who taps daily at the window. I'm guessing he is arguing with his own reflection, but it does seem as if he really wants to come in. Less welcome are the jackdaws who have nested in our recently cleaned chimney. As I lie in bed I can hear them stuffing more sticks between the bricks. Their 'jack, jack' call amplified through the flue.

It is curious the great variety of birds that have been used to allude to a characteristic of God. In the bible we are given images such as the majesty of the eagle, the gentleness of the dove, the brooding, nurturing nature of the hen. You might also find in churches pictures of female pelicans, who were thought to peck out their own feathers in order to feed their young with their own blood. These sacrificial mothers were therefore seen as a symbol of Christ. Then there are peacocks, whose flesh was thought to never rot, so also given as a symbol of everlasting life. And in folklore the mythical phoenix, that bird which rises from the ashes, is seen to be an image of resurrection and rebirth.

Perhaps their constant call, elusive presence and the freedom given by their wings make birds an obvious image for God. Certainly they make us look up.

If you were going to choose a bird to represent God, I wonder what one that would be?

St Peter's News

A church at the heart of the village, with space for all

It was marvellous to see the flowers in church on Easter Sunday! Thank you to our wonderful flower arrangers. It was such a sharp contrast, as it should be, to the starkness of the church on Good Friday, with the bare altar and the cross standing there.

Holy week began rather shakily on Palm Sunday. Twenty minutes before the start of the service we found we had no palm crosses to distribute, and the organist was stuck on the M25. We also needed to find new readers for the Narrative of the Passion due to people being ill. But somehow, albeit a few minutes late, and despite the blustery drizzle, Susannah began the service around the war memorial, as usual, and led the congregation in procession back inside for some rousing joyful singing and to witness The Passion according to Luke. As moving as ever.

On Good Friday this year we welcomed The Eden Consort, a quartet of local musicians who sang and read monologues from the different points of view of those caught up in the story of the Crucifixion. It was a well-attended occasion when we were also pleased to welcome members of the other congregations in the Welwyn team.

Easter Saturday turned out to be a lovely afternoon when a large group of children came with their friends and family to enjoy Messy Church. They planted the Easter Garden, made Easter egg messages to hang in the church and a long banner to go behind the altar. They also ran round the churchyard to find Easter Eggs and left coloured pebbles around the gardens. It was so lovely to have a good day for it, and not to have to dodge the showers for once.

And then it was Easter Day - a joyful occasion, with the church decorated magnificently and even a Simnel cake to enjoy with our coffee at the end of the service.

The Lent course this year finally finished just after Easter with the sixth study of pictures from the Methodist collection of 20th century religious art which was on display at the Focolare Centre in Welwyn Garden City for

over a month. Those who came to the sessions and who also went to see the exhibition were pleasantly surprised by the paintings and the associated programme of readings and music designed by our Welwyn clergy was much appreciated.

The new pattern of services for the third Sunday in the month has now been in place since July 2023. We have been holding Morning prayer using the Book of Common Prayer at 9.30am followed by Messy Church in the afternoon, for young people and their families. The evening service alternates each month between Holy Communion and Evensong when we gather a small choir to lead our worship. Overall, this seems to be working well and the PCC has decided to keep services like this from now on. All our services are listed on the village website (www.tewinvillage.co.uk), in this magazine, and on the church door. We are so lucky to hold weekly acts of worship here in the village – so many churches have closed in the past decade and others only have services once or twice a month.

We will report on the Annual Parochial Church Meeting in the next edition as it takes place on 28^{th} April. Thank you to those people who have signed up to help with the church's **Annual Spring Cleaning weekend** – 10^{th} and 11^{th} May. The list is still there at the back of the church with further details of how you can help.

Thank you also to those who are happy to be involved with **Open Gardens on 29/30 June.** If we haven't already been back in touch with you, we will be shortly. For those still thinking about volunteering their garden, don't forget it is a marvellous way to really tidy up your garden for the summer and get rid of all those messy corners where stuff lurks.

Tewin Tennis Club

With the competition season under way, a more mundane topic that has been taxing the committee is what to do about our practice court on Upper Green. You may not have even noticed it, tucked at the back of Court 1 behind the pavilion.

Basically a brick wall with a miniature-sized court behind it, you can hit balls to your heart's content and they will always come back. There's a white line at tennis net height so you can target your shots and goodness, it's hard work. At least it is for me, for I rarely have managed to string together more than a handful of shots before it all goes catastrophically wrong and I have to start again.

With the new Tiger Turf on the main courts, the practice court suddenly looks tired underfoot, and elsewhere. The Tarmac hasn't been replaced for ages and the wall needs some love and affection. Yes, work could have been carried out when we refurbished the main courts, but as ever, it has always been a question of money.

And it is far from clear that it gets very much use. We'd welcome players' thoughts on this. Who *does* use the practice wall/court, and would they welcome an upgrade?

Current players have received notification about renewing their membership, and there may be a day or two left to take advantage of the discount before the fees increase on 30 April. Also, village residents who book courts ad hoc might well like to consider full membership of Tewin Tennis Club, which has what we think are the best value rates in the whole of Hertfordshire.

You'll then get the chance to take part in the popular ABC League on Friday evenings, starting this month. Members – playing that night or not – meet up at the courts for a social evening, usually followed by a drink in the Plume. Please come down and introduce yourself. Tell them Peter sent you.

On the day before the sale and on the Saturday morning, we sorted through the mountain of donations and as always, this was done with great enthusiasm.



Young Star Violinist And Pianist To Perform At St Mary's Welwyn On 18 May

The May concert in the 'Second Saturday Recitals' series at St Mary's is a little later in the month than usual. It will showcase two exceptionally talented youngsters - Yinong Xiao on violin and Bridget Yee on piano. The concert is on 18 May at 12 noon and will last for one hour. Entry is free to all and there will be a retiring collection for church funds.

Their programme will open with Yinong playing Bach's 'Partita for Solo Violin in E major'. Then Bridget will play one of the most challenging pieces from the solo piano repertoire – Liszt's 'Transcendental Study No 11' known as 'Harmonies du Soir'. The two young artists will then join together for one of the great violin sonatas – Schumann's Violin Sonata No 2, Op 121.

Yinong Xiao

Yinong hails from China and studied at the music specialist Purcell School near London before winning a scholarship to the Royal Academy of Music. His teacher is Professor Hu Kun, the famous Chinese violinist who was Yehudi Menuhin's only private student. Yinong is a prizewinner in many important competitions and has already appeared at the Wigmore Hall and Cadogan Hall as a soloist. He gave an acclaimed recital for solo violin at St James', Piccadilly last year and this can be viewed on YouTube.

Bridget Yee

In 2020 Malaysian pianist Bridget Yee was one of five top pianists across the United Kingdom in the BBC Young Musician Competition Finals. She also won the Windsor International Piano Competition and the Beecham International Piano Competition. Bridget is currently studying at the Royal Academy of Music on a full scholarship under Christopher Elton. She has been awarded a Polonsky Foundation Fellowship for this year's Aspen Music Festival in America.

Notes from an Apiary

We are now into April and the beekeeping year is hotting up in more ways than one. We have removed the mouse guards and woodpecker protection. The winter wet has dragged on but last weekend it was warm enough to contemplate opening and inspecting our hives.

Good news, they have made it through to Spring. Three viable colonies, developing nicely and all with plenty of brood. When we inspect our bees, we look for several things. **Varroa mites**, a small pernicious parasitic mite. We did not find any, good news. **Any signs of disease**. Check to see that the bees are not making plans to swarm. **The overall temper of the bees**, no one likes aggressive bees. The outcome of the inspection allows us to lay down a plan of work to help develop a healthy, calm, productive colony of bees. The holy grail of beekeeping. All beekeepers should be dedicated to good husbandry and the search for bee improvement.

I had the opportunity to meet with local beekeepers at a training event last month and to talk about hive and apiary positioning. A discussion followed with a DEFRA Bee Inspector who confirmed we need to stay vigilant for disease, temper and a new threat, the Asian Hornet. While this area is looking good it is not the same in all areas.

Such a lot to think about! Such a challenging and rewarding job. I hope you enjoy reading this and if you want to know more, visit the CSHBKA website. Or pass a message on to me, Phil Raine


